Amateur Science Fiction and Fantasy Competition

Instead of the usual short story competition, this year we are running

something a little different. Swancon 2001: Masquerade is proud to present

the first Amateur Science Fiction competition, sponsored by the Australian Science Fiction Foundation. This competition will accept submissions in four categories: written fiction, visual media, sound media, and a junior

achievement category (under 16).

Competition Rules

- The Amateur SF&F Competition is open to Australian residents or Swancon 2001 members only.
- * The theme of the competition is 'Things are not what they seem'.
- * Entries must be original, fictitious and cannot be based upon

existing series, properties or characters.

- * Entries must not have been previously published, nor have been the recipient of a prize.
- * The judges' decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered in to.
- * Entrants must agree to having their entries published in a fanzine or on a website, although Swancon 2001 is under no obligation to do so.

Submission Rules

With each individual item submitted please include: Title of Piece; Notes on Display; Original or Reproduction; Is this Item for Sale; Minimum Bid; Name; Address; Email Address.

- * Up to 3 entries may be submitted by each entrant.
- * The name of the entrant must only appear on the cover page of the submission and nowhere else.
- * Each written fiction entry should consist of a short story, maximum length of 5000 words.
- * The submission must be typed, in an easily readable form.
- * Each visual media entry should consist of one short fictional film or animation, maximum length of 20 minutes.
- * The submission must be on good quality VHS tape, and accompanied by a cover letter with the contributor's name and the title of the submission(s).
- * Each sound media entry should consist of one short fictional radio-play, maximum length of 20 minutes.

- * The submission must be on good quality audio tape cassette, and accompanied by a cover letter with the contributor's name and the title of the submission(s).
- * Any written fiction, visual media or sound media which follow the above guidelines may be submitted to the junior achievement category by authors younger than 16 years of age.
- * Submissions will only be posted back if a self addressed stamped envelope is included (with sufficient postage and large enough to contain your entry).
- * Please do not submit your original, submit a copy.
- * Electronic submissions of written fiction will be accepted with consultation.
- * The judges reserve the right to deliver a verdict of No Award.

Exhibits

We welcome all sorts of two dimensional- and three dimensional- fantasy, science fiction and horror art work. Pieces which address the convention theme 'Things are not what they seem' are particularly welcome.

Reproductions or prints from digitally created works are allowed, though only one of any particular piece may be hung. You must state on the entry form if the piece is an original or a reproduction. You may put up a notice on the displayed print advising that further copies are available

Works judged by the art show staff to have libellous (as opposed to humorous) content in regard to known persons will not be accepted. Works of pornography can not be accepted, as this art show is open to the general public including minors. If you are in doubt as to whether your work is acceptable, please contact the art show staff in advance.

The exhibition is free to convention attendees. There will be a small attendance fee (\$1) for non-convention attendees.

Hanging Regulations

Two dimensional works must be able to be hung on panels. Three dimensional works - particularly small items such as jewellery - will ideally come with a display case. If you cannot arrange a display case, please inform the art show directors well in advance.

All artwork must be clearly labelled. Wherever possible artwork must be clearly labelled on the piece as to the artist with contact phone number and address.

Art Show (cont)

All artwork must be able to withstand reasonable, careful handling, as it may be necessary to move your art during the course of the exhibition to correct problems, present it to the buyers, or to show it at the auction.

Once entered in the show, the conditions of sale may not be changed. No artwork may be withdrawn before the end of the show.

There will be no photography or video recording in the art show unless cleared by the art show directors in advance.

Artists are responsible for their own insurance.

Financial Matters

There will be a small hanging fee to cover the cost of the panels.

A ten per cent commission will be collected on all sales which exceed the hanging fee to cover the costs of the room, supplies, postage, printing, etc.

If you mail your artwork in and it is not sold at the show, you must provide payment to cover the costs of return postage and ensure packaging is re-sendable.

Payments to artists will be made within a fortnight of the end of the convention

Bids may be written on the information sheets pinned beside each item of artwork. Items which receive more than five bids will then enter into the voice auction.

Schedule

The schedule has not yet been finalised. Currently it is envisioned that the art show will open at 10:00am on Friday April 13th and finish at 5:00pm.

NAFF

Welcome to the inaugural NAFF race. NAFF is the National Australian Fan Fund and is designed to assist fans travelling across Australia to attend the National Science Fiction Convention. NAFF provides funds to cover the cost of airfare (or travelling expenses) and convention membership.

This year's Natcon will take place in Perth, Western Australia over the Easter weekend. Fans residing in all states and territories except Western Australia are eligible to be nominated to be the recipient of this year's NAFF. Preference will be given to those who have a) not attended a Natcon and/or b) have not attended a convention in the state/territory of current Natcon

Each nominated fan is required to provide a 200 (max.) word description indicating what they could bring to interstate fans and a brief description of their fannish history. It is expected that the winner will produce a report of their trip and will engage in fundraising to support future NAFF races.

As this is the very first NAFF, the final decision will be made by the committee. The committee currently consists of Grant Watson (Western Australia) and Sue Ann Barber (Victoria). Future NAFF races may involve voting by the fan community.

To be eligible for consideration for NAFF, your nomination must be received by 26th February 2001. Nominations may be received by email to active in@hotmail.com, by snail mail to PO Box 238, Brunswick East, 3057 or handed personally to either Sue Ann Barber or Grant Watson. Nominations received after the deadline will not be considered.

Ditmar Rules

1.0 Preamble

The Australian Science Fiction Achievement ("Ditmar") Awards recognise excellence in Science Fiction, Fantasy and Horror by Australians.

2.0 Categories
Professional Categories

Best Novel Best Novella or Novelette Best Short Story Best Collected Work Best Artwork

Fan Categories Best Fan Writer Best Fan Artist Best Fan Production

Special Awards
Best Professional Achievement
Best Fan Achievement

William Atheling Jr Award for Criticism or Review Best New Talent

3.0 Eligibility Criteria Timeliness

Works are eligible if they were first published or released anywhere in the world in an edition dated in the calendar year immediately preceding the year the award is held.

Australianness

Nominees are eligible if they were Australian citizens or permanent residents in the year their nominated work was released.

Eligibility of committee members

Members of the current Convention Committee will be ineligible for any award, unless the committee appoints a wholly autonomous subcommittee to administer the awards, in which case only the subcommittee will be ineligible.

Novel

A Novel is any work of sf/f/h of more than 40,000 words.

Novella or Novelette A Novella or Novelette is any work of sf/f/h of 7,500 to 40,000 words.

Short Story

A Short Story is any work of sf/f/h less than 7,500 words.

Collected Work
A collected work is a st/ff/h collection or anthology, magazine or journal, ezine or

webzine which must pay contributors in other than contributor copies and incidentals, or is sponsored by an institution other than a fan club, or whose editors declare themselves to be professional. At least one edition of a collected work must have been issued in the eligible calendar year.

Best Artwork

An artwork is a single work or series of related works of art in any medium other than text.

Fan Writer and Fan Artist These awards are made to writ-

ress or artists for a work or body of work first published, re-leased, or made available for public viewing in the eligible calendar year. The writer or artist must have received no payment other than contributor copies and other incidentals (coffee mug, t-shirt, poster, etc.).

Fan Production

This award is for work in any medium first published, re-leased, or made available for public viewing in the eligible calendar year. The writer or artist must have received no payment. Eligible works include: art, video, film, periodical, journal, ezine, webzine, computer application, or website.

Special Awards

Special awards recognise outstanding achievements in science fiction, fantasy, or horror not eligible in the existing categories.

The William Atheling Jr Award The William Atheling Jr Award is for the writing or editing of criticism or review pertaining to the genres of science fiction, fantasy, and horror.

Best New Talent

The Best New Talent award recognises excellence of professional achievement in any field of the genre by an individual who has not been nominated for a professional award three or more years before the year the award is held. An individual is only eligible for two consecutive years.

4.0 Nomination Process

Eligible nominators and voters Nominations will be accepted only from natural persons active in fandom, or from full or supporting members of the national convention of the year of the award. Where a nominator may not be known to the Awards subcommittee, the nominator should provide the

name of someone known to the subcommittee who can vouch for the nominator's eligibility. Votes will be accepted only from full members or supporting members of the convention.

Nominations

The nominator may nominate any number of works in any category. However, the nominator may nominate any given work only once in a category. All nominations must include the name of the nominator. Where a nominated work does not meet the criteria for its nominated category, the committee may move the nomination to the appropriate category; or where a work does not meet any criteria, refuse the nomination.

5.0 Final Ballot

Number of finalists

The five nominees with the most nominations shall appear on the final ballot. In the event of a tie for fifth place, up to seven finalists may appear on the final ballot. In the event of a four-way tie (or more) for fifth place, only the top four finalists shall appear on the ballot.

Minimum nominations for finalists
To appear on the ballot, a finalist
must attract a minimum of four
nominations in the professional and
Best New Talent categories, or two
in the Fan and Special Awards categories (including Professional
Special Award and William Atheling
Jr Award).

Minimum finalists for categories If any category has two or fewer eligible finalists, the category shall not appear on the final ballot, excepting the Fan Awards, the Special Awards and the Best New Talent Award. At the committee's discretion, eligible finalists in the Novella or Novelette and Short Story categories may be merged into a single category called Short Fiction.

Order of finalists

Finalists shall appear in randomised order.

No Award

"No Award" shall appear last on the ballot for all categories.

6.0 Voting

Preferential Voting

Voting in each category shall take place according to a preferential system

Tied Winners

In the event of a tie for winner in any category, all tied works will be deemed to have won the award.

Anonymous Voting

Unlike the nominations, final votes shall be anonymous. However, all ballots shall be coded and sent to each eligible member. The committee member responsible for coding the ballots shall not be involved in counting the votes.

7.0 The Physical Nature of the Trophy

Finalist Certificates

All finalists shall receive an A4 certificate honouring their achievement

The Trophy
Ditmar winners shall receive a standard trophy.

8.0 Appendix: Possible Future Changes

Future amendments to this document were foreshadowed at the Natcon
Business Meeting of 26/4/2000.

Formalisation of Nomination and Voting Periods

It was foreshadowed that formal rules should be laid down directing the Ditmar committee to issue nomination forms and final ballots in a timely fashion.

Withdrawal from Consideration It was foreshadowed that formal rules should be put in place to direct the Ditmar committee in its response to requests by authors, artists, editors, or publishers, that a work be withdrawn from consideration.

List of Eligible Works

It was foreshadowed that the nomination forms may be accompanied by a list of eligible works and that the list may be published on the Web prior to the close of nominations.

Contraction of Short Fiction Categories

It is foreshadowed that the current rules that allow committee discretion in contracting the professional short fliction categories be amended to provide firm criteria for the merging (eg. if fewer than two works are eligible for the final ballot in either the Short Story or Novella/Novelette categories).

The Physical Nature of the Trophy It is foreshadowed that in future Ditmar awards, the trophies shall be of a physical form that is constant from year to year. The design shall be in the proportions of 1:4:9 (the proportions of the monolith in 2001) and shall include a motif of the Southern Cross. One possibility is to use the popular Lewis Morley design.

WASFF By laws Governing the Awarding of Tin Ducks.

- 13.1 The Tin Duck Awards Committee is the committee of the WA Regional Science fiction Convention that is awarding the Tin Ducks.
- 13.2 The categories of the Tin Ducks shall be:
- 13.2.1 Best WA Professional Writer, 13.2.2 Best WA Non-Professional Writer.
- 13.2.3 Best WA Professional Production in any Medium,
- 13.2.4 Best WA Non-Professional Production in any Medium,
- 13.2.5 Best WA Visual Artwork
- 13.2.6 Tin Duck Awards Committee Chair's Award.
- 13.3 The Tin Duck committee shall pay due attention to both nominations and category suggestions.
- 13.4 A 'No Award' option must be available in each category.
- 13.5 Postal ballots shall be allowed and must be postmarked at least one week prior to the commencement of the convention.
- 13.6 Proxy voting shall not be allowed.
- 13.7 Completed ballots to be included in voting may be delivered in person to the convention up to the closing time indicated by the Tin Duck award committee, which shall be at least 24 hours after the commencement of the convention.
- 13.8 An a voter must be a voting member of WASFF at the time of the closing of the ballot and may only vote once in each category. The ballot must be signed by the voter.

- 13.9 The system used to determine the category winners shall be as per section 31 of the WASFF Constitution.
- 13.10 The period of eligibility for an item shall be the 13 months prior to the convention, or the closing date of the previous Tin Duck nominations; whichever is the greater. An item is defined as a specific piece of work or issue of a periodical.
- 13.11No previously nominated item shall be nominated again in the same category.
- 13.12 The ballot form must be part of the final convention progress report or newsletter and the nomination form a part of the penultimate progress report or newsletter, but not limited to such and must be made available on request after publication. Reasonable postage and handling may be charged to the requestor.


