HONORED GUESTS

Vonda McIntyre won the Nebula Award for Best Novelette in 1973 for "Of Mist, and Grass, and Sand". Her novel, Dreamsnake, was honored with both the 1978 Nebula Award and the 1979 Hugo Award for Best Novel. Her other novels include The Exile Waiting and Superluminal as well as the Starfarers series: Starfarers, Transition, Metaphase and the forthcoming Nautilus. She has also written one children's book, Barbary, the Star Trek novels The Entropy Effect and Enterprise: The First Adventure, and the novelizations of the second, third and fourth Star Trek films.

James Warhola's artwork has graced the covers of Robert Heinlein's Stranger in a Strange Land, Glory Road, The Moon is a Harsh Mistress and Starship Troopers, William Gibson's Neuromancer, and John DeChancie's Castle War. He has also done the jacket paintings of several of Spider Kobinson's Callahan books, including the most recent, The Callahan Touch. Some of his work may also be found lurking on and between the covers of Mad Magazine.

Walter R. Cole has been involved with the *Lunarians* since the Club's third meeting, back in January 1957. He's been perhaps our most active member, serving innumerable times as Lunarians Secretary as well as on several Lunacon Committees. In 1986, he was voted an Honorary Membership in the New York Science Fiction Society - the Lunarians, Inc. in recognition for his decades of service. We're proud to pay tribute to Walt as our Fan Guest of Honor.

Dean Friedman has been making his own idiosyncratic style of music since 1977. He had a top-40 hit in 1978 with "Ariel". Love, adolescence, insanity, UFOs and millions of matzoh balls are among the various things which appear in his lyrics. He also designs virtual reality systems and has had a virtual reality program, "Eat-a-Bug", featured on Nick Arcade.

Walter Simonson drew the Star Slammers strip for the 1974 Washington, D.C. Worldcon bid. A new Star Slammers series is due out from Malibu Comics in late spring 1994. His early work included the art for the highly acclaimed Manhunter series, and the Metal Men comic book for DC. Later, his innovative writing and drawing for Marvel's Thor in the early eighties became a critical and fan favorite. More recently, he did the art for the Robocop vs. Terminator mini-series from Dark Horse, and wrote a new Legends of the World's Finest series for DC. Louise Simonson started as an editor at Warren Publications, where she edited a story for Creepy by our Comics Track coordinator, Ken Gale. Then she did some editing and writing for Marvel comics. Now, she is the writer and co-creator of the John Henry Irons character in the upcoming Steel, and is also writing one fourth of the new and continuing life of Superman: The Man of Steel, for DC comics.

Peter Grubbs, our Featured Filker, is a professional folk and rock performer from Pennsylvania who commands a strong mid-western filk following. You can hear some of his work on both of the Noreascon 3 filk tapes. He is a

superb guitarist and a fiery performer with an amazing knack with a song. He is making a rare, east coast appearance here at *Lunacon* '94.

Children 5 and younger are admitted free. Children aged 6 – 12 are half-price. All children must be accompanied by an adult. A limited amount of baby sitting during Convention hours will be available. Please see the following section on *Child Care* for full information.

Children over 12 and under 18 are considered full Convention members, but they must provide a parental release form waiving any liability of Lunacon '94 if they are attending unaccompanied.

Please fill out the enclosed registration form and mail it with a check, money order or completed credit card information (including your signature) to the Convention address, Attn: Registration. Make your checks drawn on a U.S. bank or money order in U.S. dollars payable to Lunacon '94. DO NOT SEND CASH THROUGH THE MAIL. A receipt will be mailed to you. Please

bring the receipt, or other form of identification which includes your address, with you to speed your way through Convention Registration.

Refunds will not be given, but a membership may be transferred upon receipt of a written request from the current holder of the membership.

A \$20 service fee will be collected for each bounced check.

We will not accept any memberships by mail that are postmarked later than February 18th. Any payments mailed after that date will be returned.

If you move during the coming year, please send us your new address as soon as possible so that you may continue to receive information about future *Lunacons*.

Registration is your first stop at the Convention, whether you're preregistered or buying a membership at the door. Once again this year, we will be making an extra-special effort to make registration as smooth and convenient as possible.

There will be signs posted in the lobby of the hotel clearly directing you to the Convention Registration area. We hope to be able to have after-hours registration for pre-registered members on Friday and Saturday available in the *Lunacon* Office. We will be able to accept Visa and MasterCard at the Convention. If you are buying your membership at the door, please have proper identification which includes your address to speed you through the registration procedure.

REMINDER: You must wear your Lunacon badge at all times. If you refuse to show your convention badge, you may be asked to leave the hotel.

CHILD CARE

All children must be accompanied by an adult in order to purchase a membership, and all children must be registered with the Convention.

6 through 12 years Half-price
(\$15 through February 18, 1994;
\$20 at the door)

All children 12 and under will have the following additional information listed on the back of their badge: the parent's (or responsible adult's) name and hotel room number (if applicable). These children must, at all times, be under the supervision of an adult or in the Lunacon Child Care area. If a young child is found unattended, we will bring that child to the Child Care area, and the child's parent or guardian will be billed for the time that child is in our Child Care area.

We are aware that many children in the 6-12 year old range are capable of independent activity. As long as they are not causing problems, they do not have to be under adult supervision. However, if they are not capable of such independent activity (and this capability is defined by the Convention Committee), they must be under adult supervision or in the Child Care area.

We have once again contracted with a professional service to provide Child Care. We intend to make this service available for the same number of hours as this past *Lunacon*. The cost is \$4 per hour, with a maximum of \$50 charged for any child. Children will be supervised and provided with juice and other healthy snacks, but not meals. Parents are asked to provide toys, games, diapers, etc.

Hours:

Friday 3:00 pm to 11:00 pm Saturday 10:00 am to midnight Sunday 10:00 am to 4:00 pm Child Care tickets will be sold in the Child Care Suite. Each ticket is good for one hour. You must register in advance so that we can properly plan the number of professionals to hire.

HOTEL

The Rye Town Hilton, 699 Westchester Avenue, Rye Brook, New York, off I-287 (Cross Westchester Expressway) in Westchester County, just north of New York City will again be the location for Lunacon in 1994. The Port Chester and Rye stops on Metro North's New Haven line are the closest train stations. The hotel will be providing a complimentary shuttle that coordinates with the train schedule to both stations.

The hotel offers an indoor pool, a health club, an inexpensive restaurant (The Tulip Tree, which will feature a dinner buffet on Saturday night), a first-class restaurant (Penfield's, which will offer a prix fixe dinner on Friday and Saturday nights), plenty of parking and other amenities.

There are a number of places where you can eat in the area, as well as several supermarkets and other stores. An updated listing of what's in the neighborhood will be available in the Pocket Program at the Convention.

Special Note:

All function rooms at Lunacon '94 will be non-smoking!

Room rates are \$87.00 for singles, \$93.00 for doubles, and \$103.00 for triples or quads. These rates do not include local taxes. American Express, Visa, MasterCard, Carte Blanche, Diners Club and Discover cards are accepted. Standard check-in time is 3 pm, but your room may be available earlier. If it is not, please be patient. Check-out time is 1 pm, with check-out extended at the

discretion of the hotel. Please check with the front desk as early as possible if an extension will be required.

Use the enclosed form to make your hotel reservation by February 25, 1994. Please indicate your preference for smoking, non-smoking, party and non-party areas. The hotel will try to honor your requests. Other special requests will be honored if possible. If you prefer to phone in your reservation, please call the hotel at 1-914-939-6300. Please remember to mention *Lunacon* to be sure that you will get the Convention rate. If you use the Hilton toll-free number to make your reservation there is no guarantee that they will be able to give you the special *Lunacon* rate.

There are a limited number of suites available. If you are interested in one, please write to us as soon as possible. All suites must be booked through the Convention.

All parties must be in designated party areas. Parties held in other areas will be closed down.

DIRECTIONS

BY CAR

From the South:

Take I-87, or the Saw Mill River Parkway north to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expressway). Take I-287 to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester Avenue. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance;

or take the Hutchinson River Parkway to the I-287/Rye exit and stay on the service road. Go left under the highway and you are on Westchester Avenue. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance;

or take I-95 north to Exit 21, Rye. Go west on I-287 (Cross Westchester Expressway)

to Exit 10 (Bowman Avenue/Webb Avenue). Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance.

From the North:

Take I-95 south to Exit 21, Rye. Proceed as from I-95 north, above;

or take I-87, or the Merritt Parkway, or the Saw Mill River Parkway, or I-684 south to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expressway) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester Avenue. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance.

From West of the Hudson River: All major highways intersect with I-87. Go east on I-87/I-287 over the Tappan Zee Bridge and stay on I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expressway) and continue as above under "From the South."

BY RAIL

Take the Metro-North New Haven Line Local from Grand Central Station to either the Port Chester or Rye stations. The hotel will be running a complimentary shuttle service to and from both of these stations, coordinated with the train schedule. If you have any questions or problems finding the shuttle, please call the hotel at 1-914-939-6300 and tell them exactly where you are.

A taxi from either train station to the hotel is currently about eight dollars.

The #13 Westchester bus runs from the Port Chester Station and the hotel. Check with the Westchester Department of Transportation for the latest schedules and fares.

WEAPONS POLICY

NO WEAPONS OF ANY KIND ARE PERMITTED. People with weapons will not be registered. Anyone found to be carrying a weapon during the Convention will have his/her membership revoked without compensation. The use of a weapon as part of the Masquerade must be approved by the Masquerade Director prior to the event.

The Convention Committee defines a weapon as anything that is classified as a weapon under New York State law, any object designed to cause bodily harm, or any replica of such object, and any other object the Committee determines to be dangerous. This includes toy weapons of all types. However, the Committee reserves the right to amend this definition of a weapon, and the right to impound weapons for the duration of the Convention.

MAIN PROGRAMMING

Lunacon is planning a diverse set of activities that's as far-ranging as Science Fiction and Fantasy itself. Our multiple tracks of Program will include panels and presentations on SF, fantasy, art, media (including radio), fanzines, fan history, costuming, gaming, filksinging, science, history, literature, humor and music. In addition, this year we will have a track of programming relating to comics and graphic novels, coordinated by Ken Gale of Evolution Comics. We hope to include something for everyone. Above all, we promise you'll have fun.

Likely program topics and activities include alternate religion and SF, from Heinlein's Church of All Worlds and Vonnegut's Bokononism to the popularity of Neo-Paganism in Fandom; SF in Saturday morning cartoons – from Space Angel to Duck Dodgers; the continuing appeal of vampires; our fascination with and current theories

about dinosaurs; advice for and by new writers; the business side of publishing; costuming, filking and music workshops; a filk concert and readings (including perhaps an ensemble reading).

The highlight of programming Friday night will be our Opening Ceremonies extravaganza, including Regency Dancing and a concert by our Special Musical Guest, Dean Friedman. Dancing is encouraged!

Programming on Saturday will include various lively panels and workshops, the Masquerade and a Filk Concert starring our Featured Filker, Peter Grubbs.

Sunday programming includes the ever-popular Book Exhibit Raffle (surplus funds will be added to the Donald A. Wollheim Memorial Scholarship Fund), the Art Auction, a Filk "one-shot" concert, and the opportunity to let the Lunacon Committee know what was done well and not so well at our Gripe Session.

MASQUERADE

Let your imagination soar! Bring to life your favorite character from an SF novel, fantasy novel, or movie or create an original character from the heights (or depths) of your own mind. Amaze us or amuse us, horrify or delight us. The Lunacon Masquerade Wants You! Put on a costume and give it a try!

The Lunacon '94 Masquerade is scheduled for Saturday evening in the Westchester Ballroom and will be run on a variant of the Skill Division System, with separate divisions for entrants from first-time Novices through Worldcon Masters. There will also be a division for young fans under the age of 13 to have their moment in the spotlight. (Costumes may

be made by the child or by Mom and Dad.) We hope to have a large and talented turnout this year, with both returning favorites and many new faces.

The Masquerade will be run, once again, by Susan de Guardiola and her able team of technical wizards. Our Master of Ceremonies this year will be T. J. Glenn – local New York City actor, swordsman, writer, stuntman and Lunacon regular. Ken Warren will again be joining us to provide our official photography. Pictures will be available for purchase at the Masquerade post-mortem on Sunday. We are, as always, looking for more volunteers and more costumers – please bring us your talents in either area.

Registration for the Masquerade will be at-the-con only. Look for Masquerade Registration Table early to pick up the rules and your entry forms! To request advance copies of the rules or to volunteer to help, please write to the Lunacon P.O. Box, Attn: Masquerade.

HALL COSTUMES

Also known as "Clothing for an Alternate Universe", Lunacon welcomes your hall costumes. Our anonymous judges will be roaming throughout the Convention to award ribbons for the most outstanding costumes. Winners will be asked to report to Masquerade Registration to receive special certificates and to have their photo taken for posterity. A Winners List will be posted near the Masquerade Registration area.

Please Note:

Due to the Convention Weapons Policy, all Masquerade costumes involving weapons of any kind must receive prior at-con approval of the Masquerade Director. Under no circumstances will hall costumers be permitted to carry weapons. In addition, please remember that nudity is not a costume and to cover revealing costumes in the public areas of the hotel, such as the Bar, any Restaurants and the Lobby.

COSTUME PROGRAMMING

Once again this year, Lunacon is planning to include a number of costume and masquerade oriented panels and discussions as part of the Convention program. We welcome your ideas and suggestions to make costume programming stronger and better, so please feel free to write to us.

REGENCY DANCING

One event at recent Lunacons that was extremely well received is the Regency Dance. The ballroom overflows with a lot of happy people. Once again, John Hertz has agreed to join us and show us all how it's done. John explains Regency Dancing this way:

"Buy me drink at Lunacon and I'll tell you how fans fell in love with Georgette Heyer and her historical romance novels set in the English Regency period (about the year 1800), and how I volunteered, or was volunteered, to reconstruct its ballroom dance. This was the age of Jane Austen and Beau Brummell, when Napoleon was loose in Europe, and Brummell snubbed the Prince Regent by asking Baron Alvanley, 'Alvanley, who's your fat friend?'. It appeals to the fannish sense of whimsy. Today Regency Dancing can be found at far more SF cons than I can attend. Period costumes and some of the best hall costumes can usually be seen, but you don't have to come in costume. You don't have to know how to dance, either, and at Lunacon I'll teach you myself."

FILKSINGING

Filk, a form of folk music based on SF, Fantasy, the media and their fans, comes back to Lunacon '94 in a big way. We are pleased to announce the return of a Featured Filker to Lunacon '94, Peter Grubbs. Our commitment to building on the strong tradition of filk at Lunacon is evident in other ways as well. We have expanded the space for late-night open filking. In addition, we are scheduling

filk panels, discussions, workshops, a concert starring our Featured Filker and a "one-shot" Filk concert, as well as other events. At Lunacon '94, a Filker is sure to have a good time!

FILMS/VIDEO

Once again, Lunacon will present a variety of rarely shown films. Saturday and Sunday morning, we will feature cartoons and other fan favorites.

In addition, The Chronic Rift will again be here to present some of the best from their public access SF interview program and from Word Balloons, their show about the comics industry.

ANIMÉ (JAPANESE ANIMATION)

This is the twelfth year that Lunacon will present an animé video program. For videos not dubbed or subtitled in English, narrators will provide running commentary. A mix of recent translations, old favorites and the newest titles to arrive in this country are scheduled to be presented.

RADIO PROGRAMMING

Iim Freund and Max Shmid of WBAI-FM will be presenting a selection of some of the best SF from contemporary radio.

GAMING

This year at Lunacon there will be more gaming space than ever! With three gaming rooms featuring various scheduled RPGA (Role Playing Game Association) events, traditional open gaming, and, new for Lunacon '94, a full room devoted to miniature wargaming sponsored by Games Workshop®.

Scheduled events in the miniatures room include Warhammer 40K[®], Space Marine®, Man-O-War® and Space Hulk*. Experienced players are encouraged to bring their painted miniatures. Models and extensive instruction will be provided for beginners and anyone

else interested in learning about the fascinating world of miniature wargaming.

For breakfast Saturday and Sunday mornings, we will have coffee, tea, bagels, and other goodies (beginning at 8 am), and between events, we will be showing all sorts of bad video entertainment. The Con Suite will close at 3 am Friday and Saturday nights.

Of course, the Con Suite will offer the expected scrumptious assortment of snacks, soft drinks and surprise goodies all weekend long! And for a quiet escape, one of our Suite rooms will always be available for gathering, talking and socializing. The entire Con Suite will be non-smoking throughout the weekend.

PARTIES

Additionally, other groups at *Lunacon* are encouraged to host open parties, to which all Convention attendees are invited. Please check the Convention Newsletter and Party Bulletin Boards for times and locations.

Alcohol may not be served at open parties, and you will be asked to close down if it is. An open party is one that is open to all Convention members and is advertised openly at the Convention. A closed party is not advertised, is invitational in nature, and runs behind closed doors.

ART SHOW AND PRINT SHOP

The Lunacon Art Show is one of the highest quality science fiction convention art shows in the country. We've also become one of the largest, displaying some of the finest works of many amateur and professional artists working in the genre today.

The Lunacon '94 Art Show will once again be located in the Center and South sections of the Grand Ballroom. (The North section will be used by our Program Department and is the site of

the Art Auction on Sunday.) We will have about 90 panels of original artwork, some tables for 3-D art and a large Print Shop where multiple copies of reproductions will be for sale.

Prior to bidding for art, either at the auction or by written bid, or before making a purchase at the Print Shop, you will be asked to obtain a bidder number and fill out a bidder registration form at the Art Show Desk. When you are given your bidder number, you will be given a copy of the Art Show and Print Shop bidding and purchasing rules. Your acceptance of a bidder number indicates your acceptance of those rules.

Original art is normally sold by written bid. Bidding will end late Sunday morning and those pieces receiving the maximum number of written bids (7) will go to our voice auction early Sunday afternoon. All purchases must be picked up on Sunday afternoon, no later than 4 pm. Print Shop purchases must be taken away upon purchase. Cash, checks (with proper ID), MasterCard and Visa will be accepted for all purchases.

PRINT SHOP

Our Print Shop will have a sizable display area for the various SF art reproductions that will be entered. These are usually less expensive copies of some of the pieces of original art that are for sale in the Art Show, pieces marked "NFS" (not for sale) or pieces by other artists who choose not to display their original works. All prints will be for sale at fixed prices.

The Print Shop will be open the same hours as the Art Show. Please check your Pocket Program during the Convention for our exact hours.

PHOTOGRAPHY

To protect the artist's rights, no photography will be allowed in the Art Show except for official Convention photographs and supervised press photography. You will not be allowed to bring a 12

camera into the Art Show unless it is sealed in a bag.

Artists who wish to enter this year's Art Show should write to the Convention address, Attn: Art Show to be sure that you are on our mailing list. A complete set of rules and registration forms will be mailed out in early December. As in the past, all reservations for space must be made in advance, using the Art Show Reservation Form.

DEALERS' ROOM

For Lunacon '94, the Dealers' Room will offer an exciting and varied selection of delights from jewelry to t-shirts, from filk tapes to fine books, from costume materials to the latest new books, both paperback and hardcover. By the time you read this, however, this year's Dealers' space will already be sold out. But, if you have any questions, or wish to be included in future dealers' mailings, please contact Devra Langsam at the Convention P.O. Box.

MERCHANDISE AND SALES

Lunacon '94 will be offering an impressive array of products for sale, including a new t-shirt produced especially for the Convention with artwork by James Warhola. Also available will be the Lunarians' tote bag, a 100% natural cotton, heavy-duty carry-all with straps long enough for use as a shoulder bag. The bag sports the "Little Loony" logo, as drawn by Wally Wood.

For those who would like to purchase Book Exhibit Raffle tickets or various t-shirts, jerseys and souvenir books from the *Lunacons* of past years (if you somehow missed buying them back then, here's another chance for you to get them), and other memorabilia, Convention Sales is the place to go!
