# Restaurant and Services Guide

Restaurant listings are grouped by location: in **Jantzen Beach** shopping mall; **West** or **East** of I-5; **South** (by Delta Park); or in **Vancouver**. Non-restaurants like the liquor store and Safeway are all listed together at the end. Vancouver and the southern area are not within walking distance; the others are, depending on you. Traffic here is dangerous for both cars & pedestrians; be very careful.

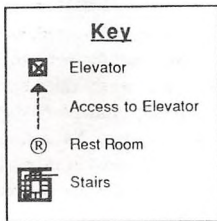
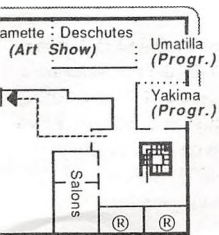
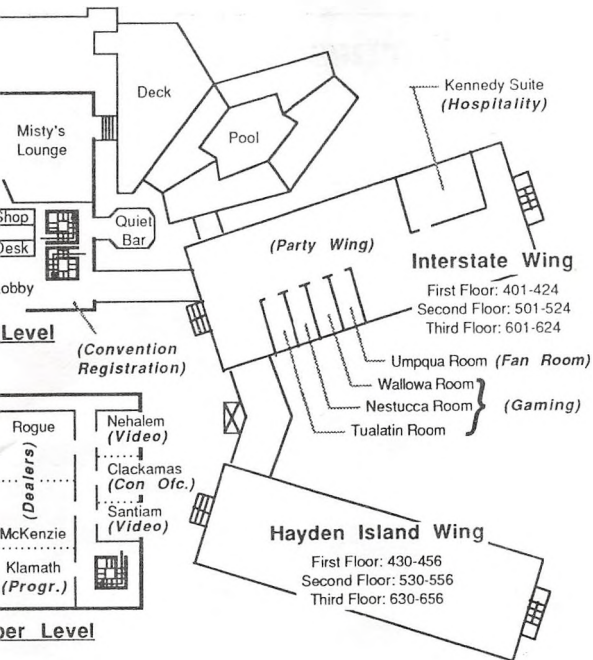
