LUNACON GUEST LIST

NEAL ADAMS is a highly acclaimed comics illustrator. He was Art Director for the Broadway production of WARP ("The World's First Epic Adventure Play in Serial Form"), designing both the sets and the costumes.

ISAAC ASIMOV has written nearly two hundred books, from the science fiction classic, THE FOUNDATION TRILOGY, to ASIMOV'S GUIDE TO THE BIBLE. He is a scientist, professor, writer, lecturer, and expert Dirty Old Man (author, THE SENSUOUS DIRTY OLD MAN).

BOB ASPRIN is known as "Yang the Nauseating" to the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA). He is leader of both the Dark Horde (an SCA-related group) and the Dorsai (a fan security group).

JIM BAEN is the editor of GALAXY.

LIN CARTER is the author of TOLKIEN: A LOOK BEHIND THE LORD OF THE RINGS, LOVECRAFT: A LOOK BEHIND THE CTHULHU MYTHOS, and the only history of fantasy, IMAGINARY WORLDS.

HAL CLEMENT'S first novel, MISSION OF GRAVITY is a classic in the field. Twenty-three years later, he is still writing, as well as teaching, painting and speaking.

THEODORE COGSWELL is the editor of the SFWA FORUM, and has been writing fantasy and science fiction for years (not always separating them into different stories).

LESTER DEL REY is the author of such well-known books as NERVES, THE ELEVENTH COMMANDMENT, and ROBOTS AND CHANGELINGS. He was Guest Of Honor at the 1967 World Science Fiction Convention.

VINCENT DIFATE is a Hugo-nominated artist, who has done covers for ALGOL, ANALOG, BERKLEY, ACE, DELL, PUTNAM, and others.

LARRY EISENBERG is a chemist, a writer, and as far as we can determine, no relation to the Program Director.

ED FERMAN is the editor of the Hugo-winning MAGAZINE OF FANTASY AND SCIENCE FICTION.

RAYMOND Z. GALLUN's most recent novel is THE EDEN CYCLE.

VIC GHIDALIA has edited several horror and science fiction anthologies, including THE VENUS FACTOR (with Roger Elwood).

RON COULART has written AFTER THINGS FELL APART, WILDSMITH, and THE ADVENTUROUS DECADE, to name a few.

NORMAN M. LOBSENZ was the editorial director of AMAZING.

FRANK BELKNAP LONG has had many of his fantasy and horror stories reprinted recently in THE EARLY LONG, by DOUBLEDAY.

ROBERT A.W. LOWNDES was the editor of FAMOUS SCIENCE FICTION.

BARRY N. MALZBERG was a science fiction writer.

SAM MOSKOWITZ is the author of EXPLORERS OF THE INFINITE, and other critical works on science fiction.

CHARLES PLATT is one of the editors of the late NEW WORLDS.

P.J. PLAUGER is the 1975 John W. Campbell Award winner.

TOM FURDOM is the Eastern Regional Director of SFWA (The Science Fiction Writers of America).

NEIL SHAPIRO has had quite a few novelettes published in VERTEX.
