### C.J. CHERRYH

C.J. Cherryh writes hard SF books such as the *Cyteen* trilogy and the *Chanur* series, and high fantasy like her recently published *Fortress in the Eye of Time*.

Her efforts have garnered three Hugo awards, a John W. Campbell Award, and a Locus Award, plus nominations for the Nebula, for more Hugos, and an assortment of other awards.

Before turning to free-lance writing, C.J. got a B.A. in Latin and an M.A. in Classics, and has taught Latin, Greek, and Ancient History. She has also been Alpha Delta Lambda and Phi Beta Kappa, and the recipient of a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship in Classics.

When she isn't writing, C.J. travels, plays guitar and composes, weaves, paints, sculpts, and photographs. Lunacon is proud to have lured this popular author out of Oklahoma -- and it's not even tornado season!

# Artist Guest of Honor:

#### DAVID A. CHERRY

David Cherry was a classical scholar as an undergraduate, majoring in Latin. His graduate studies were in law, but after eight years as a lawyer, he gave it up for art, and since 1984, the law's loss has been SF art's gain.

By 1986, he had received two Chesley Awards from the Association of Science Fiction Artists, and in 1987, a book:, Imagination: the Art and Technique of David A. Cherry was published. That book got a Hugo nomination in 1988, and David got a nomination as Best Professional Artist.

David Cherry's artwork has decorated the books of authors like Stephen R. Donaldson, Poul Anderson, David Brin, Judith Tarr, Spider Robinson, and, coincidentally, those of C.J.Cherryh, who happens to be his sister. Their names are spelled differently in order to avoid being mistaken for each other.

# Media Guest of Honor:

## MICHAEL O'HARE

Best known to SF fans for his role as Commander Jeffrey Sinclair on the Hugo-Award winning TV series Babylon 5, Michael O'Hare has a broad and varied acting carreer.

Born in Chicago, he began as a student of literature at Harvard, and later switched to acting, training at the Julliard School.

He has acted in leading roles on Broadway, playing Col. Jessup in A Few Good Men. Other major roles included playing opposite Fred Gwynne in Players, with George Grizzard and Philip Bosco in Shaw's Man and Superman, and in Galileo.

His TV work includes roles in A Case of Force, Rage of Angels, and Fly Away Home, as well as roles in The Cosby Show, and T.J. Hooker. His most recent role was in Europe in the film By a Thread.

His appearance at Lunacon is contingent upon his professional commitments.

# Can Guest of Honor:

## MICHAEL J. WALSH

Mike is a long-time fan with a nearly 30 year involvement with SF. He began his involvement with fandom with an exchange of postcards with well-known writer Jack Chalker, who was then proprietor of small publisher Mirage Press. That correspondence led to Mike attending meetings of WSFA, the Washington, DC SF Association.

In the following years, Mike put in time as President, Vice President, and Trustee of WSFA, founder of the WSFA Press, Chair of ConStellation, the 1983 WorldCon, and of several Disclaves. Most recently he chaired a World Fantasy Convention.

Mike now has his own small press -- Old Earth Books. He has published Alan Steele's two collections, and reprinted H. Beam Piper's first novel and two of James White's novels. His current projects are a trade paperback reissue of E. E. Smith's classic *Lensman* series., and a collection of Patricia Anthony's short fiction for next year's Disclave.

## Programming:

Lunacon has traditionally had strong programming, with efforts in a variety of different areas. Program Director Lucy Schmeidler tells us that this year's theme is "Inter-species Communication and Conflict".

This fits in nicely with the work of Writer GOH C. J. Cherryh, in stories like her *Chanur* series, and Media GOH Michael O'Hare's role on *Babylon 5*, as Commander of a space station meant as a center of trade and diplomacy among an

assortment of not always friendly alien races.

Roberta Gellis, Robert Greenberger, David M. Harris, Jael, Jacqueline Lichtenberg, Victoria Lisi, Barry Malzberg, Charles Pellegrino, Andrew Porter, Christopher Rowley, Darrelln Schweitzer, Josepha Sherman, and Susan Shwartz.

We'll have speeches, panels, slide shows, presentations, readings, workshops, and whatever special items Lucy has to surprise us. Join us and see what she has done

## Masquerade:

We're going to have one again this year and Susan de Guardiola and her technical wizards will run it with their customary élan.

The Masquerade will be on Saturday night. It will be run on a Skill Division System, with separate divisions for Novice, Journeyman, Craftsman and Master-level costumers. There will also be a division for young fans (under 13) to have a moment in the spotlight. Costumes may be made by the child or by a parent. We will have photos available on Sunday for people who wish to order copies.

Registration for the Masquerade will be at-the-con only. Stop by the Masquerade Registration table early to pick up rules and entry forms. Judges will be roaming the convention anonymously to award ribbons for

Outstanding Hall Costumes. Winners will receive special certificates and be photographed for display on our Winner's Board, for all to admire. Any Masquerade costume involving weapons of any kind must have the prior approval of the Masquerade Director.

Please remember that nudity is not a costume. Cover revealing costumes in the public areas of the hotel, such as the bar, restaurants and lobby.

Want to do something without the kids? Lunacon has contracted with a professional service to provide child care. The rate is tentatively \$4 an hour, up to a maximum of \$50 per child.

Children will be provided with supervision, juice and healthy snacks, but not meals. Parents are asked to provide toys, diapers, etc. Child care tickets will be sold in the Convention Office. You must register in advance.

## Hotel Information:

Lunacon '97 will take place at the Rye Town Hilton, 699 Westchester Ave., Rye Brook, NY, in Westchester County, just north of New York City. The Port Chester and Rye stops on Metro-North's New Haven line are the closest train stations. The hotel offers two restaurants, an indoor pool, a health club, plenty of parking and, we have been told, rooms.

Special room rates (per night) for Lunacon are: \$92 for a Single, \$98 for a Double (one king-size bed) or Twin (two double beds), \$108 for a Triple or Quad (two double beds); these rates do not include taxes. There are also a limited number of suites available. If you are interested in one, please write Lunacon-not the hotel - as soon as possible.

The hotel accepts American Express, Visa, MasterCard, Carte Blanche, Diners Club and Discover cards. When registering, you may request smoking or non-smoking floors, party or non-party areas.

You may register using the form we've provided or by phoning the hotel at 1-914-939-6300. Be sure to mention Lunacon to receive our special room rates.

Under New York State law, no one under the age of 18 may rent a room. An

exception may be made if an adult accepts responsibility for all costs associated with the room in a signed and dated letter that includes a photocopy of both sides of a major credit card.

There are several places to eat in the area, and stores to supply all your needs.

### Directions:

By Car

From the South:

Take I-87, or the Hutchinson River Pkwy, or the Saw Mill River Pkwy north to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expwy) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester Ave. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance;

...or take I-95 North to Exit 21, Rye. Go west on I-287 to Exit 10 (Bowman Ave./Webb Ave.). Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance.

#### From the North:

Take I-95 south to Exit 21 (Rye, Cross Westchester Expwy). Go west on I-287 to Exit 10. Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance;

...or take 1-87, or the Merritt Pkwy, or the Saw Mill River Pkwy, or I-684 south to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expwy) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester

Ave. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance.

#### From West of the Hudson River:

All major highways intersect with I-87. Go east on I-87/I-287 over the Tappan Zee Bridge and stay on I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expwy) and continue as above under "From the South".

#### Via Rail

Take the Metro-North New Haven Line Local from Grand Central Station to the Rye or Port Chester stations. The hotel will be running a complimentary shuttle service to and from both stations, coordinated with the train schedule.

The #13 Westchester bus runs from the Port Chester Station and the hotel. Check with the Westchester Dept. of Transportation at 1-914-682-2020 for the latest schedules and fares.

A taxi from the train station to the hotel is currently about \$10.
