



LAST WORDS FROM FORRYCON

Forrycon is 'over'. Was it all worth it? In a word, yes. But...

If I had really wanted to be smart I'd have just spent all the personal money I've put into Forrycon on a return ticket to Los Angeles. And all the holidays I took to organise Forrycon could have been spent looking at Forry's collection and the other sights. For, although I've been to L.A. (once, three years ago), I missed seeing Forry's amazing house and collection as he was overseas at the time (in Europe and England for conventions).

But I wanted other fans in New Zealand to meet this ultra nice writer, editor, and collector plus let those who had little or no chance of getting to LA have a chance to see at least some of the incredible artifacts from his collection.

The more I think about it, the more it seems a conorganiser has to be certifiably crazy. Lana Brown is doubly crazy for wanting to organise a third con! And if you're not crazy to start with, you will be by the time the con is 'over'!

Why do I keep putting over in quotes? Because, contrary to appearances, Forrycon is not yet finished. There are still accounts to balance, lost property to post back to owners, T-shirts and videos to sell, etc. One slight difficulty is that I got carried away with ensuring attendees got value for their memberships.

Unfortunately when all the bills came in, some items cost more than budgeted for. The sad end result is that Forrycon is still about \$900 in the red. That money is coming out of my pocket. Both for my sake and that of our charity Greenpeace it would be nice to turn that loss into a small profit!

To that end, Forrycon T-shirts are still available for a short time and Hamish Rose has edited all the video footage shot before, during and after the con into an

excellent souvenir tape that runs one hour and forty minutes. There will also be a sale of some items that missed the Auction and some material from my collection at a general meeting of SF fans at Nigel Rowe's flat (see separate notice for full details).

One sour note to Forrycon was that a few decided that they were too high and mighty to need to pay like other fans. To my eternal regret, I never had tight security checks on memberships and at least ten people free-loaded. With the assistance of the hotel manager I kicked out four people who crashed the con. I've since had a phone conversation with a female fan who considered that it was more important for her to pay for an overseas holiday than for the con events she attended!

It would be real nice to get membership money from any attendees who didn't pay at the time. Anybody that was a free-loader has essentially stolen \$45 from my wallet. If any members reading this know of anyone that free-loaded, I'd be grateful if you would mention that I'm less than impressed with them. Even when Forrycon gets in the black, free-loaders are cheating all the paying members as well as the con organiser and charity.

What angers me most is that many of the free-loaders had jobs when I personally know of fans who were unemployed (or students) that didn't come to Forrycon purely because they couldn't afford to. Others saved money over a long period to attend. For employed people to free-load is a real slap in the face to other fans less well off.

But enough grumping. On the positive side I've had good feedback from a number of people regarding Forrycon. It appears that people had a really good time overall. I'm glad fans - both neos and old hands - enjoyed themselves. I'm sure Forry left New Zealand with a good impression of fandom in our little neck of the woods.

And remember. If you're ever in Los Angeles with a spare day or two up your sleeve, just dial MODN-FAN and Mr Sci-Fi will be only too glad to let you view his collection (provided he's in town and not junketing around the globe travelling to some con or other!).

I hope to see many of you at DISCONTINUITY (Easter, Auckland) where I'll be fan Guest of Honour - and promise I'll be able to talk without saying "Walk with me!" as I stride down hallways. I will also be open to all offers to buy me a drink of my choice.


These are not yet finalised as there is still expenditure on printing and mailing this DAY, and expected income from T-shirt and video sales.
