TICKETS AND ADMISSIONS

Where restrictions exist, they are mentioned below. Day members have all the privileges of full members for that day, except that they may not vote at the Business Meeting.

Please WEAR YOUR BADGE AT ALL TIMES, since we will have guards checking membership for admission to items; please also cooperate with the guards.

RULES -- PLEASE READ

We have several rules we'd like everyone to follow, mostly based on common sense. Please read them, and try to follow them:

Smoking: There will be no smoking in the *Hynes Auditorium*, the *Art Show*, or the *Film Rooms*. Please also do not smoke in the *Dealers' Room*, the small meeting rooms, and other posted areas. Most meeting rooms will be divided into smoking and non-smoking sides.

Handicapped: There will be special seating for hearing- or vision-impaired members at the front of all program items, and for wheelchairs in an easy-access area. Please leave these spaces available for those who need them.

Theft and Vandalism: Obviously, these are illegal, and will be prosecuted; if you see any problems, report them to Convention Security in the *Board Room*.

Signs: The Sheraton has a strict sign policy, so please don't post signs on the walls; they'll be taken down quickly. Use our various message boards if you want your signs to last.

Costumes and Safety: NO NAKED BLADES or other weapons are allowed. In a crowded convention like this, there is too much chance of someone being hurt. Moreover, if you are in costume, PLEASE BE CAREFUL. You probably aren't used to having all those projections, sheaths, and hunks of metal on you, and you're liable to hit somebody if you move quickly in any direction.

GUESTS OF HONOR

Damon Knight and Kate Wilhelm will give their Guest of Honor speeches in the *Hynes Auditorium* Friday evening, and will have a question-and-answer session Saturday. They will autograph Noreascon items including *Better Than One*, the Program Book, and ERIPMAV T-shirts Sunday at 2-3pm and 4-5 pm in the *Constitution Room*.

Bruce Pelz will give his Fan Guest of Honor speech Sunday on the Pentacles Program. Bruce, Damon, and Kate will also be on other program items, so check the Pocket Program. Material on all our Guests of Honor is in the Program Book, pages 16-23.

MASQUERADE

The Noreascon II Masquerade will be Saturday evening at 8pm in the *Hynes Auditorium*. Contestants who did not register by mail must sign up in advance at Information, either 9pm-11pm Friday or 11am-1pm Saturday. We recommend that contestants who did preregister check at the desk as well, to catch any last-minute changes or news.

Photographers who have not registered by mail before the convention should check at the masquerade desk; we may have to limit the number of people in the photography area. For the safety of the contestants, flash photography during the masquerade is absolutely prohibited.

AWARDS CEREMONY

The Science Fiction Achievement Awards (Hugos), with the other traditional awards, will be presented at the Awards Ceremony on Sunday evening at 8pm in the *Hynes Auditorium*. Robert Silverberg will be Toastmaster (see Program Book, page 24).

SALES AND SOUVENIRS

Copies of *Better Than One* by Damon Knight and Kate Wilhelm, Bruce Pelz's *Fantasy Showcase Tarot*, souvenir tote bags, and T-shirts will be on sale in the *Constitution Foyer*.

ART SHOW

Remember the seven basic art show rules, and please read the materials on page 80-82 of the Program Book:

1. No extraneous artwork or large bags will be allowed in the show; we reserve the right to inspect small bags.
2. No photography will be allowed.
3. You must have a bidder's number to bid for art on bidsheets or at auction.
4. 5% Massachusetts sales tax will be added to the amount of your purchase.
5. All artwork must be picked up and paid for by 4pm on Monday.
6. BID EARLY AND BID OPTEN.
7. If you have any questions, ask the art show staff.

DEALERS' ROOM

Pick up a copy of the Dealers' Room Directory at the room; it'll help you find your way around and identify those dealers you particularly do not want to miss.

SPECIAL EXHIBITS

We now have 12 very special exhibits, including all those listed in the Program Book (p. 84) and a new one described below. Don't forget that the "Space Exhibit" includes materials from NASA, National Geographic, and the L-5 Society.

GIGER'S "ALIEN" EXHIBIT

Hansen Galleries presents original art by H.R. Giger for the 20th Century-Fox film *Alien*. This work brought Giger the Academy Award for visual effects. Some pieces are life-size. Also on display are works by Dee S. Schwertberger and Hanna Kay as seen in *Omni*. This exhibit is in *Hynes 206*, on the upper level, past the Dealers' Room. Hansen Galleries will also have prints, posters, and books for sale.

FILMS

The listing in the schedule gives the approximate times for the features in the film program. The definitive minute-by-minute list with shorts and film notes is in a separate publication, available near the film rooms. In general, features will be separated by 30-45 minutes of shorts. Note that the film schedule may be extended even further, depending on the number of volunteers available; see *Lobster Tales* and the signs near the film rooms for details.

There will be presentations by studio representatives about upcoming films, with slides or actual footage. See the General Program and Film schedules for details.

BUSINESS MEETING AND SITE SELECTION

To participate in site-selection voting for the 1982 Convention, you must vote by 6pm Saturday in the *Constitution Foyer*.

All members of Noreascon are members of the World Science Fiction Society (WSFS) and are eligible to attend its business meeting, which is spread out over the four mornings of the convention in *Commonwealth*. See pages 91-104 of the Program Book for a listing of the business to be conducted.

BABYSITTING

Professional babysitting is available for small children who need day and evening care, for a fee. Ask at Information about location and signups.

HYNES ACCESS

The Hynes will be open 10am-10pm on Friday, 10am-midnight on Saturday, 10am-10pm on Sunday, and 9am-4pm on Monday. Entry will be from the corridor on the Sheraton third floor, or from the front entrance on Boylston Street.

VIDEO ROOM

The Noreascon Two Video Room will be in Liberty E&F in the Sheraton. One room will show animated SF & Fantasy works to a fixed schedule, and will include the East Coast premieres of three features: *Lupin 3*, *Cagliostro Castle*, & *Undersea Encounter*. The schedule will be at the Video Room, and may be included with the film notes.

The other room will run live action SF, Fantasy, and fannish video, from a schedule posted at the room. This will include features, TV productions, fan musicals, and other works. Check the posted schedule and *Lobster Tales* for details.

CHILDREN'S PROGRAM AND LOUNGE

These rooms are open only to children who are themselves members of the convention; for non-members, see Babysitting. The Children's Program schedule is in the detailed schedule. The Lounge next to the Program room will have a variety of activities for children who can generally take care of themselves. It will also serve as a gathering and check-in point from 9-9 daily. One activity is the live reading of *The Hobbit*, with one chapter each hour from 10am-2pm each day.

TRIVIA BOWL

Early rounds of the trivia bowl start on Saturday, with quarter- and semi-final rounds on Sunday, and the grand championship on Monday, all in *Gardner*. Team and individual registrations will be accepted 2-6pm Friday at Information.

CPR COURSE

We will offer a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) course for free, twice during the convention. It will provide Red Cross certification, and will last 4 hours: either Friday or Saturday noon-4pm. Attendance will be limited; if interested, sign up at Information and pick up an instruction booklet.

FAN CABARET

These workshops are advance reservation only, but there may be space. Inquire at Information for details of sign-up or participation.

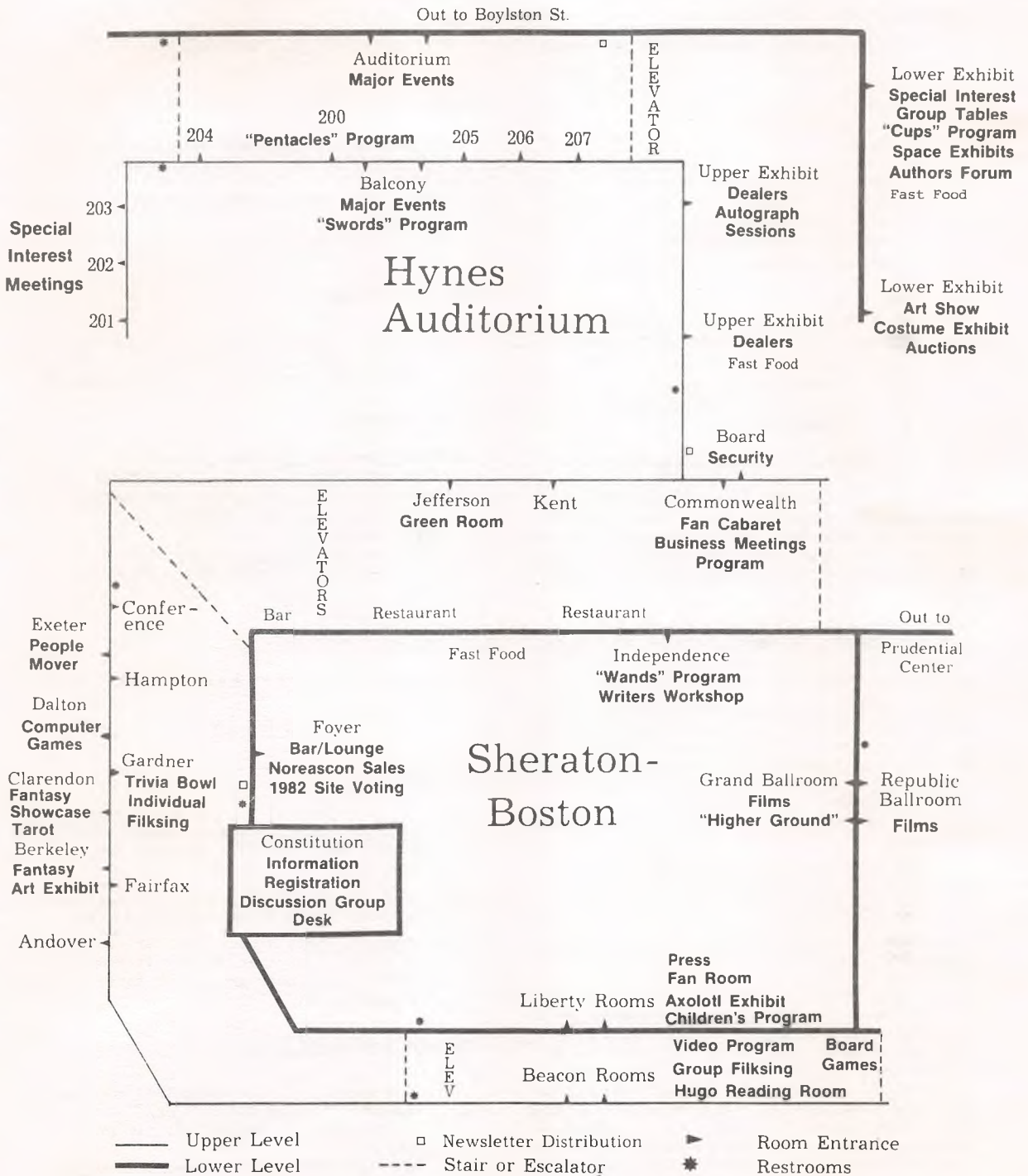

All program items are listed here by the hour they start. In fact, program items start 5 minutes past the hour and end 5 minutes before the hour to allow time for changing rooms.

Because some program items do not always finish on the hour, we have provided CONTINUATION ROOMS for most tracks. After the item, the speakers may move to these rooms to answer further questions and continue the discussion. This will allow thoughts to be completed, but also allow the next item to start on time. 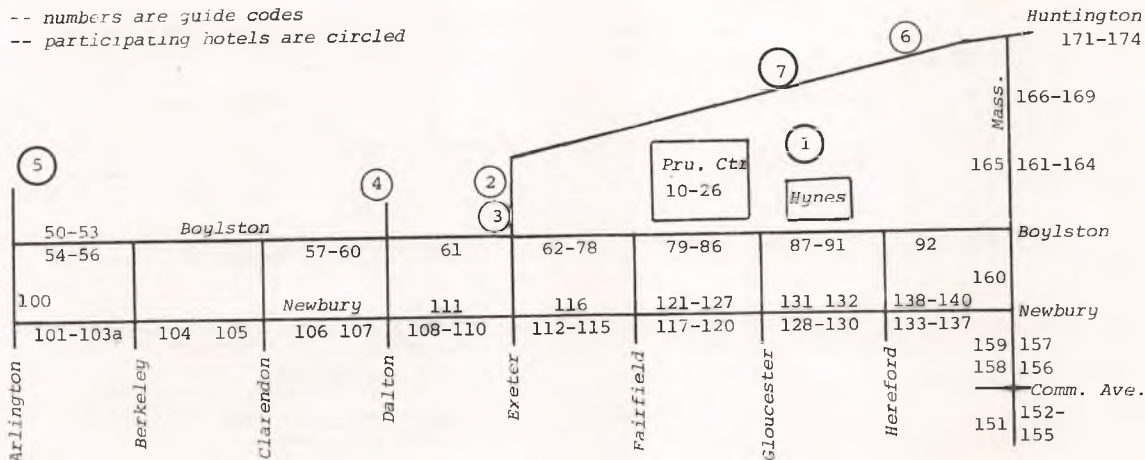
