

ENERAL INFORMATION

CAPCON 87 is the 26th Annual Australian Science Fiction Convention. The Convention's purpose is to create an atmosphere for contact & communication between the different special interest groups in Australia. CAPCON will bring together in one site, film, special effects, artists, authors, fans, model makers, costumers, and readers. The "Forum for Tomorrow" refers not only to the futures portrayed by various writers but also to the future of Fan groups. There will be members of many different groups present, from the Society for Creative Anachronism, a medieval re-creation group, through to the Hitch-Hikers Guide & Dr. Who Fan Clubs. each with their own particular perspective on the past or the future. With this aim in mind the Programme has been made to leave time for discussion and relaxation.

OF HONOUR OUR GUESTS

Robert Asprin and Lynn Abbey live in Ann Arbour, Michigan. Their interests are wide ranging and varied.

Robert's father, a native of the Philippines, met his Irish mother in Michigan. The mix of European & Asian culture provided their son with a much wider world view than some-one growing up in the Midwest might normally have had the opportunity to achieve. His heritage of pride, honour & history has created a heightened sense of perspective on the human conflicts that arise

In the mid-70's Robert was a cost accountant for the Xerox Corporation, when his interest in fencing drew him to the the Society for Creative Anachronism (S.C.A.), a worldwide medieval re-creation group. Robert started an SCA chapter in Ann Arbor, and with his usual style called himself "Yang the Nauseating". He created one of the legends of the SCA, "The Dark Horde", of whose

At the same time he started attending SF Conventions, frequented by many of the SCA, amongst them was Gordon R. Dickson. Some time later, with Gordon's encouragement Robert wrote his first novel, "The Cold Cash War", which was published in 1977. Before long Robert had turned to fantasy, and the adventures of Aahz & Skeeve, the Myth Adventurers, was on it's way. Barely two years later, 1979, he was able to leave Xerox, and the world of cost accounting, behind, for a new life in professional writing.

"I wanted to lampoon the serious fantasy the was being written....The escapades of Aahz and Skeeve are patterned mostly after

the Bob Hope/Bing Crosby movies of the '40s." Lynn was born in Peekskill N.Y. ..and seemed destined for the world of writers & publishing. Her father was a linotype operator for a local newspaper, and his dreams of becoming a writer probably influenced Lynn's own similar dreams. Throughout school and college, writing was her major preoccupation, often writing stories in her spare time. History, however, was the career that Lynn decided upon. She obtained degrees at the University of Rochester and New York University.

Instead of finding a career in history, computer programming and systems analysis in the Insurance industry formed the start for her first working years. During that time Lynn also became involved with the S.C.A. & SF Conventions. During one convention she

chanced to meet Robert Asprin, and in 1976 moved to Ann Arbor to begin her dream of being an author of fantasy fiction. Lynn's first historical fantasy, Daughter of the Bright Moon, was sold in 1978, coincidentally she was helping Robert develop the Thieves World concept the same weekend that the sale was made. Lynn went on to become the Editor of the Thieves World anthology, her training in History & computing allowing her to create and document the social & cultural structure of the shared universe that forms the basis for more than 18 authors who contribute to the series.

As a combination of interests Robert & Lynn form a formidable pair of Guests. The range of possible topics is stunning.....fencing & swashbuckling, being a Mongol warlord, a Klingon, a cash accountant and/or deep space mercenary, not to mention computers, systems programming, history & worldbuilding. Together they form a team that has defied the rules of the

As co-editors of the "Thieves World" anthologies, their series numbers nearly 2 Million books sold, more than 60 stories in eight separate volumes, written by some of the top writers in SF&F today, and all using the same characters and settings.

Two great Guests, with the enthusiasm to see people, talk to them, sing with them, find out about Australia, and generally help everyone have a great convention, and perhaps start some onto a career of writing. We welcome them to Capcon & Australia.

FAN GUEST OF HONOUR

John has been involved in the world of communication and computing for most of his life. John was involved in many activities at University, including the Tolkien Society, and at times then new game of Dungeons & Dragons. This brought John into contact with those people who later became the movers in the Sydney Science Fiction Foundation, and later, Syncons Combine a personal interest in robotics and computing, the possibilities of orbital space colonies, fanzine & desktop publishing, and you have a very interesting person. Like Robert & Lynn, he is prone to spending long hours at Conventions having a good time talking, punning and Inventing designs for robotic drink waiters... John is the perfect choice for our Australian Guest.

GENERAL CONVENTION POLICIES

SMOKING

In keeping with current trends both at Cons and elsewhere, the Convention will be mostly non-smoking. Since the Hotel is very efficiently airconditioned the larger rooms will have a smoking section for major program items, smaller rooms will be non-smoking. We expect smokers to consider others and we will provide at least one "smokers lounge".

WEAPONS

The weapons policy is very simple, all weapons, replica or otherwise are to be sheathed, holstered or tethered. Masquerade items involving weapons are to be cleared with the Co-ordinator prior to the night. Anyone not showing adequate care will be asked to correct their oversight!

NOISE

Noise at room parties should not be a problem, however if things get too noisy someone will have to ask you to quieten down. This is not being officious, just considerate of others who may wish to sleep. The Committee will be much easier to cope with, and more understanding than the Hotel Management.

HOTEL DETAILS

The Convention Hotel is the centrally located and well appointed CANBERRA PARKROYAL. A very comfortable Hotel with luxurious rooms, superb function facilities, swimming pool, bar and dining facilities. Located less than 1km. from Canberra's central shopping area, restaurants and fast food. A short drive away is the "Questacon - Hands on Science Centre", Australian National Library, National Gallery, High Court Building and New Parliament House. Each room has phone, television, "in house" video, and a limited number have interconnection to adjacent rooms. The Hotel Restaurant is well regarded, and adjoins a fine cocktail bar. The Parkroyal has a large function area which is divided into up to five rooms, and with all the rooms joined can accompodate 1100 people, enough room for the most athletic Fan Olympics yet! There is an excellent area for a hospitality suite, and plenty of space for the Art Show, Hucksters, Video and Wargames areas. Adequate off street parking is provided at the rear of the Hotel with easy access to the Function areas.

Note. Please try to enter from the swimming pool doors where possible and try not to congregate in the reception foyer.


The remaining 400 will be published as a numbered edition only, bound in navy cloth and impressed with silver on the spine and cover.

In addition to the Main Con Rooms there is a Hospitality suite, and a Fannish lounge, not to mention space for people to just sit and talk.



ART SHOW

The Art Show will be set up in a lockable area with 24 hour attendance by Convention Staff. There is a competition and an art auction, (hosted by Robert Asprin) with the following categories: Open, Worlds of the Asprins, A Future Hope. Both flat and 3 dimensional, static or mobile art forms will be included. Unfortunately due to a very small response, there will not be a photographic competition this year, however there will be a meeting for those interested in discussing a format for future art shows.

AUCTIONS

There will be two Auctions during the course of the Convention. One will be a Collectables Auction which will be hosted by Keith Curtis, and will have a variety of rare and interesting articles both in the normal collecting sense, as well as items for the various Fan Funds. There will also be a number of rare movie posters. There is a complete list enclosed with your Convention bag. The second will be a fast paced, and entertaining, Auction of materials under the control of Justin Ackroyd with a team of willing and manic assistants. There will be large amounts of material for Fan Funds as well as books and items that are in many cases just as rare as those in the Collectables Auction.

CAPCON CARWARS

In the year 2026, Canberra, the old Australian Capital is desolate and empty, having been abandoned in 2020. All that remain are a few die-hard locals, the wombats, the dogs.....AND THE AUTODUELLISTS.

Players must be at least day members of CAPCON. There will be prizes for 1st, 2nd & 3rd placewinners, as well as best model (most accurate of the vehicle being played), most kills and for the player who best demonstrates the philosophy of the game.

Now aren't you glad it's just a board game, conceived & produced by Steve Jackson Games, which has gained a large following since its release in 1981. The game uses vehicles (represented by either 1° markers or models) that range in size from smaller than a mini right up to semi-trailers. They are armed with offensive (rockets lasers etc) & defensive (smoke screens, oil) and can be very heavily armoured.

The game is a fast moving, very enjoyable science fantasy game that is increasing in popularity rapidly worldwide. If you would

The Theme for the Masquerade is "Sanctuary Market on Festival Day"


The Masquerade room will be open from 8.00, with wandering troubadores, bards & jugglers to entertain. The judging will commence



4. BEST AUSTRALIAN SCIENCE FICTION OR FANTASY ARTIST: For works by a Professional or Fan Artist, Illustrator, Cartoonist, Sculptor or Artisan produced in 1986. Betty De Gabrielle Craig Hilton John Packer Nick Stathopoulos
 OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO AUSTRALIAN FANDOM: For a Fan whose activities in any or all aspects of Australian Fandom have contributed most to Fandom during 1986. These activities include but are not limited to, fanwritting, fanart, con and/or club organisation, costuming, filking, letterhacking and apahacking.
6. THE WILLIAM ATHELING JR. AWARD FOR CRITICISM OR REVIEW: For a particular piece of criticism or review produced by an Australian and first published or presented in 1986.




THE CONSTITUTION OF THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL SCIENCE FICTION CONVENTION

*There will be an annual Australian Science Fiction Convention, organised by a Convention Committee selected from amongst Bids, submitted to the Business Meeting at the Australian Science Fiction Convention, two calendar years before the Convention to be selected.

The Convention Committee for each Australian SF Convention will, by a vote of the Convention's members, after a nominating process involving Australian Fandom generally, award up to five Australian Science Fiction Awards (of which, at least, one must be for fannish endeavours) and the William Atheling Award for Criticism or Review.

*The Convention Committee will ensure that any surplus accrued by an Australian SF Convention will be applied to the benefit of Australian Fandom generally, and shall not be used to reward individuals or groups connected with the Convention Committee.

"This Convention may be changed by this method only: Notice of intention to amend, including the exact text, must be submitted to the Convention Committee in sufficient time to be published in the Convention Handbook (where this Constitution and any proposed accordance must be published) and then the amendment must be approved by a majority voting at the Business Meeting. No amendment will be in order if it has the effect of increasing the number of words in the Constitution."
