HOTEL AND ACCOMMODATION INFORMATION

The convention will be held at the Shore Motor Inn, Artarmon, which was the location for previous Sydney Natcons held in 1983 and 1988. The Shore is a four-star hotel and since the last time we were there, in 1988, the hotel has undergone extensive renovations (about \$2 million worth). In addition to the convention facilities, there is now a second restaurant (bistro/buffet style) where the courtyard used to be, as well as new pool, spa and sauna.

LUNCHES

Since most restaurants in the area are 10-15 minutes walk from the hotel, we have arranged with the hotel to provide a lunchtime menu in the second restaurant. This menu (to be published in a later PR) will be priced such that an average lunch will cost \$8.00-\$10.00, with no single item more than \$5.00.

In PR4 we will begin to list the restaurants and food outlets in the immediate area of the convention hotel.

ACCOMMODATION

All rooms booked through the convention will cost \$95.00 per night, single double or twin. Since the hotel accommodates mainly business conventions, they have no facilities for a third bed in a room, meaning that triples cannot be offered unless two people are willing to share the same bed. Most rooms consist of a double bed and a single. We leave this decision entirely up to the people involved. This rate will apply for the Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights of the convention, and will only apply to bookings made through the convention. All bookings must be accompanied by one nights tariff (\$95.00) as a deposit.

If you are looking for alternative accommodation before, during or after the convention, we have been approached by the owner of a backpacker hotel in Glebe. Beds are \$10.00 per night and weekly rates are also available. For more details please contact Mrs Pat Dempsey on (02)660 0998.

FEATURED ARTISTS


Our featured artists in this PR are Marilyn Pride and Kerrie Hanlon.

PROGRAMMING

Work continues in providing members of Syncon 92 with a program that is both entertaining and informative. Very soon prospective victims people we would like to have involved in the program will be contacted with details.

There has also been some response to our request in **Brushstrokes** 2 for program ideas that any of our readers might have. Once again, if anyone has any suggestions for possible programming or would like to help out in any way in the program please let us know. We will be in touch shortly with those who have already volunteered ideas.

The basic ideas for the program are substantially unchanged from what was published in **Brushstrokes** 2 so we won't repeat them here. In later issues of **Brushstrokes** there will be further updates on the progress in programming including a preliminary schedule.

For the moment here are details of some of the highlights of the proposed program.

ART SHOW

Those of you who were at Conviction in 1988 will remember that one of the great highlights was the Art Show. It was one of the best organised ever seen at a Natcon. For Syncon 92 we are planning one even better.

For a start it will be in a larger area. This will not only allow us to display more but also to display it better. Entrants in the Art, Photographic and Animation competitions will be on display. However, if you do not want to enter any of the competitions but would still like to display your work, or if you are entering but have other work you would like displayed, then by all means let us know.

Artwork in any medium may be accepted for display. Please let us know in advance if you think there may be any special requirement for display of your work.

Margaret Hilliard is the organiser of the Art Show, as she was for the successful show in 1988. Please direct all correspondence concerning the Art Show to her care of the convention address.

COCKTAIL PARTY

In recent years it has become a tradition for Syncons to open with a first night Cocktail Party. This is seen as a good opportunity for people to mingle, have fun, catch up with old friends and make new ones.

For Syncon 92 the party will be on the Friday evening and will be held in the main convention rooms. Some refreshments will be available and drinks will be available at a bar set up in the room for the evening.

Putting on a Cocktail Party is not being used as an excuse for the Committee to do nothing that night. We are working on arranging periodic entertainment (filking and the like) throughout the evening.

SATURDAY NIGHT ENTERTAINMENT

Saturday evening of the convention will have more structured entertainment for convention goers the highlight of which will be the ...

Masquerade

Syncon 92 will be trying to restore the Masquerade to its rightful place as one of the major highlights of the weekend. There will be positive incentives for all to turn up and for all to turn up in costume. And there will be help for people to come in costume. Materials for making your costume will be available at the convention. There will also be assistance available from those who know how.

The theme of the Masquerade is "My Favourite Science Fiction or Fantasy Book Cover". It will be held on the Saturday evening of the convention and will form a substantial and important part of the planned Saturday night festivities. There will be valuable prizes available for those who enter the competition.

BANQUET

A Banquet is planned for the Sunday evening. It will be held in the cafe style restaurant and will cost \$25 a head. The meal will be buffet style. The menu is not yet finalised but it will include a selection of hot dishes, cold meats and salads, and desserts. Drinks will be

available from the bar.

The Banquet will be immediately followed by the celebrity roast of Nick Stathopoulos and the Awards Ceremony. Members who do not wish to attend the banquet will, of course, be able to come to these two items.

AUCTION

There will be two Auctions at Syncon 92; one of artwork and one for other material. People who will not be attending the convention and who wish to submit material to be auctioned should arrange for it to be delivered to the convention committee by 10 April 1992. Otherwise material can be brought to the convention but must be given over to the Committee by 2pm on Friday 17 April 1992.

We hope to have a catalogue printed and available prior to the auction. However, any such catalogue must necessarily be produced prior to the convention so any material received after 10 April will probably not be included.

The convention will retain 15% of sale proceeds as commission on auction sales except where the proceeds are earmarked for a recognised fan charity (e.g. a fan fund such as DUFF).

BUSINESS MEETING

Jack Herman has agreed to chair the Syncon 92 business meeting. This should ensure that it is run in an orderly manner. Exactly when the meeting will be held has not yet been decided but, at this stage, the Sunday morning looks most likely.

The main business of the meeting will be to decide the site for the 1994 National Convention. Those wishing to nominate for the site selection ballot must do so in writing by lunchtime of the day before the meeting. They must set out details of venue, dates and organising committee.

In accordance with the Constitution amendments to the Constitution must be submitted in time to allow them to be published in the convention handbook - see the Publication Schedule earlier in this issue for details.

All correspondence concerning the business meeting should be addressed to the convention address.

VIDEOS

As always, Syncon 92 will have an extensive and eclectic video show. This year it will be in a larger room than before but still away from the main convention area. There should be a separate program of videos either in the Program Book or available at the registration desk.

HUCKSTERS

There is space for a limited number of hucksters so allocation will be strictly on a first come first served basis. Details of the exact area available and the cost will be included in **Brushstrokes 4**.

CAN YOU HELP?

No convention committee can hope to run a convention alone. We are not so proud as to try. We need you help.

The main way you can help is by coming along and joining in the fun. You can also help by spreading the word to your friends and getting them to come along.

If you can think of other ways you think you could help out then please let us know. We'd love to hear from you.

THE AUSTRALIAN SF ("DITMAR") AWARDS

As mentioned in the first two issues of Brushstrokes it is our aim to encourage greater participation in the nomination and voting process for the "Ditmars". In the past people have often complained that they did not have the opportunity to see the works available for nomination. In an attempt to go some way toward alleviating this problem we hope to publish details of eligible works in each issue of Brushstrokes. We also plan to send these details to editors of other fanzines in the hope that they too might publish them. In this way it is hoped that as many people as possible will become aware of what is available to nominate giving them a better chance of seeing the works for themselves.

Due to logistic problems involved in compiling such lists we have had to limit the lists to eligible fiction i.e. novels, collections and short stories published during the 1991 calendar year. The first such list appears below. If you have any additions or corrections for our list please let us know.



COMPETITIONS

Syncon 92, the 31st Australian National Science Fiction Convention, is planning to conduct four competitions in conjunction with the convention.

- 1. Short Story Writing Competition
- 2. Art Competition
- 3. Photographic Competition
- 4. Animation Competition

We are currently in the process of arranging sponsorship for these competitions. Until that is finalised we can only say that there will be valuable prizes to be won. Details of what those prizes are will be announced later.

In the meantime we thought that prospective entrants should have as much time as possible to prepare. Therefore what follows is an outline of what will be required of entrants in each competition.

For each competition entry is open to everyone (other than the Syncon 92 Committee and the judges) i.e. you do not have to be a member of Syncon 92 to enter. All entries must be the entrants own original work and should not have been previously published elsewhere. There is no entry fee.

SHORT STORY WRITING COMPETITION

The short stories must be in the science fiction or fantasy genre. They must be no more than 7,500 words in length. They must be typed or word processed, double spaced and on single sided pages. Entrants must supply two photocopies of each story. Please do not SYNCON 92 PR3

send originals as entries will not be returned.

The Syncon 92 Committee reserves the right to first publication of each entry. Otherwise copyright remains with the author.

The closing date for the Short Story Writing Competition is 14 February 1992 i.e. the stories must reach the Syncon 92 Committee by midnight on that date.

ART COMPETITION

Entries in the Art Competition can be in any medium. There will be different judging categories to take account of the different media used. Exactly what those categories are depends on the extent of sponsorship we can obtain. Details of the categories will be announced later. The theme of the artwork must be science fiction or fantasy.

Entries will be displayed as part of the convention art show. The work should be ready for display either on art boards, display tables or stand alone. If you have any special display needs please discuss them with the Committee before entering. We will endeavour to help.

Entries may be brought to the convention but, if so, must be handed to the Committee by 10.00am on Friday 17 April 1992 (i.e. the first day of the convention). Otherwise entries must be received by Friday 10 April 1992. The earlier we receive your entry the better chance there is that it will be displayed to its best effect.

Arrangements for return of entries must be made with the Committee prior to or at the time of entering. Whilst all care will be taken with artwork no responsibility is taken for any loss or damage regardless of how it occurs.

PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION

Entries in the Photographic Competition will be accepted in black and white or colour and can be in any medium (e.g. mixed medium, montages etc.). Entries must be a minimum of 10 inches by 8 inches (250 millimetres by 200 millimetres) and must be at least matted

ready for display. Entries will be displayed as part of the convention art show.

As with the Art Competition there will be different judging categories. Exactly what those categories are depends again on the extent of sponsorship we can obtain but, at this stage, we envisage having two categories: science fiction or fantasy and science fiction fandom. Details of the exact categories will be announced later.

Entries may be brought to the convention but, if so, must be handed to the Committee by 10.00am on Friday 17 April 1992 (i.e. the first day of the convention). Otherwise entries must be received by Friday 10 April 1992. The earlier we receive your entry the better chance there is that it will be displayed to its best effect.

Please provide copies and not originals as return of the photographs cannot be guaranteed. Arrangements for return of entries must be made with the Committee prior to or at the time of entering. Whilst all care will be taken with the photographs no responsibility is taken for any loss or damage regardless of how it occurs.


ANIMATION COMPETITION

Animation of any form (cartoon, claymation, stop motion etc.) will be accepted for the Animation Competition. All entries must be recorded on VHS format video cassette and must run for no longer than fifteen minutes. Entries may be displayed as part of the convention art show.

As before there will be different judging categories and again exactly what those categories are will depend on the extent of sponsorship we can obtain. Details of the exact categories will be announced later. The entry must have a science fiction or fantasy theme however.

Entries may be brought to the convention but, if so, must be handed to the Committee by 10.00am on Friday 17 April 1992 (i.e. the first day of the convention). Otherwise entries must be received by Friday 10 April 1992. The earlier we receive your entry the better chance there is that it will be displayed to its best effect.

Please provide copies and not originals as the return of entries cannot be guaranteed. Arrangements for return of entries must be made with the Committee prior to or at the time of entering. Whilst all care will be taken with entries no responsibility is taken for any loss or damage regardless of how it occurs.
