The following information is for people planning a costume for the Convergence 2002 Masquerade. We recommend that you read it carefully to avoid disappointments on the night.

The Masquerade is traditionally, in costuming circles, an opportunity to show off the costumer's creative side in not only constructing and wearing costume, but also in its presentation. While Melbourne has had a long and vital association with costume fandom, through both the Australian Costumers' Guild and the SCA – Society for Creative Anachronism, ConVergence 2002 felt that the Natcon's role in Costume was broader than that of the dedicated costuming organisations. So, with that in mind, ConVergence 2002 is planning something a little different for its Masquerade. Blatantly cashing in on the success of the 2001 Natcon held in Perth, this year's Natcon is planning a costumed party! However, bearing in mind Melbourne's remarkable costuming fan base, there will also be an opportunity for costumers to present their creations in a more traditional parade.

The Maskobalo will be held on the Sunday night during the convention (9 June) and will feature guest DJs who, by the way, have strong connections with Australian SF although an eclectic taste in music. Maskobalo is open to all ConVergence 2002 attending members (Full, Day, Student and Child). Complimentary snacks will be provided and drinks will be at bar prices.

So come in costume or at the very least a mask. Prizes will be awarded for hall costumes – thus reviving another long-standing fannish tradition that has fallen by the wayside. #### Art Show Update

The Art Show is shaping up well with a number of entries so far and I am very much looking forward to seeing some diverse and interesting art works. This is certainly the ideal opportunity for artists of varied fields to display their works, as the theme for the Art Show leaves the scope of possibilities wide open.

"ConVergence 2002: Celebrating the Past, Present and Future" is the Art Show theme. With ConVergence 2002 celebrating the 50th anniversary of Science Fiction Natcons in Australia, it is a most fitting theme, as it gives us an opportunity to reflect upon a vast history of science fiction and fantasy adventures (and misadventures) and also, in that grand science fiction tradition, an opportunity to speculate about what the next 50 years (or more) has in store. Pieces can draw upon upon existing art works, games, novels, movies or anything else imaginable, or art works can be 100% original. If your art work is a reproduction you must state the particulars of the original on your entry form. If merely drawing inspiration from a pre-existing work, giving particulars of this would also be useful.

Criteria for entry is that the art work must be of either science fiction, fantasy, horror or related genre and that the work must in some way encompass the Art Show theme. The theme is open to interpretation and it is not necessary to encompass details from past, present and the future as you may elect to focus on one aspect only. Full details of rules and regulations can be accessed through the website, or you may contact the Art Show Co-Ordinator for a copy to be mailed to you. ## Report on the 2002 Ditmar Awards Nominations

As a result of the nomination process, the final ballot for the 2002 Australian Science Fiction Achievement Awards (Ditmars) is enclosed with this Progress Report. As specified in the rules, the finalists appear in randomised order.

There was a minor glitch in the nomination process when the version of the nominating ballot sent out with Progress Report No. 3 went out without a Short Fiction category. That was followed by an individual posting of a corrected nominating ballot to all members of ConVergence 2002. These were posted in December 2001. Nominating ballots were also sent out with ANZAPA, Thyme and Ethel the Aardvark. Our thanks to Alan Stewart and to the MSFC (Melbourne Science Fiction Club) for their assistance. Multiple copies were sent to Ghengis Con and made available at the Nova Mob and at Slow Glass Books. Again, thanks to those organisations. Single copies were sent to some thirty clubs and bookshops with a covering letter giving express permission to copy them. I don't know how many were done.

Nomination forms were made available on the web and advertised on aus.sf and were sent electronically to any fan requesting them. From memory, I sent out about three in that way.

There was a misunderstanding over whether or not there should be an award for Novelette/Novella. It did not appear as a separate category on the nomination form but, had there been a large number of longer works nominated, the Short Fiction category could have been split. As it is, **Jack Dann's** *The Diamond Pit* is the only nomination which I know would definitely fit into that category. (And I only know that because it is on the Nebula short list in the Novella category.). Given that none of the nominators included word counts for the other nominations, I have no idea whether or not any of the other nominations would have fitted into the longer category.

One ballot with no identification, either on the ballot or on the envelope in which it was posted, was received and so was not counted. Four nomination forms were received after the nomination deadline, plus one addition to the nomination form. Since I had already emailed those people who were short-listed for the final ballot before those nominations were received, I did not count them. Attempts were made to contact all nominees to ensure that they were happy to be on the final ballot. Of those nominated, only four did not respond, three of whom had nominated the items that appeared on the ballot and so it was assumed that they had no problem with those items appearing. **Adrian Gaetano** received enough nominations to be on the final ballot in the Best Fan Writer category but declined.

There were 14 nominations in the Best Australian Artwork category but no nominee received the four nominations required to appear on the final ballot. There were nine individual nominations in the William Atheling Jr Award but none received the two nominations required to make it onto the ballot. Other details appear on the final ballot form. I intend to publish the full details of nominations following ConVergence 2002.

#### The Video Stream

One of the nice things about working on ConVergence 2002 is the chance to offer the members a nice little free treat in the form of a Video Program. Rather than just throw together a bunch of random vids, I'm attempting to try and compliment the main program where possible. So, for example, after a panel on Doctor Who and another on Douglas Adams, the video program will be showing a Doctor Who story penned by Douglas Adams while he was the show's script editor. I love introducing people to shows or films that otherwise they may never have discovered and so I've done some real digging for this program. In fact, the biggest problem has been in deciding what to show, as I've ended up with so much good and occasionally rare stuff that deciding not to show some items in favour of others has been downright painful. Below is a short list of just a handful of things you'll be seeing at ConVergence 2002.

The Day of the Triffids: The 1980's BBC adaption of the book by **John Wyndham**.

Buffy, the unscreened pilot: Pretty rough but with interesting changes nevertheless.

The Overnight Anime stream: Starting with Grave of Fire Flies, this overnight stream is about showing just how clever, classy and thought provoking Anime can be. No multi-tentacled monsters chasing schoolgirls here.

Chuck Jones: A variety of the late great **Chuck Jones**' cartoons will be spread throughout the entire program.

Dracula: The 1931 Spanish version. The direction on this film is vastly superior to the **Bela Lugosi** version. It was shot at night using the same sets and script.

The Five Dog Night: Five films picked simply because they are obscenely awful but madly entertaining. Come along and heckle the dumbness of both the hero and villain. Marvel at the inept direction and the crappy monsters. Special bonus features a film so bad, the company never wanted it released!

1984: The British adaption of George Orwell's novel by Nigel Kneale. Made in 1954, it stars Peter Cushing.

Invasion Earth: The six parts BBC series about alien invasion. Dark, gritty, nasty with excellent characterisation and a story that keeps you hooked.

I'm also hoping to locate a handful of films and TV shows that have ties to our guests. Either things that they believe are important to the genre or that have a personal significance for them. And, naturally, there will be episodes of both popular and rare TV series. Two of the Lexx telemovies, Alien Nation, Space Patrol, Batman Animated, Sapphire and Steel, Reboot, Prey, Out of the Unknown, The Survivors and Catweazle to name but a few. Plus at least one TV series never before screened in Australia. So, whatever your tastes, I'm sure you will be able to find something on the program to spark your interest. — **Danny Heap**.

### The Convergence 2002 Program Highlights

The program for ConVergence 2002 has been gradually developing over the last few months and is near to a final draft. By the time you read this, the program, as it currently stands, will be available from the convention website. There are still a few alterations to be made and a small number of panels that require speakers. Comments and suggestions are welcome – we want to produce a really great program!

Highlights of the program include: a multitude of book launches (seven so far!); academic presentations by some of the leading Australian SF professionals covering topics as varied as biotechnology, romance and chivalry, vampires, **Arthur C. Clarke** and artificial intelligence; author and story readings; writer workshops with published authors; discussions on many of your favourite TV programs and movies including *Buffy*, *Doctor Who, Babylon 5, Star Trek, Star Wars* and *Anime*. Other topics for discussion include *Tin Tin* (the comic book guy), urban legends, mad scientists, life on a big planet, young adult literature, the role of gay, lesbian and bisexual characters in SF and humourous SF.

As this year is the 50th anniversary of organised fandom in Australia, there is a strong Timebinders stream within the program. World fandom in 1952, early Australian fandom and fandom in the mid-1980s all feature as topics for discussions. In addition, there are tellings of famous fannish tales, a screening of classic fan films of the past and a debate on the future or Australian SF natcons.

For those who are after a bit of late night entertainment, we are pleased to bring you the hit of Swancon 26 – Raw Cordial. **Grant Watson** and **Simon Oxwell** will once again bring you a late-night session of interviews, audience participation and lots fun and laughter. **Danny Heap** has also promised one of his infamously evil (but fun) quizzes so watch out for a man carrying clothes pegs and marshmallows.

For those with an interest in the art of writing there are great insights into the world of the writer in segments on reviewing fiction, getting published, living with a writer and writing for a TV/movie franchise. In addition, we have secured access to a room dedicated to author readings from fiction and non-fiction to poetry. And, of course, don't forget the regular GsOH speeches, the awards ceremony, the auction, the room parties, filking and the Maskobalo! — Sue Ann Barber.

#### ASFC Business Meetings for 2002

The Business Meeting of the 2002 Australian Science Fiction Convention will be held on Sunday, 9 June 2002, from 9 am to 11 am. Check the Program Guide at the convention for the location of this meeting.

The Business Meeting will be followed immediately by the Site Selection Meeting, when the site selection for the 2004 Australian Science Fiction Convention (ASFC) will be made. All members of ConVergence 2002 are entitled to participate in, and vote at, the Business Meetings. All proposed changes to the Constitution of the ASFC must be submitted to the Chair of the Business Meeting, Jack Herman (pressco@fl.net.au), before 1 May 2002, in order to appear in the Program Book for the convention. (The rules governing the Business Meeting were included in Progress Report No. 3)

#### Australian Science Fiction Convention Site Selection for 2004

Bids for the 2004 ASFC must be in the hands of the Business Meeting Chair by 5 pm on Saturday, 8 June 2002. The Bid must contain the name of the city in which the Convention will be held, the dates for the proposed Convention, and the names of the responsible Committee.

Site Selection will be by open ballot of the members of ConVergence 2002 at a meeting to be held immediately after the Business Meeting on Sunday, 9 June 2002. All bidding Committees will be entitled to make a ten minutes presentation. After all presentations, there will be a general question time before the vote is taken.

After the Site Selection process is completed, representatives of future conventions and bids for future world or national conventions may make any presentation they desire. The meeting will then be open to a general discussion of the future of Conventions as well as future conventions.
