



SO YOU WANT TO STAY AT CONSTANTINOPLE?

The main convention hotel is The Southern Cross, 131 Exhibition Street, Melbourne 3000.

Constantinople has negotiated room rates for convention members who want to stay at either at the Southern Cross or nearby at the Chateau Melbourne.

Accommodation at the Southern Cross costs convention members \$100 per night for a single, double or twin room. A triple room is \$130 per night.

Car parking underneath the hotel is free for members who stay at the Southern Cross. You get one car space per room.

We have arranged other accommodation at the Chateau Melbourne, 131 Lonsdale Street, Melbourne 3000.

It will cost CONSTANTINOPLE members \$70 per night, single, double or twin room. A triple room will cost \$85 per night.

PARKING YOUR CAR.

If you are not staying at Constantinople, but are coming by car, you may be interested in our \$4.00 per entry deal with Duke Car Parking in the Bourke Plaza Car Park, 110 Bourke Street, Melbourne. The discount rate applies from Thursday 31st of March to Monday April 4th 1994.


