The Australian and New Zealand Amateur Publishing Association owes its existence to eleven people — the four mentioned above, and the seven who joined them to produce the first mailing. Ultimately, John Foyster, the Father of Modern Australian Fandom, may be blamed for it. He organized the 7th Australian Science Fiction Convention, Melbourne, Easter 1966 (the first convention in this country in eight years). From that convention came Australian Science Fiction Review and renewed activity in Sydney and Melbourne. By 1968 various fanzines were being published, new clubs were springing up, and all kinds of contacts were being made between Australian fans and between them and overseas fans. To Ron Clarke of Sydney is given the credit of suggesting the idea of a local amateur publishing association, and to Leigh Edmonds of Melbourne the blame for getting the thing off the ground.

John Foyster mentions attending a meeting at the Melbourne Science Fiction Club (then at 19 Somerset Place, Melbourne) to discuss the matter with Leigh and Bernie. I wasn't at that meeting, but at the time I was living with Leigh and Paul Stevens at Elsternwick, so it isn't at all surprising that Paul and I signed up. Bernie was a fairly regular visitor at our place, a young bloke brimming over with enthusiasm for fandom, existentialism, acid rock, Bach's unaccompanied violin sonatas (my fault) and other contemporary issues, so I am not surprised that he played an important part in ANZAPA's origins. Likewise I am not surprised that, although he is listed as a foundation member, he never actually contributed anything to the mailings.

For me, ANZAPA (or APA-A, as it was originally) was a turning point. By October 1968 I had published the first eighteen of ASFR's twenty issues, and I was feeling frustrated. ANZAPA launched me into the madcap, stimulating, utterly informal world of amateur publishing, and I can't find words enough to thank Ron, Leigh, Bernie and John for providing me with this most delightful emotional and creative outlet and hobby.

Eventually, I hope that my fellow members of ANZAPA, past and present, will tell the stories behind the bare facts and figures that follow. If they will do that, I promise to join them, but for the moment we must have those facts and figures.

Comment.

My notes on contents are selective (you've noticed?); where titled articles appear they are noted; where subjects are dealt with at length they are noted; articles and letters by persons other than their publishers will be noted in italics; artwork will be noted in this section, mainly because there has never been much of it in ANZAPA. Neither listing nor comment is intended to be exhaustive description: I'll leave that to someone else.

Bernie Bernhouse (as already noted) never contributed to ANZAPA. In subsequent listing of mailing contents each member will be noted, whether he has a contribution or not, since it seems as interesting to note who missed mailings as who contributed.

I forget the background to the APA-A Constitution. Obviously it

had been circulated before the first mailing, since Woodman and Mason devote much space to amendments, and Clarke and Ryan refer to the constitution. I do not intend to write a constitutional history of ANZAPA, but changes will be noted.

Artwork in Mailing 1: one-page comic strip by Burt Kaufman (The Mechanism); Bangsund, Edmonds and Mason illustrated their own fanzines. Burt Kaufman (I should have put his name in italics the first time) was a friend in Sydney of John Foyster and Lee Harding. He had a review in the first issue of ASFR.

The other ASFR reject (in the sense that by being published here it was effectively rejected from ASFR, whatever my hazy intentions may have been originally) in this mailing was Bruce Gillespie's review in The Marshian Chronicles. Bruce wanted to join APA-A, but for some reason could not contribute anything in time for the first mailing, so I selected this review and chose the title for the fanzine, and Leigh Edmonds stencilled it.

Leigh remarks in the Official Organ that Brian Richards (Western Australia: see much later reminiscences by Ron Clarke and me) wanted to join APA-A as a non-contributing member. Leigh sent him some mailings. On John Ryan's recommendation, Jack Butler was invited to join. In Mailing 2 we learn that John Breden, Noel Kerr and Lee Harding also received the first mailing. Since John Brosnan joined in time for Mailing 2 it is fair to assume that he also received a copy of the first. This accounts for 17 of the 30 copies of the first mailing; others I know to have a copy are Ron Graham and Mike O'Brien. Readers (especially former Official Editors) may care to inform me where the other eleven copies went to.

I am indebted to Gary Mason for providing copies of the first four mailings (mine were sold during 1975 to the library of Murdoch University, Western Australia). Since Gary has kept the envelopes in which the mailings came, I can report that Mailing 1 cost 13 cents to post. The membership fee in 1968 was \$2.00: I will note subsequent increases.

Isn't this exciting? Of course it is. And only sixty-odd mailings to go before October 1978. Whoo-boy! (I'm not at all sure I should have started this.)

In 1968 ASFR was nominated, for the second time, for a Best Fanzine Hugo. Ron Graham came to Melbourne and told us about his plans for a professional sf magazine (later called Vision of Tomorrow), and asked me to be its Australian editor. There had been some talk about bidding for an Australian World SF Convention. Stirring times! I mention this background stuff because it seems to me that, more than any other person or organization, ANZAPA (APA-A) laid the groundwork for the Worldcon in Melbourne in 1975. Take a bow, Leigh Edmonds!

But in 1968 an Australian Worldcon was not much more than a dream, and we had other things on our minds anyway. Like moving house, in some cases. On to December...
