- · settings where steam power is widely used
- futuristic innovations as Victorians might have envisioned them

Steampunk also refers to art, fashion and design as informed by the aesthetics of steampunk literature.

Due to the enormous success of the banquet at Conflux 4 in 2007, the banquet theme for 2013 will be Regency-Gothic.


REGENCY FOOD

GOING REGENCY-GOTHIC

WHAT IS REGENCY?

The Regency era generally refers to the years between 1795 and 1837, a time of excess for the aristocracy, when King George III was deemed unfit to rule, and so his son, the Prince of Wales, ruled as Prince Regent.

It was also a time of uncertainty, following the Napoleonic wars, periodic riots, and the French Revolution. It's often referred to as the "Age of Elegance" and is noted for its achievements in the fine arts and architecture.



Regency fashion is all about the natural shape of the human body. Forget corsets and hoops - think slender silhouettes.

WHAT IS GOTHIC?

Horace Walpole's "The Castle of Otranto" (1764) is often regarded as the first true Gothic romance. Walpole was obsessed with medieval Gothic architecture, and built his own house, Strawberry Hill, in such a forbidding form it sparked a fashion for Gothic revival.

The work of the Romantic poets (Coleridge, Lord Byron and Keats) furthered the rise of neo medieval imagery, as did gothic fiction such as Mary Shelley's Frankenstein and Polidori's "The Vampyre". These were the chilling tales that paved the way for the fantasy and horror stories we know and love today.



Gothic fashion, on the other hand, is all about dark, sometimes morbid, eroticized clothing.

ACCOMMODATION

Don't wait to reserve your room onsite at Rydges Capital Hill! Conflux 9 has bargained a great standard room rate:

\$160 per night for bed and breakfast!!!

Please start your booking now so we can fill up the hotel and have it to ourselves!



You can use your credit card to secure your booking over the phone without charge. Don't worry if your card will expire before Conflux 2013, you can simply update it closer to the convention time with the new card number and expiry date.

HOW TO BOOK

Just call the hotel on +61 2 6295 3144 and book quoting this reference code F-2504CI

The \$160 convention rate is available from 24 April to 28 April 2013 and covers two people for a room including two buffet breakfasts. There are also a range of rooms:

- Superior Queen Room with a Queen Size Bed, 1 sofa bed is upon request
- Superior Twin Room with Two separate Double Size Beds
- Superior Queen room with accessible facilities
- Executive King Suite with a King Size Bed (\$180)
- Embassy Suite with a King Size Bed with a separate lounge area (\$200)

Two adults and two children under 12 can share a room at no additional cost. However, for children over 5 and under 12 the breakfast is charged at an additional \$12 per child. Children 5 years and under have a complimentary breakfast from the buffet. Cots are complimentary but please request one. They are available subject to availability.

The hotel has advised us that there is an additional charge of \$74 for a third person sharing a room, which includes a breakfast. You cannot negotiate a price without the breakfast, because of the nature of our deal. This additional charge covers additional towels, servicing, and set up if a sofa bed is required. The hotel has advised that they have limited occupation in the rooms to three adults. Given this additional charge, it's not cost-effective for four people to share a room.

The other thing to note is that while other discounts do not apply for the accommodation, priority cards can be use for discounts on meals, etc.

The venue is surrounded by a number of alternative accommodation options - we'll let you know the best ones nearer the time.


- 2. Tell us twelve random facts about yourself.





VENUE


Conflux 2013 will be held in conference rooms at the Rydges Capital Hill, in Barton, ACT.




