

Introducing our Scientist Guest of Honour Professor Dame Jocelyn Bell Burnell

Dame Jocelyn is a world-renowned British scientist and Visiting Professor of Astrophysics at the University of Oxford. She discovered radio pulsars whilst a postgraduate student at Cambridge in the 1960's, a finding for which her PhD advisor, Antony Hewish, later shared the Nobel Prize in Physics. She holds numerous awards and honorary degrees, is a Fellow of the Royal Society, and has served as president of the Institute of Physics. She was one of the scientists featured in the BBC4 Beautiful Minds series.

Originally from Belfast, Dame Jocelyn has strong Scottish connections – her BSc is from the University of Glasgow and she worked at the Royal Observatory in Edinburgh for several years. She is a champion for women in science, an innovative science communicator (for example using poetry to engage listeners with astronomy) and an active Quaker.

Stamp Out Albatrosses!

OK – now that we have your attention we can admit that this should actually read 'Stamps for Albatrosses', our pre-con charity fundraiser. Many of you will remember the albatross as a badge motif for the well-loved Albacon conventions that took place in the 1980's. The RSPB are currently collecting stamps to help in their albatross preservation work. Satellite 4 has decided to pay tribute to these earlier Glasgow conventions and help protect these magnificent birds by saving all



the stamps from con correspondence for this worthy cause.

We'd like you to help us collect stamps. Better still, encourage your friends, families and workmates to do the same (check our website for a poster you can print out). Please cut them out with no more than a few mm border, save them up in a safe place, and bring them to the convention. We hope to be able to fill a big sack, which we'll hand in to a local reserve.

Hotel Update

The Convention will take place in the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Congress Road, Glasgow G3 8QT. The hotel is situated about two miles from Glasgow City Centre and beside the Scottish Exhibition and Conference Centre. The hotel is familiar to SF fans, having hosted the 2006 Eastercon, Concussion, and was the principal hotel for both the 1995 Worldcon, Intersection, and the 2005 Worldcon, Interaction. Overflow accommodation is available at the Campanile and the Hilton Garden Inn – both across the car park from the Crowne Plaza – and the Marriott, which is just over a mile from the Crowne Plaza.

Programme

The success of an Eastercon depends hugely on the quality of its programme, and the quality of the programme depends on you – the membership – putting forward interesting and exciting ideas for programme items. Are you an expert on the Golden Age of Science Fiction, or the history of spaceflight, and willing to offer a talk on your specialist subject? Do you have a great idea for a panel discussion? Are you a burgeoning quizmaster? If so, please complete the programme volunteer form on the website.

Please also remember to start work on your convention costumes. As mentioned in PR1, Satellite 4 will feature 'The Ambassador's Ball'. You are invited to attend dressed as dignitaries and delegations from all races, cultures, planets and universes (real or fictional). Costumers will have the chance to be announced on arrival and to have their work judged by an expert panel. Short 'dramatic presentations' can be accommodated, by prior arrangement. We will also be having Hall Costume Day on Saturday. Finally, 2014 is the 40th anniversary of the movie 'Young Frankenstein' (doesn't time fly!). So we've decide that the theme for the Satellite 4 disco will be 'The Modern Prometheus'. We hope you'll get your brains working (including any A B Normal brains of course) on some really inventive costumes. Feel free to hark back to the original Mary Shelley novel, adapt something from the movie, or delve into the modern world of cloning and stem cell research. Imagination is your only limit!

Note that, throughout the convention, a strict weapons policy will be enforced. Side-arms must be peace-bonded at all times. Larger weapons may be displayed at certain times e.g. during formal presentation at the Ball, at the discretion of the Head of Operations (please e-mail us at info@satellite4.org.uk if you have any questions).

Converting from Supporting
