'ASTOUNDING' TO GO LARGE SIZE!

'UNKNOWN WORLDS' LINE - UP

EDITOR CAMPBELL REVEALS CHANGE IN
ASTOUNDING'S FORMAT. DETAILS GIVEN.

During an interview in his new office at STREET & SMITH's Chelsea Publishing House, John W. Campbell, Jr., editor of ASTOUNDING SCIENCE FICTION and UNKNOWN WORLDS, revealed that beginning with the Jan number, ASTOUNDING would go large size in a format similar to that of UNKNOWN WORLDS. The overall size will be 8½" x 11". The new book will contain 128 pages and will sell for 25¢. The new format allows 35,000 more words per issue than the present small size. The style of cover will remain essentially the same. There will be approximately 100,000 words per issue.

The feature story for the Jan number has been written by Jack Williamson. It is titled "Break-Down". The cover will be painted by Rogers.
