There are now two fundraising campaigns to raise money for additional therapy for MaryAnn as she continues her long recovery from Powassan: a new Patreon for Charles, a Go Fund Me, and an online auction to be held later in the fall.

Virtual Access Apology

We apologize for the impact that accessibility issues within Airmeet, our platform for Virtual Chicon 8, have had on our members. Thank you to people who have reached out to us about these issues as we launched this week.

The short version of our reply is that you are correct. There are definitely accessibility issues within Airmeet. Some issues we knew about and planned for, some issues are things we recently discovered, and some are things we simply didn't think through all the way.

We knew that whatever platform we chose would have problems. We chose a platform that several of our staff have used before. We had a broad team working on Virtual C8, representing multiple divisions and areas, including our Accessibility Services team. Nonetheless, despite our best efforts, we still missed some pieces. We are continuing to work on various workarounds for known issues. You can see our updated Accessibility Guide here (under the Virtual C8 menu tab) which is everything we know about Accessibility at this moment. We will continue to update it as we learn more.

Frugal Finds, Good Eats, and Bookstores Galore

Tired of Lembas Bread and... more Lembas Bread?

Are you looking for a good place to eat or grab a snack between panels and activities? You may want to try out one of the establishments below, recommended by fellow Chicon 8 attendees!

"Most of the eating establishments in the lower level are closed after 4 and on Sundays. A great place to eat almost anytime is Bockwinkel's at 222 North Columbus Drive. They are open every day until 11 pm. Deli salads start at \$4.99 a pound and sandwiches at \$6.99. In addition, there are vegan items and microwaveable entries. Just go out the Stetson exit, turn right, and you will see it across the street. Watch out for pigeons!" (Suzan Spitzberg)

"In a sea of Dunkin' shops (nearly as many as Boston), Chicago local chain Stan's Donuts stands out as a wicked spot for fresh breakfast sandwiches, coffee, and amazing donuts. The shop on Michigan Avenue (181 Michigan Ave) is a five-minute stroll (0.3 miles, or 0.5 km) from the Hyatt." (Michael Nelson)

"Near Millennium Park, there is an excellent upscale Greek restaurant: Avli's on the Park, 180 N. Field Blvd. They serve lunch & dinner daily. Expensive, but highly recommended." (Laurie Mann)

"The website Big Travel 7 has ranked Cindy's Rooftop, located only half a mile from the Hyatt Regency Chicago, as the best rooftop bar in the U.S." (Steven H Silver)

Bookstores around Chicago

So, you've just finished lunch and you're waiting for the next program to start. What to do, what to do? Well, we all love a good bookstore, don't we?

Geographically Challenged? Take a Convention Tour!

Is this your first Worldcon, or are you feeling a bit lost between the East and West Towers? If so, take a Convention Tour. The first tour that took place today had over 100 participants! We were split into two groups to make things more manageable. Besides seeing the usual spaces (meeting rooms, con suites, and so on), we also found secret escalators, a nook with vending machines, and elevator options.

Upcoming tours are scheduled for Thursday (1 pm, 4 pm, and 7 pm) and Friday (8:30 am, 10 am, 1 pm, and 4 pm). Tours will also be hosted on Saturday and Sunday. 


Night (and Day) Gallery: Highlights from Korshak Collection & Fan Guest Exhibits

Highlight from the Korshak Collection: "Pickman's Model"

This iconic mixed media artwork was created by famed science fiction illustrator Hannes Bok (1914-1964) for H. P. Lovecraft's story "Pickman's Model" (1926). Created in 1950 and published in the December 1951 issue of Famous Fantastic Mysteries, the artwork depicts the canine-like monster painted by Pickman and encountered by the story's narrator in the final room of Pickman's art gallery.



The world premiere of "Pickman's Model" is presented by the Korshak Collection: Illustrations of Imaginative Literature. The collection is on display in the San Francisco Room, just around the corner from the art show, and includes more than 60 illustrations of famous fantasy and science fiction stories.

Highlight from the Fan Guest Exhibit: "Guru" contemplating "Dreams"

See Thomas Kuebler's "Guru" contemplating "Dreams" by Ukrainian artist Serget Poyarkov along with 39 other pieces in "Sharing Our Sense of Wonder: Art from the Collection of Joe Siclari and Edie Stern." It's all on display in the Art Show from Thursday—Sunday in Regency A-B-C (West Tower/Gold Level).



Brief, personal notes about each piece accompany each piece. Here's what our Fan Guests of Honor say about Guru.

Edie: "This 3D piece radiates calm and serenity. It's very curious – people either respond with wild dislike or wild appreciation. I've never seen anyone with a lukewarm response. When I practice yoga at home, I practice it not far from the Guru."

Joe: "We put the Guru in an Exhibit at Boskone a few years ago. The response was immediate and extremely diverse. Some people thought he was just creepy. My son turns him to the wall. Others sought to commune with him. A Boskone attendee brought a chair up to the table and several different people sat with Guru for hours."


