For comic fans there are also two pages of original GREEN LANTERN artwork by Gil Kane and a page of METAMORPHO. These have also been loaned to us by Noel Kerr.

Other exhibits care a collection of fantasy drawings by Dimitri; a collection of future fashions (womans) by myself, and several large fantsy works by Rona S. Devlin, including a page from her comic strip character, PUTTYMAN. Lastly there is the original cover and contents page from Bacchanalia, drawn by W.K.Mc Lelland.

This display is a new idea for Melbourne conventions and we hope, the start of a tradition.




