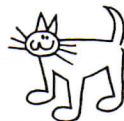
The His And Hers Bookshops

Constantinople has been fortunate in acquiring the presence of several special people to talk about their experience writing Dr Who novels or working on the set of Dr Who.

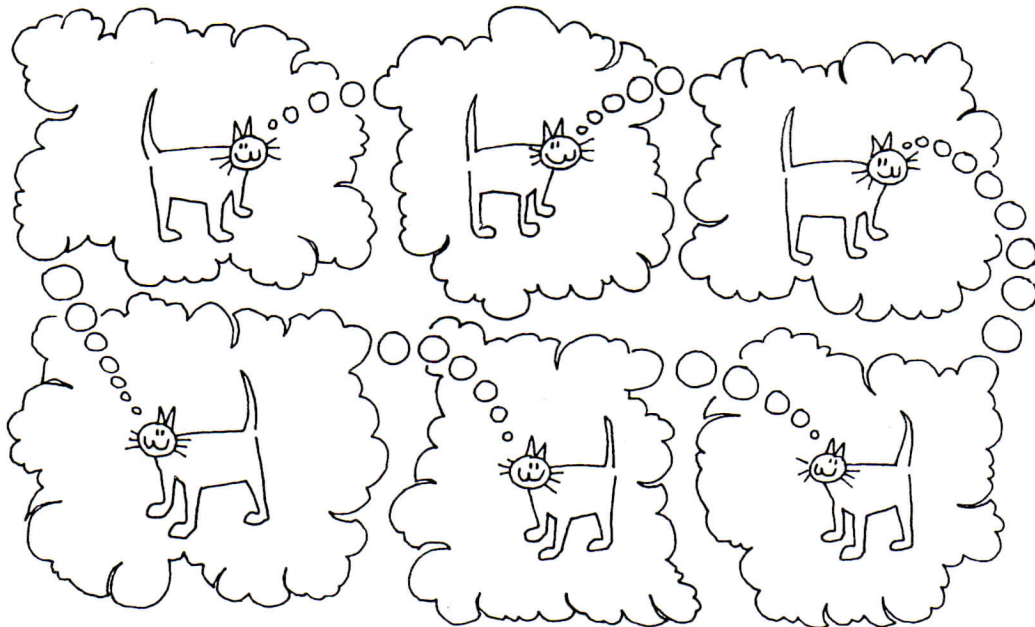

Who's not coming to Constantinople?

With our radically liberal government here in Victoria, lead by the redoubtable Jeff Kennett, the emphasis has ever been on installing, wherever possible, the "User Pays" system of government. Constantinople, inspired by this new philosophy and disappointed by the seeming lack of interest in Colin Baker as Guest of Honour, sent letters to all the Doctor Who fans they could find. The gist of this letter was (in keeping with this new philosophy) to see Mr. Baker they must pay to bring him out.

It was a bold attempt to achieve what in these economic times seemed otherwise near impossible, and sadly doomed to failure. For those who rallied to the cause and sent in their money we

thank you but must say there were not enough of you to make a difference. If the other attractions at our convention (such as Sandra Reid, Kate Orman, and Robert Jewell) cannot tempt you into attending the convention then refunds will be issued.

To those of you who rang or wrote to us saying that if Colin Baker came to the convention then you would not, well you will be pleased. Please send your money forthwith.

To order your refund you must notify Constantinople of your wish, in writing, before March 31st 1994.



Sleeping Around At Constantinople!

You'll find that hard to do at Constantinople, *sleep* I mean, if you don't have a room. You have a choice of sleeping on site at the Convention by staying at the Southern Cross Hotel (Five Star hotel you know). Or you can go off site for peace and quiet at the Chateau Melbourne a short five minute walk from the Southern Cross Hotel.

If you choose to stay at the Southern Cross, their room cost are for convention members \$100 per night for a single, double or a twin room. A triple room will cost \$130 per night.

Accommodation at the Chateau Melbourne is \$70 per night single, double or twin room. A triple room costs \$85 per night. Check in time for the Chateau Melbourne is after 1 pm. Check out time before 11 am.

Breakfast is not included in the room rate for either hotel, but an extra \$12.50 will get you a full buffet breakfast at the Chateau Melbourne. Breakfast at the Southern Cross is \$18.00 (Five Star hotel you know).

Please book your room through Constantinople That way we can be sure you will be charged the convention rate. One night room deposit is required with your booking form. Please make out a separate cheque for your hotel room and *please* make it payable to the hotel

\$4.00 per Entry!!! *Parking we mean.*

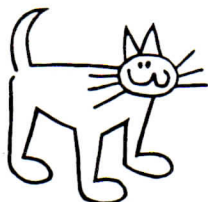

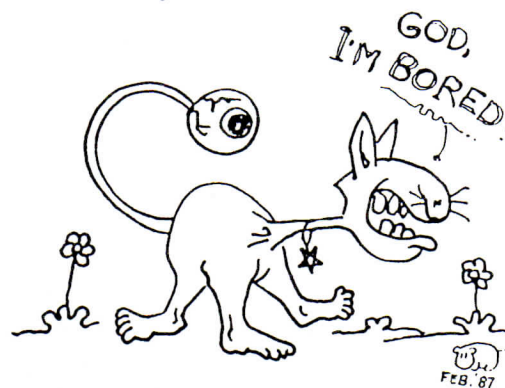

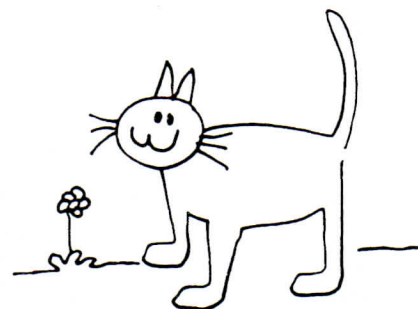
