TAFF NEWS: SCOOP FANAC & STARSPINKLE !! The Next Taff trip will be in 1968 from the US to the British National Convention during Easter 1968. Nominations are open for an American to make the trip. the following 4 qualifications must be met: 10 He must be nominated by 3 American & 2 European fans. 2) He must submit a 100 word nominating platform to be published on the reverse side of the Taff voting form. 3) A \$5.00 bond of good faith must accompany the nomination. 4) The candidate must sign a statement of willingness to go to the 1968 British National Convention if elected. Nominations will close on midnight, March 31, 1967. Ballots will be distributed on Aptil 1967, and the voting deadline will be 5 January 1968. The "Australian Ballot will be continued, as will the "Hold Over Funds" category. At the moment, Taff funds on hand are very low: \$212.32 in the US. The following is the final vote in the recent campaign: TOM SCHLUCK 83; ERIC JONES 39; PETE WESTON 20; BO STENFORS 5; Hold Over Funds 2; Write-In: Len Moffatt 1 (!).
