The Hugo Awards are the science fiction field's greatest honor. The winners are directly selected by science fiction fans, the members of this year's Worldcon. This year marks the 50<sup>th</sup> time Worldcon members have honored their favorite SF works.

The Hugo rockets for the award's 50<sup>th</sup> year have been plated with gold instead of the usual chromium by Weston Body Hardware Limited, Etc. The base was designed by Frank Johnson of Edmonton, Alberta, who has been crafting the Aurora Award since its inception. His design features the Hugo rocket on a solid Canadian maple base nestled between two halves of a maple leaf designed to represent a blast of flames.


