For the 2014 Hugo Awards, 1923 valid nominating ballots were received and counted from the members of LoneStarCon 3, Loncon 3 and Sasquan (1889 were electronic and 34 were paper). For the 1939 Retro Hugo Awards, 233 valid nominating ballots were received and counted from members of LoneStarCon 3, Loncon 3 and Sasquan (226 were electronic and 7 were paper).

This year, Loncon 3 is also choosing to exercise its right to present the retroactive Hugo Awards for 1939. The nominees for the Retro Hugo Awards are printed to the right; the 2014 nominees are printed overleaf.
