
Take MAX - there's a stop right there, and no parking to speak of.

<u>Light Rail</u> - possibly the most pleasant way of getting downtown from the hotel. There are light rail (MAX) stops just east & west of the hotel on Holladay.

Fares and transfers are interchangeable with the bus. Buy fares from the machine at the stop before boarding MAX. Minimum cash fare is 85c; that gets you 90 min. of unlimited train/bus travel anywhere within 2 zones. (i.e. anywhere this side of Vancouver, Lake Oswego, or 90th.) Other options: \$2.50 goes anywhere for 24 hours. \$5 buys ten tickets, each good one hour/one zone (OryCon to downtown).

Or ride it free on the downtown side of the river!

Weekends, MAX runs roughly every 15-30 minutes from 6am- midnight. There are schedules in Hospitality (also bus map and book of bus schedules -- for viewing only!)
