Guests of Honor

Lunacon has always taken pride in the guests it attracts. This year we are especially proud of our lineup.

Our Writer Guest of Honor is Alan Dean Foster. Alan has written a wide variety of material, including his own original fiction, novelizations for Star Trek and Star Wars, work for film, TV, and games, and a variety of nonfiction. He has collected the Galaxy Award, the Southwest Book Award for Fiction, the UPC Award, the Ignotius Award, and the Strannik Award along the way.

Our Artist Guest of Honor is James Gurney. James has done work for a number of clients, including book publishers, National Geographic magazine, and the US Postal Service. He is best known for his books on

Dinotopia, the land where humans and intelligent dinosaurs live together in peace and cooperation. James previewed what would become Dinotopia at Lunacon in 1991. There is now an upcoming Hallmark TV miniseries based on the books which will appear in mid-2002, so we are especially happy Jim accepted our invitation.

Our Fan Guests of Honor are Ron and Val Ontell. Ron and Val are transplanted New Yorkers, now living in California. Before moving, Ron was President of the New York Science Fiction Society – the Lunarians, Inc., and Val was Chair of two Lunacons. They've changed locations but not habits, and have been active in a variety of West Coast conventions and several Worldcons.

Our Special Guest of Honor is Peter Hamilton. Peter is a rising British SF author, who has gained a following in the US for his Night's Dawn series — The Reality Dysfunction, The Neutronium Alchemist, and The Naked God. Warner Aspect will be publishing his next novel in hardcover around Lunacon, and they are bringing him over for a five city publicity tour, with Lunacon as his first stop.

Our Toastmistress is Roberta Rogow. When she isn't at work as a Children's Librarian in New Jersey, she is a published writer with four mysteries and a guide to fan slang to her credit, a master filk-singer, and a devoted long-time fan of SF and fantasy, active in local fan groups.

We're delighted to have them as our guests, and we think you'll be delighted to meet them.

Programming

At each Lunacon, we try to offer to you as wide and diverse a selection of topics in our programming. We actively seek out program participants who will be of the utmost interest to you. Starting with our Guests of Honor, we try to gather together authors, artists, members of the publishing field and related media, and the scientific community as well as knowledgeable fans to entertain and enlighten you with their vast amounts of knowledge in their respective areas of expertise.

There will be panels, workshops and demonstrations covering many topics in the fields of science

fiction, fantasy, horror, gaming, science, filking, comics, costuming, art, literature, computers, along with readings, speeches and multi-media presentations. Come pick up hints on how to get your artwork seen or that story sold by meeting and talking to the pros. Once again, we'll be running our late night "Programming After Dark" tracks.

Rocky Horror

Since its original release, *The Rocky Horror Picture Show* has become a cult classic, and a staple of late night showings at local theaters. As a special event on Friday to commemorate the 25th Aniversary of the production, Lunacon will be holding a Midnight Showing of *Rocky Horror*. If you haven't seen it before, give yourself a treat. If

you have seen it, come as your favorite Rocky character, and help recreate the atmosphere that made the midnight show at the local theater a weekly destination for a generation of Rocky Horrar fans.

Please, no lighters, no water, and bring your own toast.

Masquerade

The Lunacon 2002 Masquerade will be held on Saturday night. It will start with a division for young fans (12 & under). These costumes can be made by the children themselves or by adults (Praise to Mommyl). A panel of experts using a system based on skill levels will judge adult costumers. These divisions are Novice, Journeyman, Craftsman and Master level. Photographs will be taken and made available for order on Sunday. Fan photographers are welcome as well.

Any costumes that include weapons of any kind have to receive prior approval of the Masquerade Director. Check the Lunacon Weapons Policy below. We openly encourage hall costumes with the following provisos. Nudity is NOT a costume and if your

costume is a bit revealing, we ask that you cover yourself in the public areas of the hotel which include the lobby, the restaurants and the bar. Panels on costuming and related topics will be included in the programming.

Masquerade registration will be done on-site only commencing sometime Friday and ending Saturday at 3 PM. Rules and entry forms should be picked up as early as possible at the Masquerade Registration table. If you require further information, an advance copy of the rules or wish to graciously volunteer your services, you can write to any of the Convention addresses marking it Attention: Masquerade or visit our Lunarian 2002 website at www.lunacon.org/masquerade.html.

Weapons Policy

NO WEAPONS OF ANY KIND ARE PERMITTED! reserve the right to refuse registration to anyone with a weapon in his or her possession. Anyone caught carrying a weapon during the convention will have his/her registration revoked immediately without a refund. A weapon considered to be anything that is classified as a weapon under New York State law, anything designed to cause bodily injury or any replica of such an object, and anything deemed by the Committee to be dangerous. This includes any type of toy weapon. The Committee reserves the right to amend this definition of a weapon and to impound weapons for the duration of the convention. If your actions or behavior interferes with the other attendees' enjoyment of the Convention, this will result in revoking of your membership without refund. If you have any questions, feel free to ask us.

Costumers take note of the above and remember as stated earlier, permission from the Masquerade Director is required to use a weapon in your presentation. Also, if you receive permission, transportation of the weapon to and from the Masquerade requires that it be carried in an opaque container such as a paper bag or black trash sack.

Art Show & Print Shop

Lunacon has long had one of the finest science fiction and fantasy art shows on the East Coast. With Artist Guest of Honor James Gurney's Dinotopia being prepared as a Hallmark TV miniseries, we can't wait to see what he'll be bringing to exhibit at the con. Bat as regular Lunacon attendees know, Jim is one of the many fine SF and Fantasy artists who regularly attend and exhibit at Lunacon.

Along with 120 panels of original art by both professional and amateur artists, we'll have our usual large Print Shop, where you can pick up inexpensive reproductions of that original piece you can't quite afford.

If you want to enter your art into the show, please send us a letter at the Convention P.O. Box, marked "Attn.: Art Show". (If you've exhibited or inquired within the last three years, you're already on the list).

Animè

As before, Lunacon's Anime Video Program will feature a mix of your old favorites, current translations and the most recent releases to entertain you. All Japanese videos shown will be dubbed, subtitled in English, or have a running commentary provided by a narrator. Since we strive to get the newest videos possible, we cannot at this time provide you with what will be shown. Upon arrival at the Con, consult your Pocket Program for scheduled showings.

Book Exhibit & Raffle

Would you like to go home with a treasure trove of the latest books

by your favorite authors? You can by participating in Lunacon's Book Raffle. It features a vast selection of the latest tomes in the genres of SF and Fantasy. Publishers donate the latest books by well-known authors as well as games, software and magazine subscriptions.

Purchasing a ticket or two might send you home with the goodies, but it also goes to a worthy cause. All funds collected are donated to the Lunarians' Donald A. and Elsie B. Wollheim Memorial Scholarship Fund. This helps beginning SF and Fantasy writers residing in the NY metropolitan area attend the Clarion or Clarion West science fiction and fantasy writers' workshops by covering their fees. The late Chris Steinbrenner was the long time Director of Film for New York City independent TV station WOR. For many years, he came to Lunacon, held a legendary cocktail party, and brought along some of his library of classic SF, Fantasy, and Horror films for the enjoyment of the fans.

To honor his memory, Lunacon is holding a memorial film festival, featuring classic films from the golden age. We'll provide a TV, VCR, and the films. You tell us what you would like to see. Maybe it's a classic you haven't seen in years. Maybe it's something you've heard about but have never seen. Whatever it is, we can probably provide it for your enjoyment.

Child Care

Hotel Information

Lunacon '02 will take place at the Rye Town Hilton, 699 Westchester Ave., Rye Brook, NY, in Westchester County, just north of New York City. The Rye stop on Metro-North's New Haven line is the closest train station. The hotel offers two restaurants, an indoor pool, a health club, plenty of parking and, we have been told, rooms.

You may register using the link we've provided on our website, or by phoning the hotel at 1-914-939-6300. Be sure to mention Lunacon to receive our special room rates.

Special room rates (per night) for Lunacon are: \$107 for a Single, \$113 for a Double (one king-size bed) or Twin (two double beds), \$125 for a Triple or Ouad (two double beds); these rates do not include taxes. There are also a limited number of suites available. If you are interested in one, please write Lunacon - not the hotel - as soon as possible. Please contact us if you want a suite. All room rates are noncommissionable, and quoted exclusive of appropriate state and local taxes applicable at the time of the convention In Westchester County, these taxes are currently 6 3/4 % sales tax plus a 3% room tax for all rooms.

The hotel accepts American Express, Visa, MasterCard, Carte Blanche, Diners Club and Discover cards. When registering, you may request smoking or non-smoking floors, party or non-party areas.

Under New York State law, no one under the age of 18 may rent a room. An exception may be made if an adult accepts responsibility for all costs associated with the room in a signed and dated letter that includes a photocopy of

both sides of a major credit card.

There are several places to eat in the area, and stores to supply all your needs.

Directions

By Car

From the South:

Take I-87, or the Hutchinson River Pkwy, or the Saw Mill River Pkwy north to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expwy) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester Ave. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance;

...or take I-95 North to Exit 21, Rye. Go on I-287 to Exit 10 ((Bowman Ave./ Webb Ave.). Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance.

From the North:

Take I-95 south to Exit 21 (Rye, Cross Westchester Expwy). Go west on I-287 to Exit 10. Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance;

...or take I-87, or the Merritt Pkwy, or the Saw Mill River Pkwy, or I-684 south to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expwy) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester Ave. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance.

From West of the Hudson River:

All major highways intersect with I-87. Go east on I-87/I-287 over the Tappan Zee Bridge and stay on I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expwy) and continue as above under "From the South".

Via Rail

Take the Metro-North New Haven Line Local from Grand Central Station to the Rye station. The hotel will be running a complimentary shuttle service to and from the station, coordinated with the train schedule.

The #13 Westchester bus runs from the Port Chester Station and the hotel. Check with the Westchester Dept. of Transportation at 1-914-682-2020 for the latest schedules and fares.

A taxi from the train station to the hotel is currently about \$10.

Buses are available from various points in Westchester and the Bronx. For current fares and schedules, contact the Westchester Dept. of Transportation at 1-914-682-2020.
