

1980 WorldCon Site Selection Ballot

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

How to Vote

You must be a member of IguanaCon, the 36th World Science Fiction Convention, in order to have your Ballot counted. Each member may vote once, no matter how many memberships that person has in his or her name. In order to insure that only IguanaCon members vote, please indicate your membership number in the space provided, please *print* your name on the indicated line, and sign the registration portion of the Ballot. Failure to provide at least your name and to sign the Ballot will invalidate it, and will be a waste of your money as well, as by voting you are buying a membership in the 38th World Science Fiction Convention. If we don't have a record of you, you aren't a member...

Please make out all checks payable to The 38th World Science Fiction Convention. It takes \$5.00 to vote.

Please note that the 'no preference' selection does not count as having voted in the site selection process, but it does buy a membership in the 1980 WorldCon, no matter where it's held. Each Committee may (and probably *will*) raise the rates on their memberships after the voting is over, and may declare the votes taken during the site selection as only supporting memberships.

You do not have to vote by mail if you do not wish to do so—there will be time for voting at IguanaCon itself. Voting will con-

tinue until 10 PM Saturday, 2 September 1978, or until such time as the bidding committees decide to close down. The site selection table will be located adjacent to the main registration area. After the close of balloting, the votes will be counted by a representative from each bidding committee, a representative from IguanaCon, and a non-partisan fan-at-large. The results of the bidding may be made public immediately after the votes are counted, at the whim of the bidding committees. In any case, the official results will be certified to the Presiding Officer of the Business Meeting. At this time the winning committee can announce whatever details they would like to make public at that time: GoH's, rates, dates, committee structure, whatever.

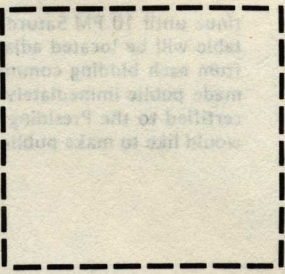
