





Listings are grouped by location: Hayden Island, Portland, and Vancouver. Non-smoking sections are available in all restaurants in Oregon larger than a certain size. Services are listed at the end of each section. We recommend that you make reservations for any restaurant that isn't fast-food, pizza, or a Denny's clone, especially if you have a big group. Phone numbers are Oregon unless specified. If you don't see the restaurant you want in this listing, ask me. Space considerations limited the list, but I got a million of 'em.

HAYDEN ISLAND

You are on Hayden Island, an island in the Columbia River. Any restaurant or store on Hayden Island is within walking distance for most, but walk carefully; traffic is heavy. People with children may want to drive to Hayden Island locations because of the traffic. The only way to access Hayden Island is Interstate-5. I-5 North takes you to Vancouver, and I-5 South takes you into Portland. If you only have an hour to eat, you should probably stay on the island.

There are three main areas for food on Hayden Island: Jantzen

Beach Mall, West of I-5, and East of I-5.

Jantzen Beach Mall

The mall is W of I-5, just SW (across the street) of the con hotel. This is an ordinary mall, without the fancier stores that you'll find downtown. 
