The Dalek Tapes (11 min) 1995

It is widely known that in 1966, Dalek creator Terry Nation attempted to launch an all-new series based around his mechanical creations. What is not so widely known is that in 1968 the project entered recording, resulting in a television series so provocative, so daring and so radical for it's time that the British Broadcasting Corporation buried it deep within it's vaults and destroyed all records of it's existence until now. With the aid of painstakingly written notes by the original series producer, Albert Q, the Psychic Circus has rescored and remastered these original television productions for their first public viewing, nearly thirty years after they were completed.
