Things You Don't Want To Hear

(but they make us tell you anyway)

- 1. You must wear your convention badge at all times to be admitted to any convention function. In other words, Yes, you have to wear your stinkin' badge!
- 2. Food and Beverages will not be permitted out of the consuite. Possession of alcoholic beverages by a minor or anyone under 21 years old is grounds for expulsion from the convention without refund. Chattacon security members, committee members and uniformed officers may require you to furnish acceptable legal identification at any time. Do not leave it in your room.
- 3. Please keep all behavior that polite fans would find offensive in public where it belongs in your room.
- 4. Cameras (including camera phones) are not permitted in the Art Show or Print Shop.
- 5. We can offer sympathy, but Chattacon is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged property or for injuries sustained during the course of the convention.
- 6. Programmed events and guests are subject to change and/or cancellation without notice.
- 7. We reserve the right to ask you to leave the convention and refuse to refund your registration fee if you are behaving like a jerk.
- 8. Please adhere to our weapons policy (see page 7). <u>NO</u> functioning projectile weapons: this includes water pistols, silly-string guns and ping-pong pistols. Permitted weapons must be sheathed and peacebonded <u>at all times</u>. No clowning around or showing off in the commons areas. Any weapon used in an offensive manner (check your OED for definition of offensive) will be confiscated and rule #7 enforced. We expect you to use good judgment.
- 9. Con security, hotel security and local law enforcement officials will treat anything that looks like a real gun as a real gun. We do not post bail. Read rules 7 and 8 again.
- 10. NO CAMPING IN THE HALLS OR LOBBY! If you are found sleeping in the public areas, you will be asked to go to your hotel room. If you do not have a room, security will be forced to ask you to leave.
- 11. Please do not eat the hotel. We'd like to do this again.
- 12. Costumers: Remember that no costume is NO costume and there are public nudity laws in Tennessee. Please wear appropriate clothing in the common areas.

There is no rule #13. Never was. Move along.

- 14. The Fire Marshall has asked us to point out that improperly or falsely marked nuclear waste or explosive containers are a <u>felony</u> and will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. Guantanamo is unpleasant at any time of year. See rules 7 and 8 again.
- 15. Pursuant to Tennessee Law, smoking is unlawful in all enclosed areas and within 50 feet of any door, window or vent. Yes, this means, if you smoke, you must do so outside and only then within clearly marked smoking areas. No one under 21 may enter any area where smoking is allowed. Violators will be ejected from the convention without refund, subject to arrest, and a \$500 fine.

Weapons Policy

T he practice of carrying or wearing personal weapons at conventions is one of the oldest traditions in fandom. Chattacon respects this custom and we would rather not do anything to interfere with it. Unfortunately, a few fans have created problems in the past by abusing this custom and behaving very badly with weapons. Therefore, we have established the following weapons policy to address these concerns. Please read it because it will be enforced.

- All knives, swords, axes, shiraken and other bladed weapons, whether sharpened or not, must be covered by sheaths, cases, reinforced cardboard or some other protective wrapping. All blades or other small weapons, such as nunchukas, must be secured to the wearer's person or clothing so that it may not be unsheathed or made threatening without substantial time and effort. This applies in a public or semi-public areas of the hotel including hallways, the lobby and all function space. This restriction may be met for a sword or dagger by tying the hilt to the scabbard or sheath with a securely knotted cord (Peacebonding). If desired, a weapon may be peacebonded for you at the Security Office. Exceptions will be made for displays in the Dealer's Room.
- All functional firearms, pellet guns, lasers, sound projectors, tasers and other projectile or distance weapons are absolutely forbidden. No exceptions will be given (don't ask).
- Replicas, blasters and zap guns are allowed. Any convention or hotel staff member or uniformed security guard may, at any time, require proof that the weapon does indeed not function.
- Anything can be used as a weapon. Therefore any object used in a dangerous or threatening manner or in such a way that it becomes a general nuisance to the attendees of the convention will be regarded as a weapon by Chattacon.
- Any weapon being carried or misused in violation of this policy will be confiscated and held until the convention concludes on Sunday afternoon. Afterward, the weapon may be picked up in Operations. Anyone who refuses to surrender a weapon when asked to do so by a Chattacon representative will be ejected from the convention without refund. In the event of a serious violation, the hotel will be asked to evict the violator without refund and the violator may be liable for criminal or civil damages.
- No assassination games will be permitted. Players will be exjected from the convention without refund when caught. Please note that this includes LaserTag[™] and similar games. Any convention-sponsored events are excluded from this restriction during their scheduled times.
- Anyone who deliberately or negligently injures another or causes property damage to the hotel, meeting rooms, or the contents thereof, will be ejected from the convention without refund, ejected from the hotel and may be subject to arrest and criminal and/or civil prosecution.
- Interpretation and enforcement of this policy will be at the discretion of any Chattacon committee member. In cases of disagreement, the decision of any two (2) members will be <u>final</u>.

All attendees please note: the civil authorities have been known to take a dim view of persons carrying swords, knives, martial arts weapons and/or large-bore particle beam weapons. Please show some discretion when making excursions into Mundania. Remember, "When in Rome ..."

S haron Lee and Steve Miller are the internationally celebrated co-authors of the best-selling Liaden Universe® series and have been writing together since the first "Kinzel" short stories hit Fantasy Book in the early 1980s. They started the first Liaden novel in 1984 and have published thirteen novels and several dozen short works in that series alone.


Along the way they've become fan favorites at SF conventions in the US and Canada, with Guest of Honor and Guest appearances at PenguiCon, COSine, AlbaCon, Trinoc*con, ConDuit, MarsCon, ShevaCon, BaltiCon, PortConMaine, SiliCon, OaSIS, DucKon, Second Life Library, and elsewhere from California to Fredericton to Orlando.

Their novels have been published in the US by Baen, Del Rey, Meisha Merlin, Ace Books, Phobos, and Buzzy Multimedia and they have several foreign language publishers in Germany, Russia, and Poland as well. Their short fiction, written both jointly and singly, has appeared in Absolute Magnitude, Catfantastic, Dreams

of Decadence, Fantasy Book, Such a Pretty Face, 3SF, and several incarnations of Amazing, among others.

Their work has enjoyed a number of award nominations, with Scout's Progress being selected for the Prism Award for Best Futuristic Romance of 2001 and Local Custom finishing second for the same award. Local Custom was published by Buzzy Multimedia as an audio book read by Michael Shanks -Stargate's Daniel. Balance of Trade, appeared in hardcover in February 2004 and hit the Amazon.com genre bestseller lists before going on to win the Hal Clement Award as Best YA Science fiction for the year.

Their most recent Liaden novels are Fledgling (hardcover in September 2009) in mass market in March, with Saltation (sequel Fledgling) appearing to in hardcover in April and Mouse and Dragon just out and on the Locus bestseller list. Baen is reprinting the original ten Liaden novels in four omnibus editions, with The Dragon Variation out in June to start the reprint program. 
Laura Anne Gilman Guest of Honor

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Art Show

The Art Show, located in the Roosevelt Room (Terminal Building), will have many fine pieces of art for your viewing pleasure. If you wish to purchase a piece of art through the Art Show, there are a few ways to go about it. Prior to the close of the show Saturday, if a piece that is for sale has NO bids, you may purchase the piece for the Direct Sale Price. If there is no Direct Sale Price, a bid is already on the bid sheet, or you do not wish to pay the Direct Sale Price, you must enter the auction process. This simply means you must enter a bid for the piece.

At Chattacon, the auction process is completely written or silent. If you see a piece that you wish to bid on, all you do is write your name, your badge number, and the amount you wish to bid, provided that the amount is the same or higher than the minimum bid indicated, or higher than the previous bid on the bid sheet. Please bid in even dollar amounts. The person with the highest bid at the close of the auction Saturday night gets the artwork. All written bidding ceases at 7:00 PM on Saturday. At this time the high bidder on the sheet gets the piece. Please remember, if you bid (and are the highest bidder), you have entered into a contract and are obligated to purchase the item for the price you offered.

The Art Show will be open on Sunday morning for people to pay for and pick up artwork. Also, items that were not sold will be available for sale at the After-Auction price indicated by the artist. Naturally, any items marked Not For Sale (NFS) are not for sale. The Art Show will accept checks, credit cards and good old American cash.

Print Shop

A syou've come to expect, Chattacon is offering a Print Shop, located within the Art Show. Here you may directly purchase a print of one or more of your favorite works of Science Fiction/Fantasy art without going through the Art Show's bidding process. There will also be prints of pieces not appearing in the Art Show. Come on in and check it out!


Rachel is also a contributor to several short story collections, including My Big Fat Supernatural Wedding, My Big Fat




Mark Van Name Toastmaster





Sharon's urban fantasy Carousel Tides due out in November from Baen in paper and audio book from Audible.com, and a joint Liaden novel Ghost Ship due out in 2011.

Sharon and Steve were both born and raised in and around Baltimore, Maryland of blue-collar families and have have been involved in science fiction most of their lives, with both of them having a background as con-going fans. Sharon won the Balticon short story contest in in 1975, where she first met Steve, who was a published writer and contest judge after attending Clarion West in 1973. The pair at Baltimore Science Fiction remet Society meetings and then at UMBC when both were attending college writing classes; later they married and traveled much of the US as the Dreamsgarth Agency featuring science fiction and fantasy art and book sales. They moved to Maine once their writing careers took off.

Professionally, Steve was Founding Curator of Science Fiction for the University of Maryland's SF Research Collection as well as Vice Chair of the Baltimore in 80 WorldCon bid, while Sharon has been Executive Director, Vice President, and President of the Science Fiction Writers of America; together they were BPLAN Virtuals, an ebook publisher in the late 1980s. The combination of these experiences has created a unique voice in science fiction.
