

Professional Guest of Honour

MERVYN BINNS

Our Professional Guest of Honour, MERVYN BINNS, is a Founding Member of the Melbourne Science Fiction Club, an informal group of friends of science fiction and fantasy, which was opened in 1952 and has been meeting regularly once a week ever since.

That's quite a record. Those of you who have only recently discovered sf might find it hard to imagine what it was like in the Dark Ages, when you had to look hard to uncover the twenty-odd titles published in a given year (the current figure is more like sixty titles per MONTH!). For more than a decade Mervyn struggled to maintain the widest variety of sf and fantasy being published, working from McGill's News-agency in Elizabeth Street. Through him sf fans throught Australia were able to widen their reading with bootleg American paperbacks imported from, of all places, England; his mail order service was redoubtable.

Throught the Fifties and Sixties Mervyn was more active than anyone else in promoting sf in Australia. He was instrumental in organizing a number of conventions held in Melbourne and has been active in the long-term organization of the 33rd World Science Fiction Convention which will be held in Melbourne next year. His recent tour of England and the U.S.A. has given him a unique insight into overseas affairs. In all respects he is Mr. Science Fiction in Australia, and if not a Living Legend, then perhaps a Near Myth.

In 1971 Mervyn left McGill's and opened SPACE AGE BOOKS. The rest is fannish history. The wildly successful shop has recently moved to enormous premises a few doors down Swanston Street and the stock is expanding prodigeously. At any one time you will find between six and eight hundred individual sf and fantasy titles in stock: what more could you want?

The Melbourne Science Fiction Club still holds regular Tuesday night meetings in their clubroom above Space Age. For as well as being a good businessman Mervyn has remained a fan; the sf club is somehow inseperable from the bookshop - and from the man, and probably always will be.

But this is only an interim report. When we honour Mervyn Binns at this convention we will be honouring Australian Science Fiction as well, for they are inseperable. In 1975 he will see a dream come true when the WorldCon opens; and that is why we have chosen him as out Professional Guest of Honour for OZCON. We could not hope for a finer representative of the extraordinary world-wide collective we call science fiction fandom.

In 1966 something went wrong in the life of John Bangsund. One minute he was quietly contributing to the fanzines of John Foyster and Lee Harding and the next minute he was producing his own fanzine, and not a modest little publication like the ones Lee and John had been producing. AUSTRALIAN SCIENCE FICTION REVIEW gathered behind it the writing might of all Australian fandom and marched forward into the pages of fan history. Since that time John Bangsund has gradually become a real blood and bones fannish myth. He produces exquisite fanzines with seeming ease and dreams up fannish project by the bushell, projects the like of which most fans simply dream of dreaming up.

In person he is an instantly likable person with a quick wit. Conversation with him is always enjoyable and we are glad to be able to have him at our convention as our Fan Guest of Honour.

DUFF

DUFF is the Down Under Fan Fund, it was begun in 1972 to bring an American Science Fiction Fan to the Australian Science Fiction Convention that year. year a DUFF race was run to take an Australian fan to the World Science Fiction Convention which will be held in Washington DC. USA in two weeks time. The winner of the race was Leigh Edmonds (who wishes to thank everybody who supported him and the fund) and, apart from going to America, he now also has to serve as the Australian Amdinistrator of the fund. In 1975 DUFF will bring an American fan to our World Convention and already Leigh is busy at work and if you corner him at OZCON'74 he will sell you a copy of "Lesleigh's Adventured Down Under", a report of the 1972 DUFF trip, for a mere dollar which will go towards the 1975 fund.

WRITERS WORKSHOP

For many years writers workshops have been popular in the USA but have not been possible in Australia because of the smallness of the population of this country and because of the lack of a science fiction industry. Therefore we are very pleased to be able to incorporate a Writers Workshop into OZCON'74 though in fact the Workshop and the convention are being run quite seperately.

We hope that those who participate in this workshop will learn from their experience and also that it will encourage them to continue with their writing efforts.

The Workshop sessions will take place in the Warratah Room of the Victoria on Saturday and Sunday mornings at llam. Only people who have submitted manuscripts will be allowed to attend but we hope that those who attend will later share their experiences with others as encouragement to them.

BUSINESS SESSION

The main business of the Business Session will be the selection of the site for the 1975 Australian Science Fiction Convention. Any group wishing to bid should have notified the Chairman, Ken Ford, in writing in advance of the meeting. Notification of an intention to move any motions at the meeting should also be given to the Chairman in writing beforehand.

ART SHOW

John Breden has organized the Art Show for OZCON'74. Various conventions previous to this one have attempted displays of various sorts but for the first time we are able to present the works of various Australian artists in the science fiction and fantasy fields. Though the art show area will be kept seperate from the general convention area we encourage you to spend as much time as you like looking at the exhibits. And we hope that some of the works might be made available in the auction.
