  The definitive 1956 treatment of

  strong cast featuring Peter
  Cushing, Donald Pleasance and

- 10:50 BLAKE'S SEVEN: SARCOPHAGUS (Author: Tannith Lee) One of the classic Space Opera's better episodes, penned by the Princess Royal of 80s SF and Fantasy. (If you're wondering why, the story goes she was really keen on Avon)
- 11:40 CAPTAIN SIMIAN AND THE SPACE MONKEYS: PLANET OF THE HUMANS (Author: D.C. Fontana) The slightly twisted animated series starring Jerry Doyle. Check, it's an interspecies thing...
- 12:00 STAR TREK (ANIMATED): SLAVER WEAPON (Author: Larry Niven) So how do you adapt your Known Space short story to the Trek universe? First change your Puppeteer to a Vulcan...
- 12:25 TERRY PRATCHETT'S DISCWORLD: SOUL MUSIC (PART 2) (Author: Terry Pratchett) Another taste of the critically acclaimed animated series from Cosgrove Hall.

- 1:45 THE WALRUS AND THE CARPENTER (Author: Lewis Carroll) Peter Cook and Dudley Moore recreate the classic nonsense poem of cruelty and shellfish.
- 1:50 GRIM TALES: THE HEDGEHOG AND THE HARE (Collectors: Jakob and Wilhelm Grimm) Rik Mayall spins a yarn of snobbery and cunning, with some bizarre animation.
- 2:00 THE OUTER LIMITS: DEMON WITH A GLASS HAND (Author: Harlan Ellison) The best use of the Bradbury Building until Blade Runner.
- 2:50 THE TWILIGHT ZONE: LITTLE GIRL LOST (Author: Richard Matheson) One of the Zone's best remembered stories, in which a child is lost in a dimension resembling a bad acid trip.
- 3:15 RAY BRADBURY THEATRE: A SOUND OF THUNDER (Author: Ray Bradbury) Time -travel! Dinosaurs! Butterflies! This show has it all!
- 3:40 THE SIMPSONS: SLEEPLESS IN SPRINGFIELD (Authors: Richard Matheson, Ray Bradbury, George Orwell, etc.) An amalgam of Simpsons Hallowe'en specials featuring KING HOMER, TIME AND PUNISHMENT and HOMER<sup>3</sup> which parody several of the shows on this video programme.
- A:00 THE LOST WORLD (Author: Sir Arthur Conan Doyle) A somewhat truncated version of the silent classic, featuring lots of dinosaurs brilliantly animated by Willis O'Brien. Seventy years later, you can see which bits Spielberg and Crichton ripped off.
- 4:50 LE VOYAGE DANS LA LUNE (Authors: Jules Verne, H.G.Wells) Yes, that film. Georges Méliès borrowed liberally from Verne and Wells to make this pioneer phantasmagoria.
- 4:56 CHARCUTERIE MÉCHANIQUE Back by popular demand: The Mechanical Butcher the very first SF film. A pig gets turned into smallgoods.
