The first place winner is annually published in IF, edited by Pohl.

TWO JOIN LANCER BOOKS: Evan Lee Heyman has joined Lancer Books, publisher of the Conan series, a general line of paperbacks, and several magazines, as an editor. Mr. Heyman had previously been Editor of Banner Books, a division of Avon Books, which is owned by the Hearst Corporation. Mr. Heyman has been in publishing for 20 years.

CLASSICS OF THE SILVER SCREEN: "The Illustrated Man," starring Rod Steiger and Claire Bloom, will be directed by Jack Smight and produced by Harold Kreitsek and Ted Mann from Kreitsek's screenplay. The picture will draw from the original story plus several others, and will be the initial production of Smight's company, Solitar Productions... Steve Allen has formed his own company, Steve Allen Productions, which will produce "Night Life Of The Gods," acquired from the Thorne Smith Estate, as well as "The Public Hating," based on a dramatic story by Allen ... Prominent Films, New York, a distributor, will enter the production field with "Night Of The Auk," an sf dramatization that originally appeared on Broadway 12 years ago. The film will be directed by French director Claude Chabrol, adapted by Paul Gegauff, and produced by John Nasht. Filming will start in Europe during January ... Norman Felton, producer of "The Man From U.N.C.L.E.," has purchased "The Lemon Eaters" by Jerry Sohl for filming in a joint production with Arena Productions, his company, and Paramount Pictures. Sohl will write the screenplay for the film, scheduled for spring 1968 production...Current 20th Century-Fox attractions will include "The Lost Continent," now filming in London, based on Dennis Wheatley's novel, Unchartered Seas. "The Devil Rides Out," based on another novel by Wheatley, is also filming in London. "Je T'Aime, Je T'Aime," a time-travel thriller, is in production in Nice, France, as well as Paris and Brussels. SAVE STAR TREK OR I'LL KILL YOU DEFT.: An empassioned missive from Bjo Trimble has advised us to rush out now and save Star Trek, NBC science-fiction adventure series. Bjo writes that Gene Roddenberry telephoned her with an appeal to all sf fans because Star Trek is doing poorly in the ratings and Needs Saving. This fanzine considers any such letter writing campaign the height of folly. This is the second time fandom has been called upon to Save Star Trek: pre-

sumably we will once more be called upon next October, when renewals for the winter

1969 season are up.

While Star Trek is, perhaps, an admirable television program, it is but one of many. Yet why haven't Dave McDaniel and Bob Coulson written passionate letters to fandom, urging us to Save The Man From U.N.C.L.E? That show is definitely scheduled for the axe, and Coulson has a large and captive audience in Yandro. The answer, possibly, is that they believe The Man From U.N.C.L.E. must stand on its merits, and if letters are written they must be written by all shades of viewers, rather than just one vocal minority.
