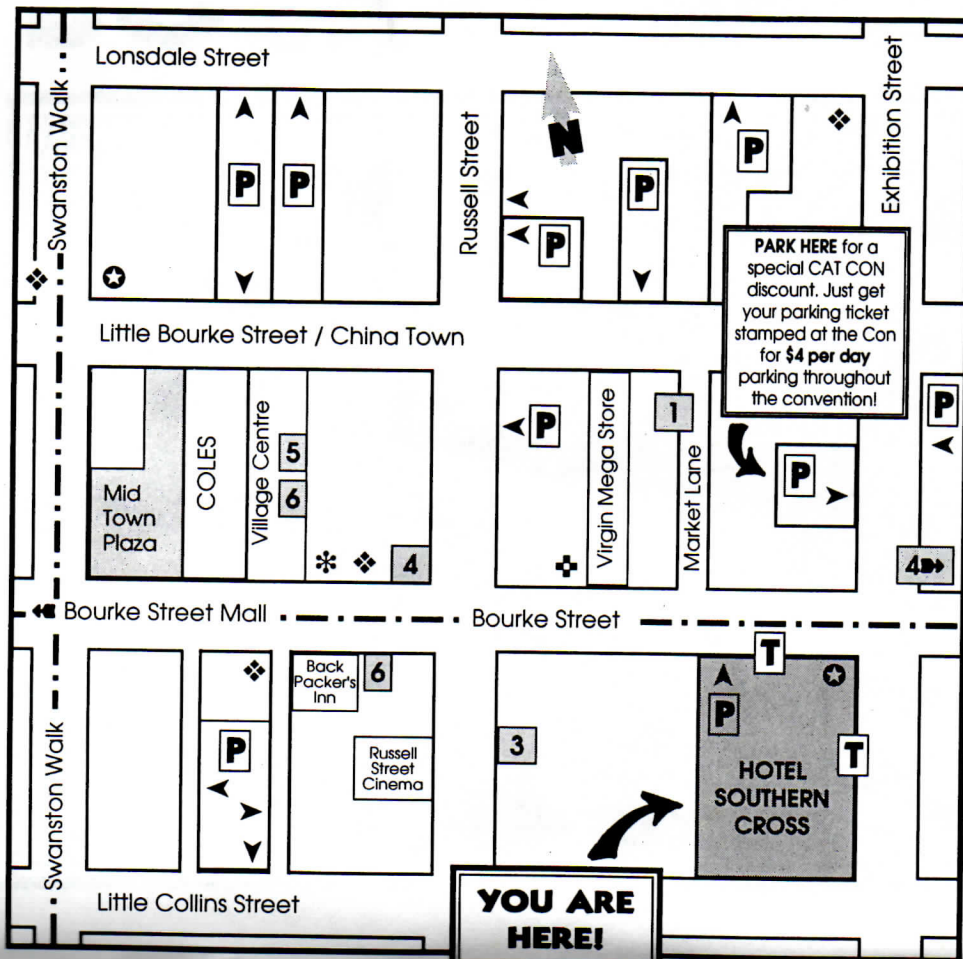

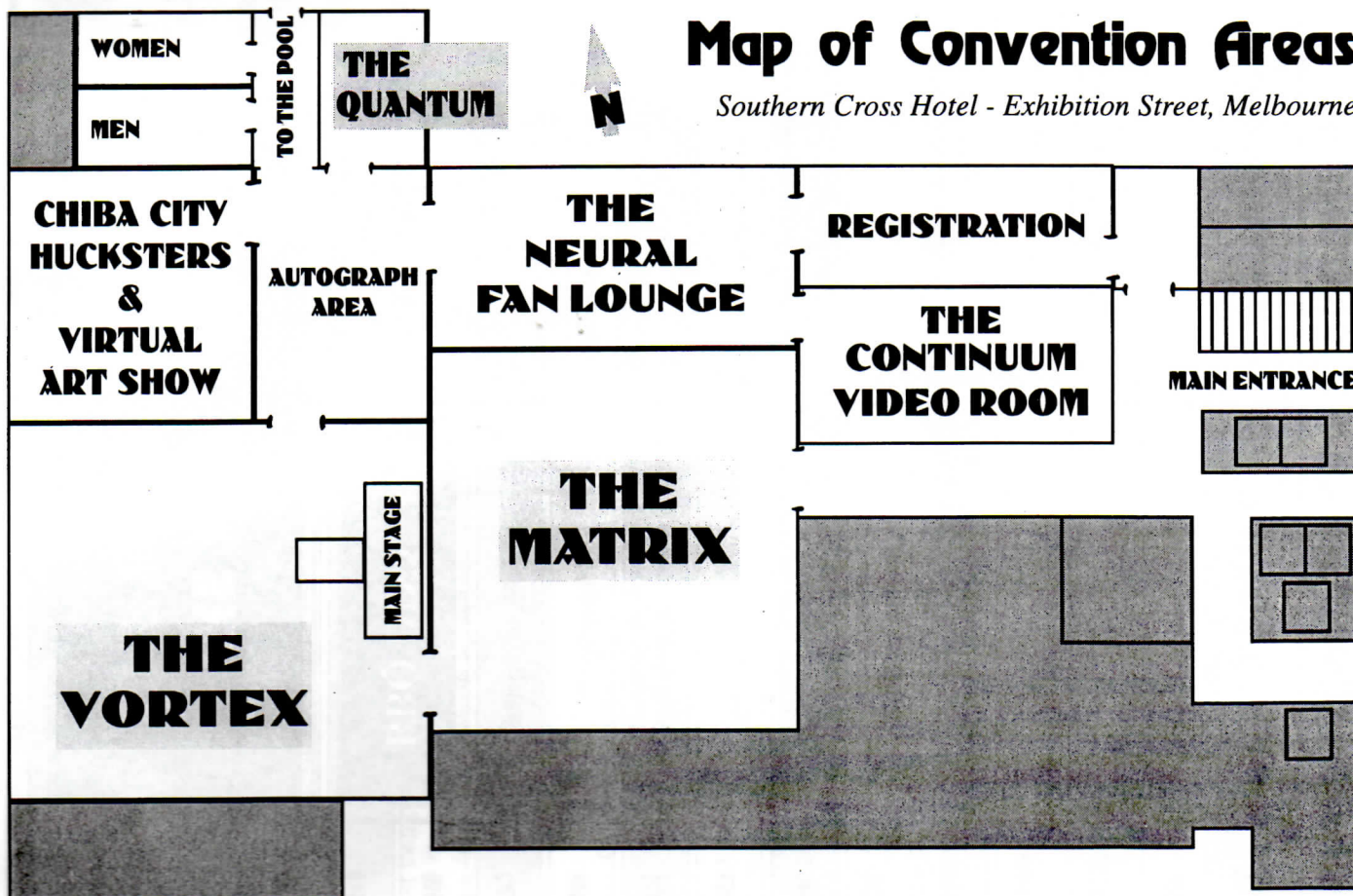
Where to find FOOD!

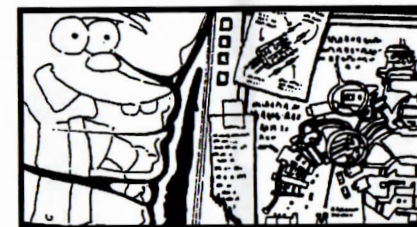

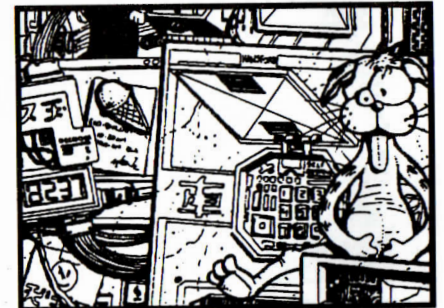

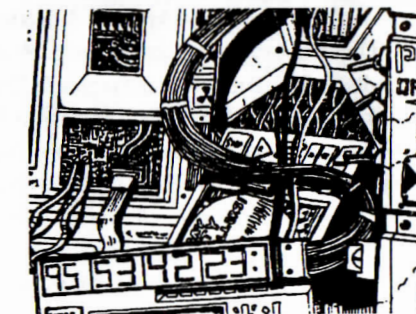

3:00p.m. Blake's 7 - "Blake"

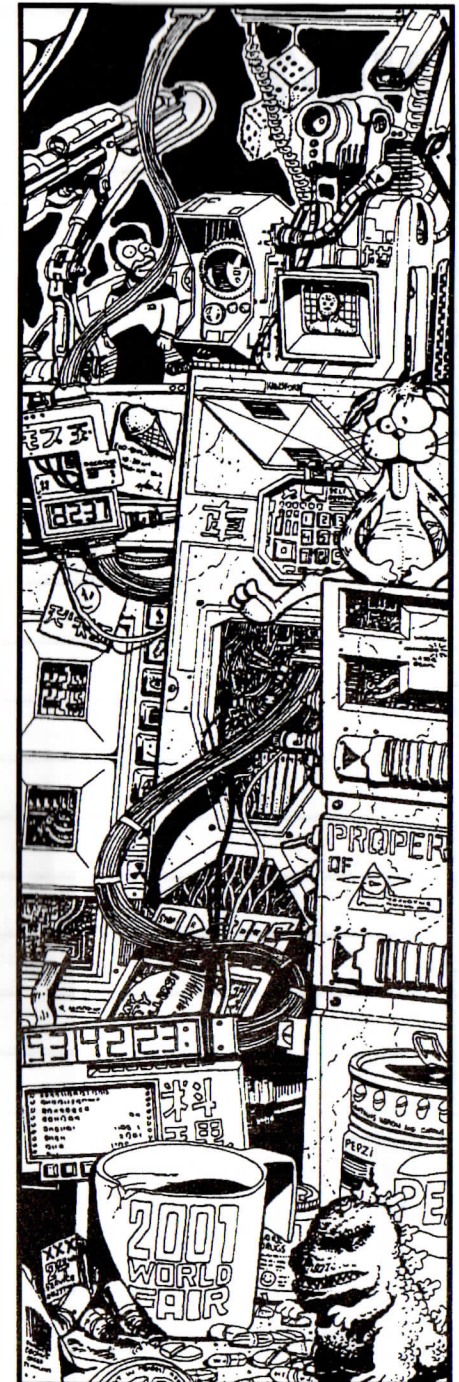
Excellent series. Great final scene.

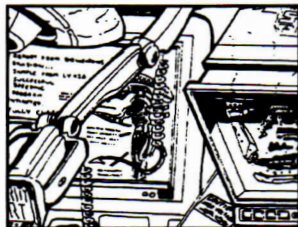
4:30p.m. D*A*A*S Kapital
