Affiliated with the World Science Fiction Convention, NASFiC is held whenever the WSFC is outside of North America (this year, Australia). The convention includes hundreds of authors, artists, and filmmakers as speakers; an art show; a dealers room; films; costume competition; dances; parties and more. And the way a lot of aspiring directors, writers, and actors get noticed today is through short films entered into film contests and festivals.

We accept entries in 16mm and on VHS video tape (NTSC format only), to be judged by a panel of working TV and motion picture producers, writers, and directors, with prizes and screenings at the convention for the winners. Rules: Films must arrive no later than 15 July 1999 to be eligible. Films must be no more than 30 minutes in length and either science fiction, fantasy, or horror in theme. Comedy or drama, it still must be of the appropriate genre. An entry fee of \$15 must be included (make checks out to NASFiC), along with the filmmaker's name, address, and phone number.
