Welcome from the Chair



It's now been just over seven months since the members at Mancunicon chose us to run the 2017 Eastercon, in quite unusual circumstances. As a result of these circumstances our bid was put together in just over five working days, and since been selected we've had a great deal to do to bring us up to speed.

One of the difficulties of being so late to the starting gate was finding a venue for our Eastercon – in the end we found a great hotel with the perfect space that means we'll not be cramped and we have space for everything we want to do. But it came with its own problems – and one of these is that our access to the space outside of the convention dates is very limited. A good example being that we only get access to build the Art-Show and Dealers space at 7pm on the Thursday, and don't get the main programme space until 7am on the Friday. We can make this work – especially with your help on the Thursday evening (see the Volunteering article) but it will mean some changes to the usual timing of events such as the Opening Ceremony now being at 6pm Friday and the Art-Show Auction now being around 4pm on Sunday (See the Art Show article for more detail of changes). But there will be stuff going on from Friday morning – just not in these spaces.

And talking of stuff. Innominate is committed to making the convention as accessible to as many people as possible. As a result of this we are looking at disability in SF as one of our programme themes and will be providing a family friendly programme including items aimed at 7-16 year olds as well as a child care service for the under 7's. We will also have a quiet room as close to the heart of the convention as

we can whilst keeping it separated and quiet, and for the teens we will have a YA suite where you can go to get away from those bothersome parents and chat with each other.

We hope there will be something for everyone at Innominate, as we may be nameless, but we are not lacking in fun or ambition. So please keep yourself informed and check out our web site

The Hotel

Innominate is returning to the Hilton Metropole Birmingham NEC for 2017. Our basic room rates are £89 Single and £100 double/twin, with reduced rates on a number of executive rooms and suites. Parking will be £9 a night for residents and £15 a day for non-residents. There is free WiFi in public spaces and in-room WiFi is available at £14.95 for 24 hours.

Hotel uptake has been encouraging with over 400 of you now booked into the hotel in 245 rooms and suites. If you have still to book your room follow the link at the top of the front page on our web site <http://eastercon2017.uk>.

As of going to print our block is nearly out of single rooms – and we have used up about nearly 50% of our block of standard twin and double rooms. So we would encourage you all to book your rooms as soon as possible. But if you

have any difficulty finding the room you want email us at hotel@eastercon2017.uk as we know our wing night blocks are getting tight, but if you book for the core nights and let us know you booking reference we can probably add your required wing nights.

However if we do run out of rooms in the Metropole there are numerous other hotels nearby that will be able to accommodate you at a range of prices. But we expect tickets to go on sale soon for a huge gaming convention at the NEC over the Easter Weekend (Insomnia60). When that does open its members will begin booking hotel rooms and for the forthcoming event hotel room rates are 50% higher than the weekend before.

So our message to you all is book you hotel rooms now.

Pat was born in New York, raised in Massachusetts and spent most of her adult life in Kansas City before moving to the UK. She has had a career in science fiction going back over 30 years including one Hugo win for her novella “The Girl-Thing Who

Went Out For Sushi” Pat is an ever popular guest at universities, festivals and conventions and never fails to inform, surprise and entertain her audience – most recently as Toastmaster at the 2016 Worldcon in Kansas City where she hosted the Hugo Awards.

Judith Clute



Judith was born in Canada in 1942, but has lived in Camden London since 1969. She has been exhibiting her art since 1970 and has been doing the occasional book cover since 1980.

Her science fiction works have included illustrations for Interzone and Salon Futura and the covers for a number of books by Joanna Russ. Her most recent exhibition was themed on the “Darkening Garden, paintings and etchings” at the Camden Image Gallery in 2016, an exhibit linked to John Clute’s nonfiction work “The Darkening Garden” published in 2006.

Colin Harris



What can I say about Colin. We first met when I was recruited to work on Interaction – the Worldcon he chaired with Vincent Docherty in 2005. But his career in science fiction fandom goes back 20 years or more before that, and he is still active today producing the programme for the 2016 Smof-Con – looking to pass his experience on to the next generation.

But conventions are not his only love. Colin is a major collector of science fiction art and has more recently moved into Fanzine writing and editing, for which he was awarded a Hugo in 2015 for his work on “Journey Planet” with James Bacon, Chris Garcia, Alissa McKersie and Helen Montgomery.

2001: The SFactor

2017 marks the 100th anniversary of the birth of Arthur C. Clarke, one of the UK's greatest science fiction authors. To commemorate this, NewCon Press and the Arthur C. Clarke Award are collaborating to produce a very special anthology: **2001: An Odyssey In Words**.

The book will feature original stories from some of the biggest names in genre fiction, including past winners of the Arthur C. Clarke Award, and we are offering **you** the opportunity to be involved by submitting for the anthology. Your story must be science fiction rather than fantasy; the only other submission requirement is that you are a registered member of **Innominate**, the 2017 Eastercon. All submissions will be read by Ian Whates (proprietor of NewCon Press)

and Tom Hunter (Director of the Arthur C. Clarke Award). They will select their favourite three pieces, and those authors will be invited to read their stories aloud at **2001: The SFactor**, where the members of the audience will help choose the eventual winner, to be announced during the BSFA Award Ceremony. The successful author will receive a slot in the book, plus a cash prize of 2001p.

Oh, there's just one catch: each submitted story has to be *exactly* 2001 words long (excluding title). A single word more, a single word less, and your story will not be considered.
