DONALD A. WOLLHEIM: TRIBUTE

Don Wollheim always liked to make cynical remarks about science fiction and the people in it, but I doubt that anybody ever took that very seriously. Nothing but love could have kept a man there through the long time when it was obscure, impoverished, and widely despised. Nor would a hack have made such great and enduring contributions.

Others in this symposium and at this gathering describe those at length, from the fan beginnings, through the pioneering **Pocket Book of Science Fiction**, Ace, the head start given Terry Carr, DAW, and much, much else. I can simply add that for years Ace Books was damn near the only game in town. Thus it helped mightily in keeping science fiction alive, abiding a happier day in which Don would play a large part himself.

Like John Campbell, at first he was severely restricted not only by a tiny market but by the archaic canons of pulp publishing. Also like Campbell, piece by piece he overcame these. Sure, the old Ace, before the Specials, issued a lot of stuff that was mere entertainment (better entertainment, though, than most of what appears nowadays, especially what pretentiously proclaims itself Literature). But, to name a single example, let us remember that Don was the sole editor then with the guts to give book publication to Fritz Leiber's **The Big Time**.

Some other writers, including me, has their occasional disputes with him. To the best of my knowledge, he never let this affect his decisions about our works, and so he kept us going. Today the differences of opinion look small indeed, while that which he accomplished — both early on and later, when he had a really free hand — stands more big than ever.

Nolacon II, the 46th World Science Fiction Convention, will be held Sept. 1-5, 1988 at the **Marriott** and **Sheraton** Hotels in New Orleans, La.

The hotel rates are, at the **Marriott**: single, \$64; double, \$74; suites, \$186-296. At the **Sheraton**: single, \$62; double, \$75; triple, \$85; quad, \$89; suites, \$215-365. Rates at overflow hotels comparable.

Reservations are accepted only through the World Science Fiction Convention Housing Bureau. Forms available through the worldcon address. Please send a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Memberships are now \$100 at the door, when purchased on 9-1 or 9-2; \$75 on 9-3; on 9-4, \$50; \$25 on 9-5 or by the single day. Kids' memberships of \$25 are available to those under 13 as of 9-5-88. Kids under 7: free. Supporting members may convert to attending by paying the difference between what they have already paid and that day's cost. Credit card payment will be available at registration.

NOLAICON NEWS

MEMBERSHIP

As of July 14, 1988, the cutoff day for preregistration at **Nolacon II**, the membership of the 46th World Science Fiction Convention stood as follows:

HOTELS

Ken Hafer, our Hotel Liaison, reports that the **Marriott** and **Sheraton** hotels have rooms for those arriving on Friday, Sept. 2, but none for those coming in before. If you are arriving before Sept. 2, expect to be placed in one of our overflow hotels: the **Doubletree**, one and a half blocks from the Sheraton, the **Hotel Le Meridien**, half a block from the Sheraton, or the **Monteleone**, directly behind the Marriott. All are depicted on the city map to follow.

Ken emphasizes that people and up in the overflow hotels **only** because of the date of their arrival. **Nolacon** cannot move members from one hotel to another; to request a change, return a copy of your WSFS Housing Bureau. **acknowledgment** to the Housing Bureau (1520 Sugar Bowl Drive, N.O., La. 70112) and make your request on the form.

Again, the Housing Bureau alone makes room reservations, and these must be made on the forms we provide. Send a **quick** self-addressed stamped envelope to the **Nolacon** offices for a copy.

TRAVEL

For special **Nolacon** plane fares, contact **American World Wide Travel** at (201) 696-2545, or contact **Eastern Airlines** at (800) 468-7022, and ask for the convention discounts. Eastern's booking code is EZ9P79. **Continental Airlines** also has convention discounts and a booking code of YZ6746. At this late date, need we advise hurry?

MASQUERADE

Master of the Masque **Drew Sanders** announces that a special award in **Lifetime Achievement in Costuming** will be presented during **The Masque at Nolacon II**. This award will recognize a person whose work has influenced and improved the field. In addition, several of the traditional secondary awards given out at worldcon — the **First Fandom** and **Big Heart Awards**, among others — will be presented before **The Masque**. Master of Ceremonies **Robert Silverberg** will officiate.

PUBLICATIONS

The three previous issues of *Catch a Doubleloon*, mailed to many new members in early August, are now out of print. At **Nolacon II** itself, we expect to distribute no fewer than three publications in your registration packet: **Let the Good Times Roll**, the convention program/souvenir volume, a handsome pocket program now being prepared by **Tony Ubelchor**, and a program guide describing in detail our panels, our films, our city. Plus: freebies and goodies of every sort, all in a beautiful bag provided by **DAW Books**.

Because of time limitations imposed by the publishing schedule of **Let the Good Times Roll**, no membership list appears therein. Though this decision was unavoidable, we realize that many worldcon attendees enjoy finding their names on this list and we do apologize.

MOVIES

More premieres of more new films than have ever graced a worldcon before are being planned for **Nolacon II**, along with a wide range of **SF and fantasy masterpieces**. **Film honcho** **Joey Grillot** reports that special themes will run throughout the movie schedule: "Our Pal George" and "Breakfast Serials" among many others. Since **Nolacon** will have full 16 and 35 mm capability, expect variety — quality — and rarities. A number of studios have promised film exhibits as well, says **Mary Lynn Cahill**, **Nolacon's** liaison with the industry.

In video matters, look for several video rooms at the '88 worldcon, including a 24-hour Japanese animation show courtesy of **NOLA's Krew** of the **Enterprise**.

"The Art Show," says **Elizabeth Pearse**, "is more than full. I'm stretching the walls and hanging things from the ceiling." PRE-REGISTRATION PICKUP

Those of you who are pre-registered must bring either an **address label** from a progress report (showing name and membership number) or a **photo I.D.** to pick up your badge.

MEMBERSHIP TRANSFERS

Before the Convention: Transfer of membership is much easier if you do it **before** the convention. Before the con, all we require is a letter signed by the person holding the original registration stating who his/her membership is being transferred to, plus their name and address. We will then transfer the membership in our computer files and duly file the letter. At the con, that membership will appear under the name of the person who the membership was transferred to — it won't be necessary to inquire under the name of the original membership holder; simply get into the proper line designated for your last name. Membership transfers will be accepted through the mail until

August 1; then you'll have to do it at the convention.

At the Convention: The person to whom the membership is transferred will be required to furnish **three** pieces of documentation:

- A signed letter from the original membership holder identifying the person to whom the membership is being transferred;
- A progress report label showing the name and membership number of the original membership holder;
- A photo I.D. identifying you as the person to whom the membership is being transferred.

LOST BADGES

Anyone who loses his/her membership badge may purchase **ONE** (1) replacement badge at Registration (go to the Trouble Table) for \$25.00. Should the replacement badge be lost, the membership applicable to that badge will be voided and he/she will have to purchase a new membership at the current attending rate.

FAN NAMES

If you have requested that your badge be under a fan name, your badge will be waiting in the line for that fan name (i.e., if John Doe wants his badge to read "Nuclear Winter", he should get it from the "W" line). This sort of arrangement should be made before the con, however, and by letter to the office. If you want your badge to reflect your fan name and we haven't done this before the con, we can do it — but be prepared to make a visit to the Trouble Table, which will mean extra time for you and extra hassle for us.

AT-THE DOOR REGISTRATION

(I.E., NEW MEMBERSHIPS)

- Go to the **New Memberships** line;
- Fill out the card;
- Pay the fee. Cost is \$25.00 per day or \$100.00 for the entire convention. Cash is naturally the best but checks will be accepted with a photo I.D. and one other form of identification (credit card, other photo I.D.). We will also be set up to take credit cards (Master Card, Visa and American Express).
- Pick up your badge and hit the con!

- Staff:** for those of you who arrive on Wednesday, we will have registration materials ready for you at our staff meeting.

HUGO AWARDS

The 1988 Science Fiction Achievement Awards (a/k/a the Hugos) Ceremony will take place at 8:00 PM on Sunday, Sept. 4, in the Grand Ballroom of the Sheraton Hotel. It will be hosted by the warm and witty **Mike Resnick**, Nolacon II's Toastmaster. Thanks to his talent, this year's show will certainly be something special.

Other awards have traditionally been presented during the Hugo ceremony — the John W. Campbell Award, the E.E. Evans big Heart Award, the First Fandom Award, Australia's Pat Terry Award, and so on. Thanks to new policy from the World Science Fiction Society, the worldcon must schedule a secondary award ceremony to see these honors granted. **Nolacon II** will hold this ceremony before The Masque on Saturday night. A special note: Miss **Andre Norton** plans to announce the creation of her **Gryphon Award** for the best first fantasy novel by a female writer at this event!

Children's programming for older children (ages 8 to 12) will be Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of the convention from 10 AM to 5 PM in the Crescent Room of the Marriott Hotel. Children's pocket program will be available from 10 AM Saturday on.

The big event in children's programming will be a live action role playing game from 1 PM to 5 PM on Sunday. Sign-up will be on Saturday. Only children ages 8 to 12 can play, but we need non-player characters who can come in costume, especially those who can play portable musical instruments, to lend groups through the adventure.

Programming for younger children (ages 5 to 7) will be Saturday,

Sunday, and Monday from 10 AM to 5 PM in the Ellendale Room. There will also be a pajama party for this group opposite the Hugo Awards.

Programming for the younger children will include story-telling, sing-alongs, and swimming. Each child should bring a bathing suit and towel, and may bring a soft toy (but no hard toys or toys with more than one piece.)

For the pajama party, each child should bring a light blanket. The party will start one half hour before the Hugo ceremony, and end a half hour after it. Only children 5 to 7 will be admitted. There will be storytelling and singing and then a quiet time. Children will fall asleep on the floor, so when you pick your child up, tip-toe.

No children in diapers will be admitted to children's programming.

SECURITY RULES & PROCEDURES

1. Your **Nolacon II** I.D. badge must be worn at all times in or near con areas. It should be placed conspicuously on the front of the body between hips and head. A member may be asked to re-pin a badge that is obscured, whatever the cause.

2. In no case should any member cover any part of the **name window** of his badge with bid stickets or any other material. Anyone who does so will be denied access to convention areas until the window is cleared.

3. At no con function where a cash bar is set up will outside beverages be permitted.

4. Boisterous behavior is **encouraged** in open areas (to a degree that is the discretion of the staff). **Unruly behavior** is not. Members will be expected to exercise common sense and courtesy in this regard. Members will be expected to maintain a certain decorum when and where called for, i.e. staying reasonably quiet in the movie room, hospitality suite, and so forth. A member who insists on disturbing the convention for his fellow members will be appropriately handled by convention Security.

5. Any person caught engaged in criminal activity of any sort in con areas is subject to detention by Security and arrest by the New Orleans Police Department.

6. Number 5 is gospel.

7. The Nolacon II Weapons Policy (described hereafter) is also gospel and will be strictly enforced.

WEAPONS POLICY

8a. At no time, in any of the convention hotels is the wearing or display of weapons of any sort permitted. Weapons can be worn at the Masquerade through prior arrangement with its Master. Contact **Drew Sanders, 13657 Rayen, Arleta, CA 91331.**

8b. If a member purchases a weapon in the Dealers' Room, be it authentic or not, be it of steel or of polished soap, he must keep it securely wrapped, packaged etc. until he reaches his hotel room, **outside of which it must not be displayed.**

8c. The Chairman of Nolacon II will decide, on an individual basis, the appropriate action to take against violations of this policy.

That's all, really. Please remember these rules are necessary to ensure that you enjoy **Nolacon II** with as little hassle as possible; we have no desire to ruin anybody's weekend. So have fun and remember to let others do so, too. See you at Worldcon!

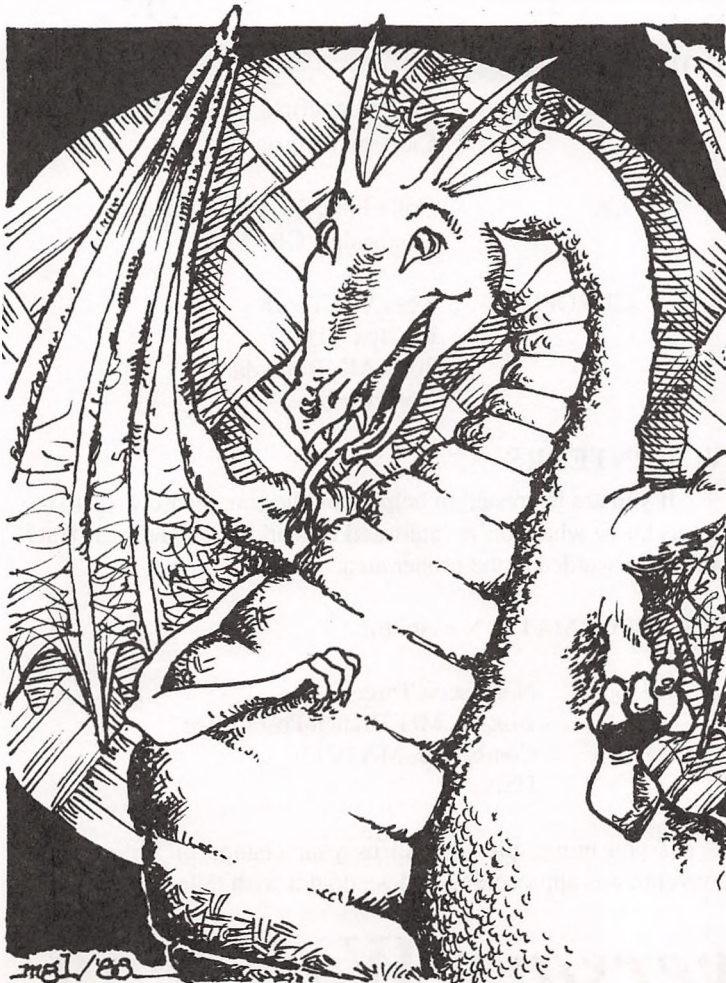

The Fiftieth Anniversary Worldcon

DRIVING TO, PARKING IN, WALKING AROUND NEW ORLEANS

WHERE YOU'LL BE

Unlike the downtown areas of many large American cities, New Orleans has kept its downtown as an active major shopping area. The neighborhood around **Nolacon II** will not be deserted by the natives over Labor Day weekend.

The two main hotels for **Nolacon II**, the Marriott and the Sheraton, face each other across **Canal Street** about two blocks from the Mississippi River. Canal Street was recently declared an historic district, and its classic "Main Street USA" architecture protected. Canal Street has two large department stores and branches of all the national chains you would expect to see in a suburban mall: Radio Shack, B. Dalton and Waldenbooks, Lerner's and Lane Bryant, and lots of shoe stores and jewelry shops. And restaurants. The back of the **Marriott Hotel** opens onto the **French Quarter**, the original grid-work of streets planned in Paris in 1719 for the new French colony. The back of the **Sheraton** opens up onto the **Central Business District (CBD)**, a suddenly-sprouted forest of high-rise hotels, office buildings, the Louisiana Superdome.

FINDING THE CON

Special note to Los Angeles, Houston and Phoenix fandoms: **Nolacon II** couldn't be easier to get to: get on Interstate 10 East and get off at the Poydras exit!

Indeed, if you are approaching the convention by car from the airport or from any area west of the city, follow I-10E to the **Poydras Street/Superdome (234B)** exit. Poydras is the main artery for the CBD. Follow Poydras to **Camp Street**, the ninth traffic light, where you will make a **left turn**. Treat this as the rare and unusual occasion that it is. Left turns are generally prohibited from two-way streets in New Orleans and its suburbs. Three blocks on Camp will bring you to Canal. Turn right for the Sheraton. Cross the intersection for the Marriott and enter their parking area from Chartres Street, which is the name Camp Street changes to across Canal.

If you are approaching the city from the east, follow I-10 West to the **Canal Street/Superdome (235B)** exit. At the end of the exit ramp proceed straight ahead one block to Canal Street and make a right turn onto Canal. From here you can see both the Sheraton and the Marriott straight ahead. The Sheraton is on the right between the eighth and ninth traffic lights. For the Marriott, make a U-turn at the ninth traffic light.

If you are approaching the convention from the south, take US 90 East or state highway 23 to the **West Bank Expressway (US 90 Business East)** and cross the Mississippi on the Greater New Orleans Bridge. Take the **Magazine Street** exit and proceed straight ahead from the ramp onto **Camp Street**. Eight lights will bring you to Canal Street, with the Sheraton to your right and the Marriott directly across the street.

If you are approaching New Orleans from the north, you will find that Interstate 55 joins I-10 west of the city, so you will use the first set of directions above. Same for the folks coming in over Lake Pontchartrain on the Causeway; it meets I-10 in the suburbs, and you should follow the directions for westerners. Interstate 59 joins I-10 east of the city, so you use the second set of directions above.

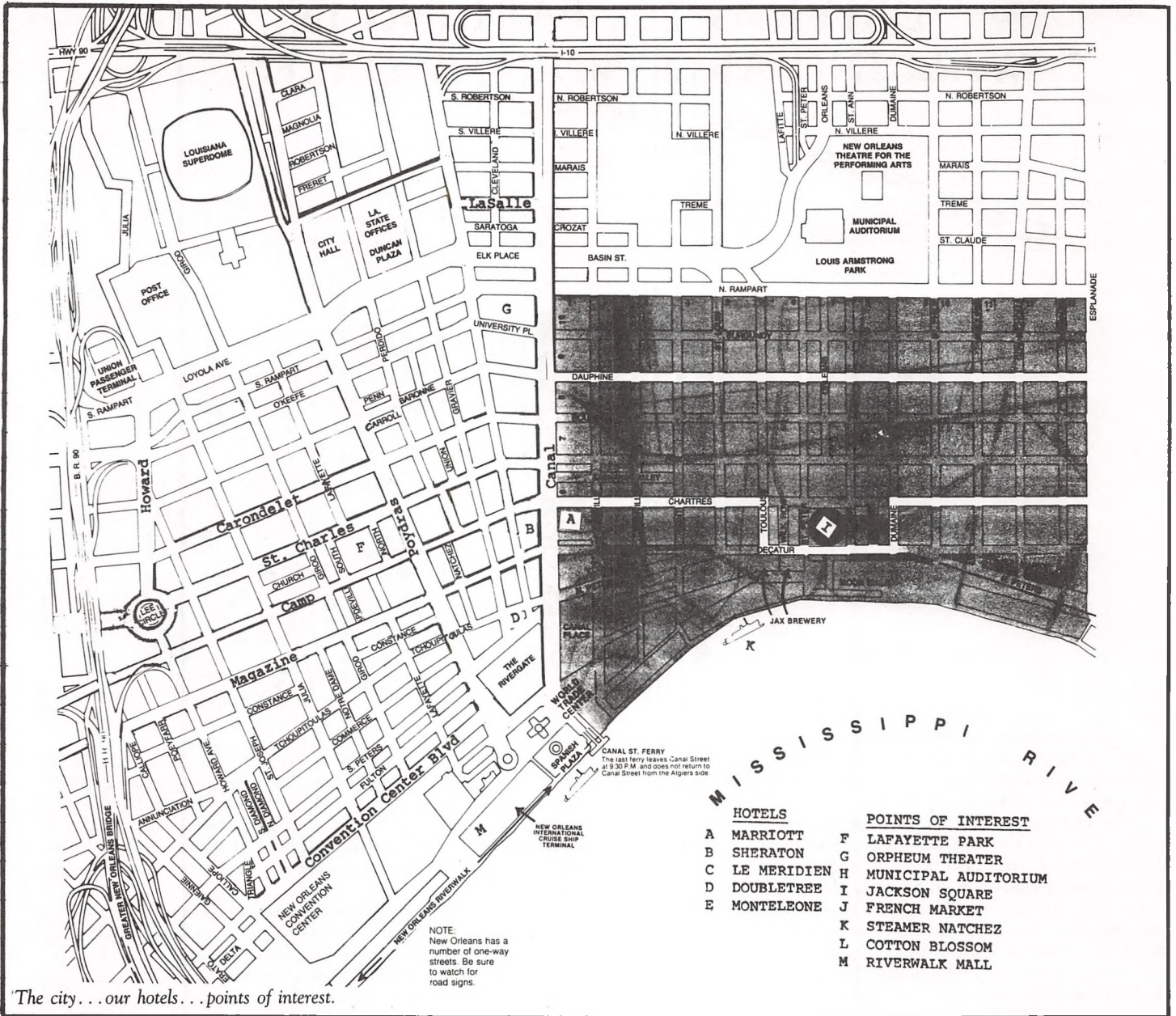
PARKING

Since the area will be busy over the weekend, your best bet for parking is your hotel's lot, although parking for vans and campers is limited. There are also plenty of commercial lots, but check the hours. Some close early. If you park at a meter Monday through Friday, you **must** feed it. Meter maids patrol regularly. Meters are free of charge Saturday, Sunday and Labor Day, but they are still hard to find. It's hardly worth looking for a parking place on the street in the French Quarter. The residents will have beaten you to them.

"OR YOU WILL BE TOWED. . ."

Those meter maids mentioned above have associates with tow trucks. Do not park in a driveway, or you will be towed. Do not park within three feet of a driveway, or you will be ticketed. Do not park within eighteen feet (about one car length) of a corner or a crosswalk, or you will be towed. Do not park on the sidewalks, or you will be towed. (The fine for this is particularly high in the French Quarter.) Do not park in a passenger zone or a taxi zone, or you will be towed. Read the little signs and do not park **anywhere** during street cleaning hours, or you will be towed. Do not park for more than two hours between 7 AM and 7 PM in a designated residential zone, or you will be ticketed. Do not park on the left side of a two-way street or — the same: you will be ticketed.

Parking in freight zones is tricky. If you have commercial insignia



on your vehicle, you're okay for about twenty minutes. If you don't have commercial insignia, but you're obviously unloading a large number of cartons, put a sign in your window ("Unloading at 921 Canal Street", for example) and you'll probably be okay for about twenty minutes. Otherwise, don't park there without checking the hours. Some freight zones are reserved for 24 hours, seven days a week. Some run from 8 AM to 6 PM weekdays, but are open Saturday and Sunday. Some are in between. If you are not unloading during the freight zone hours, parking there will get you towed.

In general, if it looks like a parking place, but is outlined in yellow paint, pass it up. It would probably get you... you guessed it. Nolacon II will have free maps available showing commercial parking lots at the Con Information Desk across from Registration on the second floor of the Marriott. Be sure to pick one up!

TOURING

So now that you've found a parking place, you don't want to give it up. No problem. There is plenty to do within walking distance of the convention. From here on, all directions will be **upstream, downstream, toward the river, and away from the river.** Wedged into a curve of the Mississippi, the Crescent City (nicknamed such just for that reason) doesn't take terms like north, south, east or west too literally.

The **French Quarter** is worth a trip to New Orleans all by itself. World-famous **Bourbon Street** has plenty of bars with either jazz bands or strippers. You can also find Irish folk singing and electric blues. One block closer to the river is **Royal Street**, with its wealth of elegant antique shops.

The heart of the **Vieux Carre** (literally, "Old Quarter") is **Jackson Square**, with its statue of Andrew Jackson, the hero of the Battle of New Orleans. It is flanked by the **Pontalbas**, the first apartment buildings in North America. Behind it is **St. Louis Cathedral**, the first basilica in the **New World**, which itself is flanked by the **Presbytere**, the original church living quarters, and the **Cabildo**, the seat of government when Louisiana was under the rule of Spain. The Presbytere and the Cabildo are now museums, but the Cabildo was, sadly, damaged in a fire last May and will be closed during Nolacon.

Across the street and over the levee from Jackson Square is the **Moonwalk**, where you can sit and watch the river flow. Next door to the Moonwalk is the **Jax Brewery**, recently converted into a shopping mall. The food court on the third floor is terrific. The steamer **Natchez** docks behind the Brewery. Back out front, if you walk downstream (but don't miss the **Cafe du Monde** on your way) you will come to the **French Market**, a lively produce and flea market, especially on weekends. One block away from the river is the neighborhood known as **Downtown Decatur Street**, with its own set of antique shops,

somewhat more casual and funky than the ones on Royal. Throughout the French Quarter you can see carefully preserved architecture: the balconies, the decorative cast iron, the carriage gates through which you can peek into beautiful courtyards. And there is a restaurant on nearly every corner.

MORE TOURING

There will be a new streetcar line operating by the weekend of **Nolacon II**. The red cars of the Riverfront line will run along the levee starting at the end of the French Market at Decatur and Esplanade. They will follow the river to Canal Street and go pat it to the **Riverwalk** (more on that in a minute). Fare is sixty cents, exact change.

Back up at Canal Street, there is all the shopping you could ask for, both in the few blocks walk away from the river, and in **One Canal Place**, a mall located towards the Mississippi from the convention hotels. It has an excellent food court. Be sure to walk up to one of the green street lamp poles on Canal and read it. At the foot of Canal Street is the ferry, for both auto and pedestrian traffic. The free ride is lovely, especially at night. Upstream from the ferry landing is the **Spanish Plaza**, a gift to the city from the government of Spain. The *Cotton Blossom* docks there. Upstream from the Spanish Plaza is the **Riverwalk**, a shopping mall located in some of the buildings from the 1984 World's Fair. It also has a fine food court.

The **St. Charles Streetcar** is the oldest continuously running railroad in the United States. Catch its green cars at Canal Street and Carondelet, two blocks away from the river on the Sheraton side of the street. The fare is sixty cents to the end of the line and another sixty back (exact change, of course). (The end of the line is the intersection of S. Carrollton and S. Claiborne — remember what I told you about directions and don't worry about it.) On the streetcar route you will pass **Lee Circle**, with its statue of General Robert E. Lee, beautiful old homes, **Tulane** and **Loyola Universities**, and **Audubon Park**. If you get off at the Park and walk through it towards the river, you'll find the **Audubon Park Zoo**, also accessible by riverboat. When you leave the Zoo, you can catch the Magazine Street bus, also sixty cents, and avoid walking all the way back across the park. The bus will leave you off at Canal and Camp Streets, which is where we came in, next to the Sheraton.

And the best part is that you can do all of this without moving your car.

THE STREETS

If you find yourself driving around town to go to some of our fine restaurants or to go shopping or visiting, you will find that most of the major streets have wide medians, locally called "neutral grounds", many of which are beautifully cultivated. The responsibility for maintaining many of these areas has been assumed by local businesses, whose names you will see on the purple, green and gold (Mardi Gras colors) signs posted in each block.

Natives don't expect to be able to turn left from a two-way street, especially from one busy street to another. The usual solution is to make a right, then a U-turn, or to go past, then make a U-turn and a right turn. If there is no "No Left Turn" sign and you are on a divided street, you can make a left, but you are expected to stop at the red light for the street you are about to be on. The peculiar-looking sign that reads "Left turn permitted on green" merely means that you do it like the normal situation in the rest of the world: when the oncoming traffic clears, you turn and drive.

You may also run into the equally odd-looking "Left Lane for Left Turn" sign, which does not mean "Left Lane Must Turn Left" but "No Left Turn from the Right Lane". The left lane does not end on the other side of the intersection. You usually aren't warned about that. If there is a lane that every other driver is getting out of, you should probably depart it, too. They probably know that lane is ending because they've been riding down that street since they were little. And since they know the lane ends, they don't need a sign to tell them.

All the streets in the French Quarter and most of those in the CBD are one-way. The streets in the Quarter are also very narrow, because they are very old. New Orleans may be one of the only cities in the country with streets made from imported French paving stones. The stones and bricks under the asphalt were ballast in the French

sailing ships that docked here. The French names of the avenues are still on the French Quarter street signs and the Spanish names are in title on the sides of many corner buildings.

So come on down, park the car, and wander. You'll find New Orleans a lovely place for a walk.

AN APPENDIX FOR FANS ARRIVING WITHOUT AUTOMOBILES

FROM THE AIRPORT

If you are arriving in New Orleans at the airport, you have four choices of transportation to get to the downtown hotels where **Nolacon II** is being held. You can take a taxi, the airport shuttle, the bus, or you can rent a car, there are signs in the airport directing you to Interstate 10 East. Once you're on it, follow the directions given in the article above.

Of the other choices, a taxi is the quickest and most direct. It costs \$18.00 for one, two, or three people, \$6.00 per person for four or five people. Taxis are available 24 hours a day. Catch them outside the first or second level of the terminal.

The shuttle is run by Rhodes Airport Shuttle Service. Their desk is on the second level of the terminal, near concourse C. The cost is \$7.00 per person. No reservations are necessary, and it leaves every 15 minutes to all the downtown hotels. Slightly less convenient than a taxi, the shuttle is also less expensive for one or two people. It runs from 4:30 AM until the last flight has arrived every night.

Least expensive, but also the most tiring and time-consuming is the bus. The "Airport-Downtown Express" is operated by Jefferson Transit. Catch it outside the terminal on the second level. It costs \$1.10, exact change, no bills. It runs from 5:30 AM to 5:40 PM, every 20 minutes (every 10-12 minutes at peak hours), and takes you to downtown New Orleans and lets you off at the Main Library, at the corner of Tulane Avenue and Elk Place. From here you cross the street toward the Eye and Ear Clinic, and keep going two short blocks. On the median of Canal Street catch any bus marked "Canal," except the express, that's heading to your right (toward the river). This second bus will cost sixty cents, exact change, but you can use dollar bills if paying for two or more fares together. You only have to ride seven blocks to get to the Sheraton and Marriott.

If you catch the airport bus after 5:40 PM, and until the last one leaves at 11:30 PM, it will only cost eighty cents, but it will only take you as far as Tulane Avenue and Carrollton Avenue. From there you will have to catch the RTA bus marked "Tulane." Catch it across the street on the corner by the motel. Pay sixty-five cents and get a transfer. Again, that's exact change, but dollar bills are accepted for multiple fares. When you get to Canal Street, use your transfer to take any "Canal" bus, except the express, to the hotels.

FROM THE TRAIN AND BUS STATION

Amtrak trains and **Greyhound** and **Trailways** buses use the same terminal in downtown New Orleans, about 20 blocks from the Marriott and Sheraton. From here you have two transportation choices, a taxi or a bus.

If you take a taxi, the fare will be about \$3.00-\$4.00 with twenty-five cents extra for each person more than one. Taxis are available 24 hours per day.

Or you can catch the "South Claiborne via ML King" bus across the street in front of the building marked 1000 Howard. This bus runs 24 hours. Pay sixty-five cents and get a transfer. You must have exact change, but you can use dollar bills if paying for more than one fare together. When you get to Canal Street (by Loew's Theater), go out to the median and catch any "Canal" bus, except the express, that's going toward the river (to your right). Use your transfer and ride six blocks to the hotels.

If you have not yet submitted a Nolacon II Medical Questionnaire, offered in our last two progress reports, please be sure to visit our Access Office at the convention. This Medical Questionnaire is a way to get information about you, if you're unconscious. It's a way to file information with Nolacon II's Access Department, information which could, in an emergency (when seconds count) save your life. Your condition, medications taken, and medication allergies will be noted on a sticky label, which you can then affix to the back of your membership badge. Reading it, Go-fers might be able to tell whether they should call your roommate — or an ambulance.

A.S.F.A. PRINT SHOP GUIDELINES

The ASFA Print Shop at Nolacon II will be held as an adjunct to the main Art Show. All general rules of the Art show (i.e. no cameras, hours of operation) shall apply.

The purpose of the Print Shop is to permit artists to offer for sale at a fixed price multiple reproductions of their original art work.

Items offered for sale in the Print Shop may not also be offered for sale/auction on display panels in the main Art Show. An original piece may be offered in the show/auction and reproductions of that piece may be offered in the print shop. A print may be placed on an artist's panel as a NFS item with a note indicating availability in the print shop.

Every artist submitting work for sale in the print shop or their designated agent must agree to work for two hours in the print shop. Sign-up sheets will be provided at check-in for choice of times. The Art Show will not be providing manpower for the print shop — it's up to us! **No mail-in entries will be accepted!** We haven't the staff or structure to deal with them.

Every piece placed in the print shop must be clearly identified with Artist's Name, Title of Piece, and Price easily readable. Title and price may be on the back of the piece.

If you enter more than one format (matted and unmatted, various sizes) of an image, each format must be treated as a unique item and so identified on separate lines on the control sheet.

There will be a 10 per cent commission charged on pre-tax sales from the print shop. This commission will be split between the Nolacon II Art Show and ASFA.

Check-in

Artists and Print Shop staff will check in art work. The control sheet is to be filled out as follows:

Use only the NCR three-part forms. Do **not** make your own photocopies. The artist/agent shall fill out: Artist and/or agent/owner information; "Check Payable To" line; the title (and other necessary description); the number entered; the price to charge.

The print shop staff member will check the quantity entered and both the artists and staff will initial the "Checked In By:" space.

Check-Out

The print shop staff and artist shall count the pieces remaining and net against the tally sold. Any discrepancies shall be noted. The artist and staff member shall initial the "Checked Out By:" space.

EATING AND/OR DINING IN NEW ORLEANS

George Alec Effinger

There were two things that persuaded me almost twenty years ago to pick up and move from New York to New Orleans, even though at the time I didn't know a soul in the South and could barely find my way around my newly adopted city. The first thing was the weather. I grew up in Cleveland, Ohio, and I've shoveled enough snow to last me the rest of my life. I like the climate in New Orleans. If you keep track during the summer, you'll realize that it doesn't get any hotter here than it does in New York, Washington, or, yes, Cleveland. But the winters are much milder, and I can virtually guarantee that you won't need coats or sweaters at Nolacon II.

The second thing that made me fall in love with the city was the food. Let's talk about that for a little bit, because lately there have been fads for Louisiana food and food products all around the country, and this sudden interest has created an awful lot of confusion. The media have been no help. Judging from films like *The Big Easy* and others like it, people probably think we all sit around chatting in French and listening to Cajun music in New Orleans. Uh uh, not so's you'd notice.

The word "Cajun" is greatly misunderstood, as is the word "Creole." And, as both terms are used to identify one of the contributing influences in New Orleans cuisine, it will be useful to define them here at the beginning.


A Creole, according to the dictionary, is a pure-blooded descendant of the original French or Spanish colonists of the Louisiana Territory. There are not, therefore, very many true Creoles around anymore. That doesn't stop an awful lot of people from claiming that they are, in fact, Creoles. The term has become so devalued that it means about as much as "Kentucky Colonel." Creole cuisine, however, is a legitimate and rather precise category of Louisiana cooking. It is derived from classic Continental cuisine, but it has been shaped by the addition or substitution of ingredients found locally or brought to Louisiana from African and Caribbean sources. It is, therefore, not a single ethnic style, but a successful combination of several varied

influences. I think tomatoes and tomato-based sauces play a more important role in Creole food than in Cajun, although some people might argue. Creole food is not generally hot, but it is often spicy. You should understand the difference between the two right now. People who've grown up on brown-and-white food (you know what that is, and you know who you are) sometimes think that spicy means hot, but there are plenty more spices in the New Orleans arsenal besides cayenne pepper.

Cajun food is the food of the ethnic Cajuns, of course, and it comes from Southwestern Louisiana. You probably won't run into many Cajuns in New Orleans. Forget Hollywood. We don't drink a lot of mint juleps here, either. Anyway, Cajun food is country food, sometimes inferior to Creole cooking in what some people might call "elegance," but surpassing it in heartiness and gusto. The heart of Cajun cooking is what Paul Prudhomme, one of New Orleans' celebrity chefs, calls the "holy trinity": chopped celery, onion, and green pepper. Cold beer was invented to wash down Cajun food.

And then there's typical New Orleans food, which is the kind of thing we eat every day. It's a unique blend of many ethnic influences, because New Orleans, as a port city, has always been as successful a melding of nationalities as, say, New York City. So a good, solid New Orleans restaurant (as opposed to a predominantly Creole or Cajun restaurant) might offer a mixture of dishes from both those specialties, plus Italian, Greek, German, and who knows what-all. And we don't neglect more recognizable dishes, either. New Orleans has three, not one but three of the best cheeseburgers I've ever had anywhere in the U.S.

We'll go into more detail with the restaurant guide that will be included with your registration packet, but it might be a good idea to start getting your taste buds in gear now. Get ready for food that tastes like something. You can always get brown-and-white food when you go back home.

WSFS RULES & BUSINESS BROUGHT FORWARD

The World Science Fiction Society meets annually at the worldcon. These Standing Rules will be used to discuss the "Business Brought Forward" Business Meeting at Nolacon II.

Standing Rules for the Governance of the World Science Fiction Society Business Meeting

- Rule 1:** Business of the Annual Meeting of the World Science Fiction Society shall be transacted in one or more sessions called Preliminary Business Meetings and one or more Main Business Meetings. The first session shall be designated as a Preliminary Business Meeting. At least eighteen (18) hours shall elapse between the final Preliminary Business Meeting and the one or more Main Business Meetings. One Business Meeting session shall also be designated the Site-Selection Meeting where site-selection business shall be the special order of business.
- Rule 2:** The Preliminary Business Meetings may not pass, reject, or ratify amendments to the Constitution, but the motions to "object to consideration", to "table", to "divide the question", to "postpone" to a later part of the Preliminary Business Meetings, and to "refer" to a committee to report later in the same Annual Business Meeting are in order when allowed by *Robert's Rules*. The Preliminary Business Meetings may alter or suspend any of the rules of debate included in these Standing Rules. Motions may be amended or consolidated at these Meetings with the consent of the original maker. Absence from these Meetings of the original maker shall constitute consent to amendment and to such interpretations of the intent of the motion as the Presiding Officer or the Parliamentarian may in good faith attempt.
- Rule 3:** Nominations from the floor for election to the Mark Registration and Protection Committee shall be allowed at each Preliminary Business Meeting. All nominees must be members of the Society and give their consent in writing, which consent shall be submitted to the Presiding Officer. Elections to the Mark Registration and Protection Committee shall be a special order of business at a Main Business Meeting. Voting shall be by written preferential ballot with write-ins allowed. The winning candidate shall be elected to the longest-term remaining vacancy and the ballots shall be recounted, with the winning candidate eliminated, if there are further vacancies. This process of selection and elimination shall be repeated until all vacancies are filled. Tied candidates shall all be considered elected if there are enough vacancies of the same length to accommodate them. Other ties shall be settled by drawing lots.
- Rule 4:** The deadline for the submission of non-privileged new business shall be two hours after the official opening of the Worldcon or eighteen hours before the first Preliminary Business Meeting, whichever is later. The Presiding Officer may accept otherwise qualified motions submitted after the deadline, but all such motions shall be placed at the end of the agenda. The Presiding Officer will reject as out of order any proposal or motion which is obviously illegal or hopelessly incoherent in a grammatical sense.
- Rule 5:** Six (6) identical, legible copies of all proposals for non-privileged new business shall be submitted to the Presiding Officer before the deadline given in Rule 4 above. All proposals or motions of more than seventy-five (75) words shall be accompanied by at least one hundred (100) additional identical, legible copies for distribution to and intelligent discussion by the Meeting attendees unless they have actually been distributed to the attendees at the Worldcon by the Worldcon Committee. All proposals or motions shall be legibly signed by the maker and at least one seconder.
- Rule 6:** Any main motion presented to a Business Meeting shall contain a short title.
- Rule 7:** Debate on all motions of less than fifty (50) words shall be limited to six (6) minutes. Debate on all other motions shall be limited to twenty (20) minutes; if a question is divided, these size criteria and time limits shall be applied to each section. Time shall be allotted equally to both sides of a question. Time spent on points of order or other neutral matters arising from a motion shall be charged one half to each side. The Preliminary Business Meeting may alter these limits for a particular motion by a majority vote.
- Rule 8:** Debate on all amendments to main motions shall be limited to five (5) minutes, to be divided as above.
- Rule 9:** Unless it is an amendment by substitution, an amendment to a main motion may be changed only under those provisions allowing modification through the consent of the maker of the amendment, i.e., second-order amendments are not allowed except in the case of a substitute as the first-order amendment.

- Rule 10:** A person speaking to a motion may not immediately offer a motion to close debate or to refer to a committee. Motions to close debate will not be accepted until at least one speaker from each side of the question has been heard, nor will they be accepted within one minute of the expiration of the time allotted for debate on that motion. The motion to table shall require a two-thirds vote for adoption.
- Rule 11:** In keeping with the intent of the limitations on debate time, the motion to postpone indefinitely shall not be allowed.
- Rule 12:** A request for a division of the house (an exact count of the voting) will be honored only when requested by at least ten percent (10%) of those present in the house.
- Rule 13:** Motions, other than Constitutional amendments awaiting ratification, may be carried forward from one year to the next only by being postponed definitely or by being referred to a committee.
- Rule 14:** These Standing Rules, and any others adopted by a Preliminary Business Meeting, may be suspended for an individual item of business by a two-thirds majority vote.
- Rule 15:** The sole purpose of a request for a "point of information" is to ask the Presiding Officer or the Parliamentarian for his opinion of the effect of a motion or for his guidance as to the correct procedure to follow. Attempts to circumvent the rules of debate under the guise of "points of information" or "points of order" will be dealt with as "dilatory motions" as specified in *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised*.
- Rule 16:** Citations to Articles, Sections, or specific sentences of the Society Constitution or Standing Rules are for the sake of easy reference only. They do *not* form a part of the substantive area of a motion. Correct enumeration of Articles, Sections, and Rules and correct insertions and deletions will be provided by the Secretary of the Business Meeting when the Constitution and Standing Rules are certified to the next Worldcon. Therefore, motions from the floor to renumber or correct citations will not be in order. Unless otherwise ordered by the Business Meeting, the Secretary will adjust any other Section of the Constitution and Standing Rules equally affected by an amendment to the Constitution, and will adjust any other section of the Standing Rules equally affected by an amendment to the Standing Rules. Resolutions and rulings of continuing effect may be repealed or amended at subsequent Business Meetings by majority vote without notice, and shall be automatically repealed or amended by applicable amendments to the Constitution or Standing Rules and by conflicting resolutions and rulings subsequently adopted or made. Any correction of fact to the Minutes or to the Constitution or Standing Rules as published should be brought to the attention of the Secretary and to that of the next available Business Meeting as soon as they are discovered.
- Rule 17:** At all sessions of the Business Meeting, the hall will be divided into smoking and non-smoking sections by the Presiding Officer of the Meeting.
- Rule 18:** The World Science Fiction Society Business Meeting is a mass meeting of the Society's membership which the Worldcon is required to sponsor in accordance with the WSFS Constitution and these Standing Rules. Therefore, (1) the quorum is the number of people present and (2) the decisions of the Chair as to who is entitled to the floor are not subject to appeal. The motion to adjourn the Main Meeting will be in order *after* the amendments to the Constitution proposed at the last Worldcon Business Meeting for ratification at the current Business Meeting have been acted upon.
- Rule 19:** If time permits at the Site-Selection Meeting, bidders for the convention one year beyond the date of the Worldcon being voted upon will be allotted five (5) minutes each to make such presentations as they may wish.
- Rule 20:** These Standing Rules shall continue in effect until altered, suspended, or rescinded by the action of any Business Meeting. Amendment, suspension, or rescission of these Standing Rules may be done in the form of a motion from the floor of any Business Meeting made by any member of the Business Meeting, and such action will become effective immediately after the end of the Business Meeting at which it was passed.

Business Passed On to *Nolacon II*

Items 1 through 5 below have been given first passage, and will become part of the Constitution if ratified at *Nolacon II*.

Item 1: Short Title: Business Meeting Quorum

MOVED, to amend the WSFS Constitution and the Standing Rules for the Governance of the WSFS Business Meeting as follows:

1. Add the following to Article IV, Section 4:
"The quorum for the Business Meeting shall be twelve members of the Society physically present."
2. At the time the above amendment to the Constitution takes effect, delete the first two sentences of Standing Rule 18.

This would regularize the quorum requirement for WSFS Business Meetings by placing it in the Constitution as recommended by Robert's Rules. The Standing Rule it replaces is just a stopgap which reflects the consequences of not having a defined quorum.

Item 2: Short Title: Question Time

MOVED, to amend the WSFS Constitution and the Standing Rules for the Governance of the WSFS Business Meeting as follows:

1. Insert the following new section in Article IV of the Constitution:
"Each future selected Worldcon Committee shall designate an official representative to the Business Meeting to answer questions about their Worldcon."
2. At the time the above amendment to the Constitution takes effect, add the following to Standing Rule 19:
"At the Site-Selection Meeting fifteen (15) minutes shall be allotted to each of the three future selected Worldcons. During the first five (5) minutes, their representative may make such presentations as they may wish. The remaining time shall be available for questions to be asked about the representative's Worldcon. Questions may be submitted in writing at any previous session of the Business Meeting and if so submitted shall have priority (if the submitter is present at Question Time and still wishes to ask the question) except that under no circumstances may a person ask a second question as long as any person wishes to ask their first question. Questions are limited to 15 seconds and answers to two minutes. Any of these time limits may be adjusted for any presentation or question by majority vote."

The current practice is for the Worldcon Committee that wins the site selection to have a representative give a short presentation and answer questions. This would extend this practice and provide a mechanism so that questions could be asked of the other future selected Worldcons.

Item 3: Short Title: Broadened Hugo Nominations

MOVED, to amend the WSFS Constitution as follows:

1. In Article II, Section 18, strike "WSFS member" and insert in place thereof "member of either the administering or the immediately preceding Worldcon".
2. Add to Article I, Section 4, the following:
"Within ninety (90) days after a Worldcon, the administering Committee shall, except where prohibited by local law, forward its best information as to the names and postal addresses of all of its Worldcon members to the Committee of the next Worldcon."

This motion revives the former practice of allowing members of a Worldcon to nominate Hugo award winners for the following Worldcon. They would not be permitted to vote in the final Hugo award selection unless they join the administering Worldcon. The phrase "except where prohibited by local law" was inserted at Conspiracy '87 when it was thought that such information transfer might be prohibited by the British "Data Protection Act 1984". However, a study of this Act, which is intended to control computerized data, shows that it does not apply to any data printout unless the printout was made with the intent of re-entering or re-computerizing the data. Since such a printout would be sufficient to validate Hugo nominations from members of the previous Worldcon, there are no known cases where local law would obstruct the operation of these provisions.

Item 4: Short Title: NASFiC Selection Amendment

MOVED, to amend the WSFS Constitution as follows:

1. In Article III, Section 4, strike "no later than the end of the calendar year before voting" and insert in place thereof "as set by the administering convention but no earlier than the close of the corresponding Worldcon voting".

2. In Article III, Section 6, strike the words "either by mail or" and the words "before the calendar year in which selection occurs".

This motion eliminates the unworkable NASFiC mail ballot and delays the final deadline for filing NASFiC bids until after the bids could affect Worldcon voting. The need for these adjustments comes from some drafting difficulties that arose from a change in NASFiC voting lead time to three years when it had been expected to stay at two years.

Item 5: Short Title: Availability of Supporting Membership

MOVED, to amend the WSFS Constitution by substituting the following for Article I, Section 5:

"Members of WSFS who cast a site-selection ballot with the required fee shall be supporting members of the selected Worldcon. The rights of supporting members of a Worldcon include the right to receive all of its generally distributed publications. Voters have the right to convert to attending membership in the selected Worldcon within ninety (90) days of its selection, for an additional fee set by its committee. This fee must not exceed the minimum voting fee and not exceed the difference between the voting fee and the fee for new attending members. The rights of attending members of a Worldcon include the rights of supporting members plus the right of general attendance at said Worldcon and at the WSFS Business Meeting held thereat. Other memberships and fees shall be at the discretion of the Worldcon committee, except that they shall make provision for persons to become supporting members for no more than 125% of the site-selection fee, or such higher amount as has been approved by the Business Meeting, until a cutoff date no earlier than ninety (90) days before their Worldcon."

PROVIDED, that the requirement to provide supporting memberships shall only affect Worldcons selected after it goes into effect.

Most of the text of this amendment is a rewording of the present provisions to try and make them clearer. The only substantive change is in the last sentence, which requires that supporting memberships continue to be available until 90 days before a Worldcon at a limited price. The first Worldcon affected would be the 1992 Worldcon.
