

## FANZINE PUBLISHING RECORD

This is Fanzine Publishing Record; a second trial issue, compiled and distributed in the belief that there is enough general interest out there in a work of this type. It is edited by Roger D. Sween/319 Elm St/Kalamazoo, MI 49007. FPR is available to those who send in their fanzines to me. It is available to others for \$3.00 for ten issues or for one time samples for 50¢. FPR will be subsequently issued as Fan Publishing Record near the end of each month unless the space fills up sooner.

The experiment to index FPR, reported in the first trial issue, proved too time consuming for both the editor and the computer; detailed indexing will be abandoned here. There will, however, be a cumulative title index to the zines listed at the end of each year.

FPR will continue to be exclusively bibliographic, without evaluative comment on the zines. Contents have been listed nearly completely, with only slight departures from the order in which the contents appear. Statements descriptive of content have been added where the titles are misleading; short and insubstantial reviews have been omitted. Your reactions are heartily appreciated.
