VENUE

Conflux 2013 will be held in conference rooms at the Rydges Capital Hill, in Barton, ACT.

It's a beautiful hotel – built around a central atrium full of trees and greenery...



Conflux has access to the full convention space, which has three full sized meeting rooms and some interesting spaces for events.

The bar is in the corner of the building and can be a cozy venue or we can spread out into the spill-over area to accommodate a larger group.

The cafe suburb of Manuka, Canberra's premier eating location. is about a ten minute walk down the road. There's serviced accommodation next door, for those who prefer it. The synagogue is across the intersection and there's a Catholic and Anglican church in Manuka. On the foot path, you can even see Parliament House (as Rydges Capital Hill borders the parliamentary triangle). What more do we need?!

ACCOMMODATION

Don't wait to reserve your room onsite at <u>Rydges</u> <u>Capital Hill!</u> Conflux 9 has bargained a great standard room rate of \$160 per night for bed and breakfast — so book up quick to avoid disappointment! Canberra may be busy at that time of year.

You can use your credit card to secure your booking over the phone without charge. Don't worry if your card will expire before Conflux 2013, you can simply update it closes to the servention time with the per-



update it closer to the convention time with the new card number and expiry date.

HOW TO BOOK

The best way to book a room is to call the hotel on +61 2 6295 3144 and book quoting this reference code **F-2504CI**

The convention rate is available from 24 April to 28 April 2013. \$160 covers two people for a room including two buffet breakfasts in the price. There are a range of rooms you can book:

- Superior Queen Room with a Queen Size Bed, 1 sofa bed is upon request
- Superior Twin Room with Two separate Double Size Beds
- Superior Queen room with accessible facilities
- Executive King Suite with a King Size Bed (\$180)
- Embassy Suite with a King Size Bed with a separate lounge area (\$200)

Two adults and two children under 12 can share a room at no additional cost. However, for children over 5 and under 12 the breakfast is charged at an additional \$12 per child. Children 5 years and under have a complimentary breakfast from the buffet. Cots are complimentary but please request one. They are available subject to availability.

The hotel has advised us that there is an additional charge of \$74 for a third person sharing a room, which includes a breakfast. You cannot negotiate a price without the breakfast, because of the nature of our deal. This additional charge covers additional towels, servicing, and set up if a sofa bed is required. The hotel has advised that they have limited occupation in the rooms to three adults. Given this additional charge, it's not cost-effective for four people to share a room.

The other thing to note is that while other discounts do not apply for the accommodation, priority cards can be use for discounts on meals, etc.

Please start your booking now so we can fill up the hotel and have it to ourselves!

INTERNATIONAL GoH: NALO HOPKINSON

Nalo Hopkinson has lived in Jamaica, Trinidad and Guyana and, for the past 30 years, Canada. She is the author of four novels and a short story collection (*Brown Girl in the Ring, Midnight Robber, The Salt Roads, The New Moon's Arms, Skin Folk*), the editor of fiction anthologies (*Whispers From the Cotton Tree Root: Caribbean Fabulist Fiction*, and *Mojo: Conjure Stories*), and the co-editor of fiction anthologies (*So Long Been Dreaming: Postcolonial Science Fiction* with Uppinder Mehan, and *Tesseracts Nine* with Geoff Ryman). Hopkinson's work has received Honourable Mention in Cuba's "Casa de las Americas" literary prize. She is a recipient of the *Warner Aspect First Novel Award, the Ontario Arts Council Foundation*



Award for emerging writers, the John W. Campbell Award for Best New Writer, the Locus Award for Best New Writer, the World Fantasy Award, the Sunburst Award for Canadian Literature of the Fantastic, the Aurora Award, and the Gaylactic Spectrum Award.

Her latest novel, *The New Moon's Arms*, was released in February 2007 from Warner/ Hachette Books. Nalo is currently living in California, where she is teaching at University of California Riverside. Nalo blogs and tweets about cooking, writing and other interesting stuff. EDITOR GOH: MARC GASCOIGNE

Marc Gascoigne is the Publishing Director of Angry Robot. Britain's gobbiest SF/F imprint. It's one of the most interesting publishers in the business at the moment — not just in terms of who they are publishing around the globe (including Australians Trent Jamieson and Joanne Anderton, as well as Conflux 9 guest Kaaron Warren) but in how they're approaching the industry.



Marc has just won the World Fantasy Special Award (professional) for his work with Angry Robot. He's been in science fiction publishing since 1984, and previous offences include Solaris Books, the Black Library, Fighting Fantasy game books, various role-playing and computer games... and some genuinely wonderful Sonic the Hedgehog novels.

SPECIAL GUEST: KAARON WARREN

Kaaron is a writer, wife and mother from Canberra. She started sending stories out when she was about 23, and sold her first. White Bed, in 1993. Since then she's sold about 70 short stories, three short story collections and three novels.

Kaaron's been nominated for a number of awards. winning the 2006 ACT Writing and Publishing Award for her short-story collection *The Grinding House*: a 2006



Ditmar Award for her novella/novelette: *The Grinding House*; a 2006 Ditmar Award for her Short story: *Fresh Young Widow*; and a 1999 Aurealis Award for her horror short story: *A Positive*.

About her name. Kaaron says – *People always ask me about the spelling of my name.* wondering where I'm from. I actually made the spelling up. because there were five Karens in my year at school and I knew I wanted to stand out. Even at 17 I wanted my writing to be remembered, and I thought that a memorable spelling would help me in that quest. Does it work?

WHAT IS A STEAMPUNK HIGH TEA?

Think tea, champagne, sandwiches, cakes and pastries in a tiered platter. Picture yourself cricking your little finger and dressing up all posh...

Ladies might like to think about wearing a corset or bustle, even leather or metal ones if the quasi Victorian/steampunk theme really takes their fancy. Gentlemen could consider wearing a top hat, or a leather cap and goggles. Simply google steampunk or Victorian clothing and you'll find heaps of ideas (try bustledress.com). Just remember that the steampunk high tea will be before Conflux officially opens and is a separate fee-paying event. We don't have a firm price yet but it will be in the vicinity of \$45.

BANQUET HIGHLIGHT

Due to the enormous success of the banquet at Conflux 4 in 2007, the banquet theme for 2013 will be Regency-Gothic.

WHAT IS REGENCY-GOTHIC?

Regency – the Regency era generally refers to the years between 1795 and 1837, a time of excess for the aristocracy, when <u>King</u> <u>George III</u> was deemed unfit to rule, and so his son, the Prince of Wales, ruled as <u>Prince Regent</u>. It was also a time of uncertainty, following the Napoleonic wars, periodic riots, and the French Revolution. It's often referred to as the "Age of Elegance" and is noted for its achievements in the fine arts and architecture.





Gothic – Horace Walpole's <u>The Castle of Otranto</u> (1764) is often regarded as the first true Gothic romance. Walpole was obsessed with medieval Gothic architecture, and built his own house, <u>Strawberry Hill</u>, in such a forbidding form it sparked a fashion for Gothic revival. The work of the Romantic poets (<u>Coleridge</u>, <u>Lord Byron</u> and <u>Keats</u>) furthered the rise of neo medieval imagery, as did gothic fiction such as <u>Mary Shelley</u>'s <u>Frankenstein</u> and <u>Polidori</u>'s <u>The Vampyre</u>. These were the chilling tales that paved the way for the fantasy and horror stories we know and love today.

REGENCY FOOD

Regency food is rich and scrumptious and, since we're recreating the menu of that fabulous Conflux 4 banquet (with a little polishing, as there was soooo much food!), you can get a sneak-peak at the delights in store by ordering Gillian Polack's *Five Historical Feasts* (see page 14), which details the previous menu among other things!

COST

Remember, the banquet will be an additional cost to the convention. It'll be a while before we finalise prices, but judging by past conventions, keep \$60 per seat available in your budget to take part.

COMPETITIONS

The convention theme for 2013 is Steam Angels Junk.

SHORT STORY COMPETITION

There will be a short story competition for Conflux 9, but the details haven't been confirmed yet. However, entries will most likely open in late 2012 and the theme will be the same as the convention: steam, angels, junk. You will have to be a Conflux 9 member (Supporting or Full Membership) to enter and the usual competition rules will apply (ie. your story must not be published elsewhere, nor have won a place in any other competition). Stories that fail in any of these elements will be judged ineligible. More details to come in the next PR but in the meantime – let the muse sit quietly and work!



CONFLUX ART COMPETITION

There will also be an art competition. Again, the details of the competition haven't been fixed yet. However, as in previous years, artists will be welcome to display their works at the Conflux Art Show. To be eligible for judging, works must be exhibited at the Conflux Convention from Noon Thursday to Noon Sunday. Works may be sold at the Convention, but purchasers should not collect works until Noon Sunday. Nicole and Donna will have the forms ready for you asap but, in the meantime, start thinking about a piece of art that you can display in April 2013!



THE E. G. HARVEY AWARD FOR AUSTRALIAN SF ART

The E.G. Harvey Award for Australian Speculative Fiction Art is for the best original visual art work produced by an Australian artist in the previous 12 months. Judging will be made from works exhibited at the annual Conflux Art Show by a panel of non-participating artists. The medium for the work may be acrylic. oils, watercolour, pencil and/or ink, charcoal, mixed medium, sculpture, photography, animation and video-works. The value of the award is AU\$500. To be eligible for judging, works must be exhibited at the Conflux Convention from Noon Thursday to Noon Sunday. Works may be sold at the Convention, but purchasers should not collect works until Noon Sunday. So, again, start thinking about a piece of art that you can display in April 2013!


