Enclosed with this second issue of the convention bulletin is a postcard questionnaire which is to be filled out and sent beck to the committee as quickly as possible. "e urce you to cooperate with us in this, since we feel that the convention membershio hes a ripht to assist in makine the decisions which will affect ther directly: Io be useful, however, we must have a promst vote.

The first ouestion deels with an attempt to determine how many delegatee we can expect to fttend. Since the Tenth Anniversery Convention will have the lomest registration of any convention, we have no prececients to guide us. We rish to make sure that all conventioneers secure pood accomodations, hence the poll.

For your convenience in choosiry a room, we have once more orinted the rates on the card. (Code: Si-sinale; DoD--double with double bed; DoT--double with trin beds; Su2,Su3, SuDL-suites with two or three roors end deluxe suites.) Since no deposit is necessary, we urge you to make a reservation NCW, even though you are not absolutely certain of being in Chicapo this Fall. You lose nothing-and the convention cammittea gains everything when it is able to shower the hotel manager with a flood of reservations.

The more reservations we recelve, the better service and facilities we will be able to offer, so fill out your card now. You will notice that there has been an increase in some rates. This has occurred since printing of Bulletin \#l, but we are assured that no more price rises are fortheoming.

The second question and one of prave importance, desle with our banauet. With the holiday woekend the ceterera must pay their employees double time for their aer vices, This increesed cost is reflected in the prices asked for banquets. The lowest quotation we have been able to get is $\$ 4.25$ per plate.

Now this is,adnittedly, high. And wo didn't want to accept this quotation without first polling the membarahip. If you would attend the banguet at this cost, we

# Moon Tides Secure Despite Rival <br> <br> Claims

The convention's Moon Camission seys that despite the controversy centering about rival clatms to oroverty on the moon, titles now held by convention members will be defended vig̣orousl.t.

Initiating the squsbble were members of the Bay Area's Eives, Gnomes and Little Ken's Science-Fiction, Chowder and barching Society who laid claja to mining riahts in the territory around the craters Ritter, Sabine and kanners, located in the southweat corner of the Sea of Tranouillity. The Little Men have demanded that the United Nations recognize their claim.

Rising up in protest to the action of the Little Nen was octapenarion Alexander $F$. Victor, inventor of the Victor Talking Machine, who shouted, "Their claim is illegal! Don't be surprised if I take this to the Supreme Court!" Victor went on to say that HE reserves exclusive ripht to disdose of moon property-at $\$ 1,000$ an acre!

Where, you property holders will ask, does the lioon Camission stand in this matter? In such cases, the koon Commisioner maintaina, the UN has no juriediction. The regulation of lunar real estate transactions is not under the authority of terran courts, but remains a speculative problem -- a problem of science-fiction. And as the body now reprem sentinp the largest number of acience-fiction enthusiasts, the convention Loon Commission reaffirms ita position as final authority in lunar disputes.

Mr. Victor's claim, of course, was repudtated at once by the commiasion. That a private individual should hold an exclusive title to a body obviously belonging to the public domain is at once presumptuous and ridiculous.

The claim of the Little Kon is being given more careful consideration, in view of their having explored the diabuted repion in the lilinter of 1951. However in by-pessing the authority of the commission for the UN, the society committed a serious bresch of interplanetary protocol. It is likely--

that the officers of the rroup will be arraipned before the Solar Council, consistine of eminent entities from overy planet in the solar system, when it meets in plenary session at the convention in Aurust.

But all members holding title to moon craters can be assured that the commission wlll do its utmost to insure that their rifhts are not encroached upon. h. are securing the services of the Lunar Protective Patrol to puard against claim jumpers, and you can cooperate by reporting irregularities at once.

In the interests of insuring your claim, we are publishinf on subsequent peqes the craters already assimen, tgether with the number of the momber now holding title. Any renuests for correction, transactions of barter or exchange should be sent in nuintuplicate to the Loon Commissioner for filing.
