BLOOD DRIVE



ALP, CECIL, ALP! NEO-FAN NEEDS RIDE INTO ROCKIES!

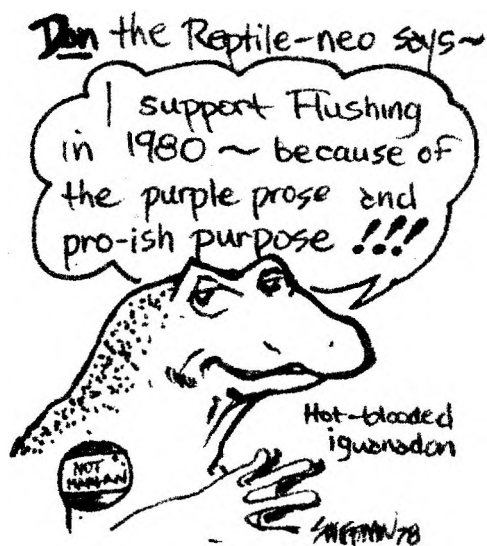
"Neo-fan needs ride to Missoula, Montana area right after con ends. Anywhere around there will help."--Michael Scanlon
