# Message from the Chair

The ConVergence 2002 Committee (Concom) has been working hard over the past few months on several aspects of planning for the 2002 National Convention (Natcon). Details can be found inside this Progress Report and also on our website.

A major incentive has been the introduction of a Lay-By Scheme for those wanting to obtain membership to ConVergence (full details on Page No. 2 and on our website). The Concom is mindful that \$130 can be difficult to come up with all at once, especially to pay for an event that is due to take place over twelve months in the future. So it is hoped that by letting people pay off their membership in installments, it will make it easier for them to become part of the fun and excitement of the Natcon. The next major step is planning the program, which is an integral part of any convention, as well as organising some of the more formal celebrations marking the 50th anniversary of the Australian Natcon. It is an opportunity to look at the science fiction of yesterday, the science facts of today and the infinite possibilities of tomorrow. Members will be able to indulge their interests in Science Fiction, Fantasy and Horror across all mediums (including film, TV and literature) over four fun packed days of discussions, workshops, celebrations and parties.

Race Mathews, our Fan Guest of Honour, attended the very first Natcon which was held in Sydney in 1952, albeit there is now some dissension over if in fact that was the year in which the first Australian National Science Fiction Convention was actually held. Never a dull moment in fandom and the controversy bodes well for lively and interesting discussion about the history of the Australian Natcon, not forgetting the celebrations to mark this momentous event.

We are now looking for people who were part of those early days, not only to join the convention, but also to participate in some of the items relating to this anniversary or to set us straight on the history of Australian fandom and the Natcons. Were you there during the early days? Do you know somebody who was but is not a member of ConVergence 2002, or worse, does not know about it? Then please get in touch with us. Pass along this information or Progress Report to any friends, fans and others who may be interested or may have something important to contribute. This is a call to arms of all things fannish or Science Fiction and Fantasy related over the last 50 years.

The Masquerade will be run along Australian Costumers' Guild guidelines, the most pertinent of which are:

- 1. Your costume must not be made or trimmed with any messy substances (The Peanut Butter Rule) as these can damage another entrant's costume. (Who believes in an Evil Overlord who is covered with sparkles from the previous Queen Titania entrant?)
- 2. No fire, no flame, no flashes, no firecrackers, no explosions, NO EXCEPTIONS. Taped effects will have to suffice.
- 3. There will be a maximum time limit on stage, depending on how many people are in the entry. This is open to negotiation with the Masquerade Director (but I'm tough).
- 4. It will be run as an indirect competition. That is, each entry will be judged against what the judges see the award-winning standard to be. This means you will not be competing against anyone if there are two great entries in a category, there will be two awards in that category. You do not have to beat anyone else.

# Guests of Honour Updates

The following is only a brief summary of some of our guests' most current (at time of print) activities/ projects etc. Their individual websites should be checked for further details. (See under "Guests" on the Convergence 2002 Website. Note: Lucy Sussex's website is still "under construction".)

Sean Williams and Shane Dix have sold US publisher Del Rey a trilogy of Star Wars New Jedi Order novels. None of the details of the novels had been settled at the print of this Progress Report. Recently, Sean visited Star Wars producer/director George Lucas' Skywalker Ranch to brainstorm titles and storylines. "There's a chance we could be writing the last three books in the series," says Sean. "If that means we get to kill anyone off, I don't know (after all, they've already topped poor old Chewie); we can only keep our fingers crossed." Sean has also been honoured as part of the South Australia Day celebrations, winning the 2000 South Australian Great Award for Literature.

Joe Haldeman's latest published book is *The Coming* (Ace, 2000). Of the storyline, Joe says, "This is a first-contact story, in a way, it's also the story of a small town fifty years from now in a Florida that hasn't improved with age. An astronomer fighting politics of the garden and academic varieties while trying to protect her husband's dark secret. A little Hispanic and Mafia culture thrown in for spice, and virtual-reality sex in different flavors." Currently, he is working on *Listen to the Raven*, a hard-sf novel set in 1894, 1952, 2004, and points beyond. He has also finished the first draft of a screenplay of *Mindbridge*. On the "back burner" are the novels *Reset* and *Out of Phase*. Joe will be attending the Nebula Awards Weekend in Los Angeles, in April, as part of the LA Times Festival of Books.

**Lucy Sussex's** ABsolute Uncertainty will be published in the April issue of F&SF. It is a story about the physicist Heinsenberg and his complicity, or not, with the Nazi regime. Lucy was also interviewed through the PhillipKDick.com. She talks about Kay & Phil which was in the Penguin Book of Modern Fantasy by Women (& Alien Shores) and postulates a meeting between Phillip K Dick and the writer Katherine Burdekin. A piece she wrote about the origins of the story and the writing of it is also on the site.

Our Toastmaster, **Jack Dann**, had his story *Marilyn* shortlisted for the 2000 Aurealis Awards. Jack will be appearing as a guest of Swancon 2001 (See Back Page for details) where he'll be launching his *Jubilee*. This is described by HarperCollins as the "Essential Jack Dann. A collection of his short fiction which showcases his originality, range, and narrative power — which also demonstrates why critics have compared his work to that of Jorge Luis Borges, Roald Dahl, J.G. Ballard, Philip K. Dick and others." Jack adds, "the book will have a gorgeous cover by Nick Stathopoulos and an introduction by John Kessel. It will weigh in at somewhere around 170,000 words. As Gardner Dozois would say: "a bugcrusher". Jack will also be appearing at the 2001 Sydney Writers' Festival.

### **Weapons Policy**

No weapons are to be brought to, worn or carried at any time during the convention (including water pistols, real or replica guns, swords or knives), unless approved as part of an official event. Only the convention organisers may approve such weapons and their participation in any event. Please see the supplementary set of rules for the Masquerade.

### Smoking, Drug and Alcohol Policy

The use of illegal drugs is expressly forbidden within the convention site. Alcohol may not be brought into the convention site and may only be consumed within the confines of the convention site if purchased from official sources, i.e. bars and restaurants. What you do in your own hotel room is your own business, although most accommodation providers would not approve of you "bonging on". As the convention has secured the entire Hotel Y for ConVergence 2002 members, there will be few restrictions on room parties and such. However, guests will be liable for any malicious damage that is caused by them. Furthermore, the convention organisers reserve the right to eject any troublemakers from the convention, the convention site and the on-site hotel.
