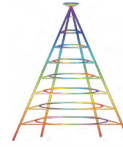

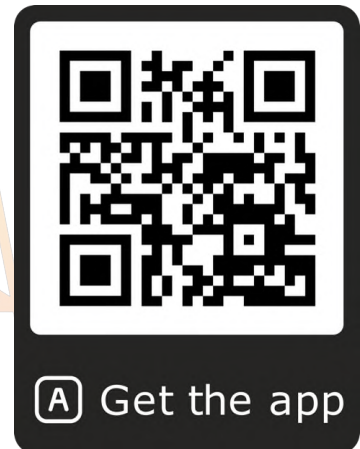

The WSFS Mark Protection Committee will meet at 2 PM Thursday in 212D. The MPC is the only permanent body of the World Science Fiction Society. It oversees the intellectual property of Worldcon and manages the WSFS-owned websites. The MPC consists of appointees from Worldcon and NASFiC committees and members elected at the Business Meeting. Three elected seats will be up for election this year, with nominations to be taken at the Friday WSFS Business Meeting and the election itself to be held at the Saturday WSFS Business Meeting.

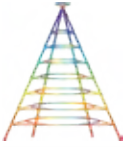

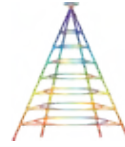

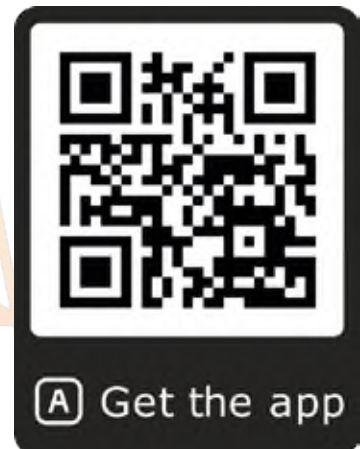

Carlos by Boccardo Gate.

How ironic that San Jose—the 10th
largest city in the USA and home of
the Winchester Mystery House—does
not have a professional operator
to conduct a ghost tour. Bay Area
Ghost Hunters is based in San Jose.
Co-Organizers Adrienne Foster and
Deb Wible have put one together.

San Jose was founded in 1777



when the original Mexican pioneers
were sent to Santa Clara County to
produce food for the presidios of
San Francisco and Monterey. Many
settled around the Guadalupe River,
which is not far from today’s conven-
tion center, making it the oldest part
of town. Since then, the city has seen,
among other things, the Bear Flag
Revolt, the heartbreak of the redis-
tribution of land after the USA took
possession of California, the burn-
ing of Chinatown on Market Street,
the Hart Lynching and the transition
of the valley from being the Heart’s
Delight to Silicon centric. The peo-
ple here have had their share of ups
and downs every bit as much as San
Francisco, Chicago or New York and
strong emotions are generally what
lead to ghosts.

The tour covers about 1.5 miles. We
start at Boccardo Gate, by Yoshihiro
Uchida Hall, on Fourth Street & San
Carlos and end at Trials Pub, where

those taking the tour have the option
to dine and socialize afterward.

Please be advised that even
though it can be quite warm during
the day in San Jose, the temperature
can significantly drop after dusk. It
could be worth bringing a sweater
and a bottle of water. Please wear
comfortable walking shoes.

Cost of the tour is \$15.00 in
advance, \$20.00 “at the door,”
if space is still available. Please
note the R.S.V.P. deadline is 11:59
p.m., the night before each tour. To
reserve space in advance, please go
BAGH’s (Bay Area Ghost Hunters)
Meetup page. This will require being
a member of both Meetup and
BAGH to R.S.V.P.

Valley Outer Loop Tour.

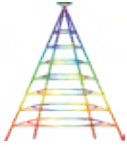
Our first stop was the Computer

for photo ops along the way.

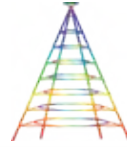
We had plenty of fun on the bus

The San José Galactic Light Tower

The San José Galactic Light Tower is an interactive animated light sculpture created by Kevin Roche, designed and constructed to debut at MidAmeriCon II, the 74th World Science Fiction Convention, in Kansas City, Missouri, August 2016.

Standing approximately 30 feet tall, the tower incorporates nearly 3000 individually addressable LEDs controlled by a Bluetooth-enabled Teensy 3.2 processor. The illumination, color, and animations are adjustable via a simple mobile application.

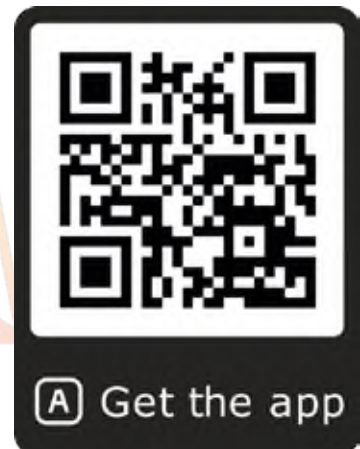

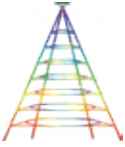

Long Lines Happy Faces

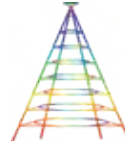

Opening Ceremonies

Worldcon 76 kicked off Thursday evening with a thrilling performance by a Tongan Ma'ulu'ulu. The convention chair, Kevin Roche, then stepped on stage in a spacesuit, which was peeled off to reveal his ceremony attire.

Following an address by Santa Clara Supervisor Ken Yeager, Kevin was interrupted by the sounds of *Thus Spake Zarathustra*, which signaled the arrival of the Guests of Honor, beginning with John Picacio. The Artist Guest



of Honor brought the #Mexicanx Initiative recipients onto the stage and spoke about his initiative. He was followed by his fellow GoHs, including the cosplaying Pettingers, Frank Hayes, Spider Robinson in a Callahan's apron, and the spirits of Pangborn and Wilkins.

Erle Melvin Korshak presented the First Fandom Award to Robert

Silverberg. John Hertz presented the Posthumous Hall of Fame award to Len and June Moffat which was accepted by Bob Konigsberg, their son. The Sam Moskowitz Archive Award was then awarded to Hal Hall. Sue Francis wife of Steve Francis then

bestowed the Big Heart Award to *File770* fanzine creator Mike Glycer. It was then announced that from this day forward, the award would be designated the David A. Kyle Big Heart Award.

Following the First Fandom awards, the designers for this year's Hugo Award base came onto stage, accompanied by a truly rocking themed video.

Joe Siclari made good on his threat to open a time capsule from the 1992 Worldcon *Magicon*, the contents of which can be

seen today in the Exhibit Hall (we promised one Hugo!).

A last-minute surprise came in the form of a representative from the Guinness Book of World Records, who awarded Worldcon with a second consecutive award for the longest running science fiction award (the Hugo), which was first delivered at Worldcon 75 in Helsinki.

Our Chair concluded with a heartfelt message to all of our members, and declared Worldcon 76 to be underway, with a bang of his gavel!

Singularity in Panel Room
