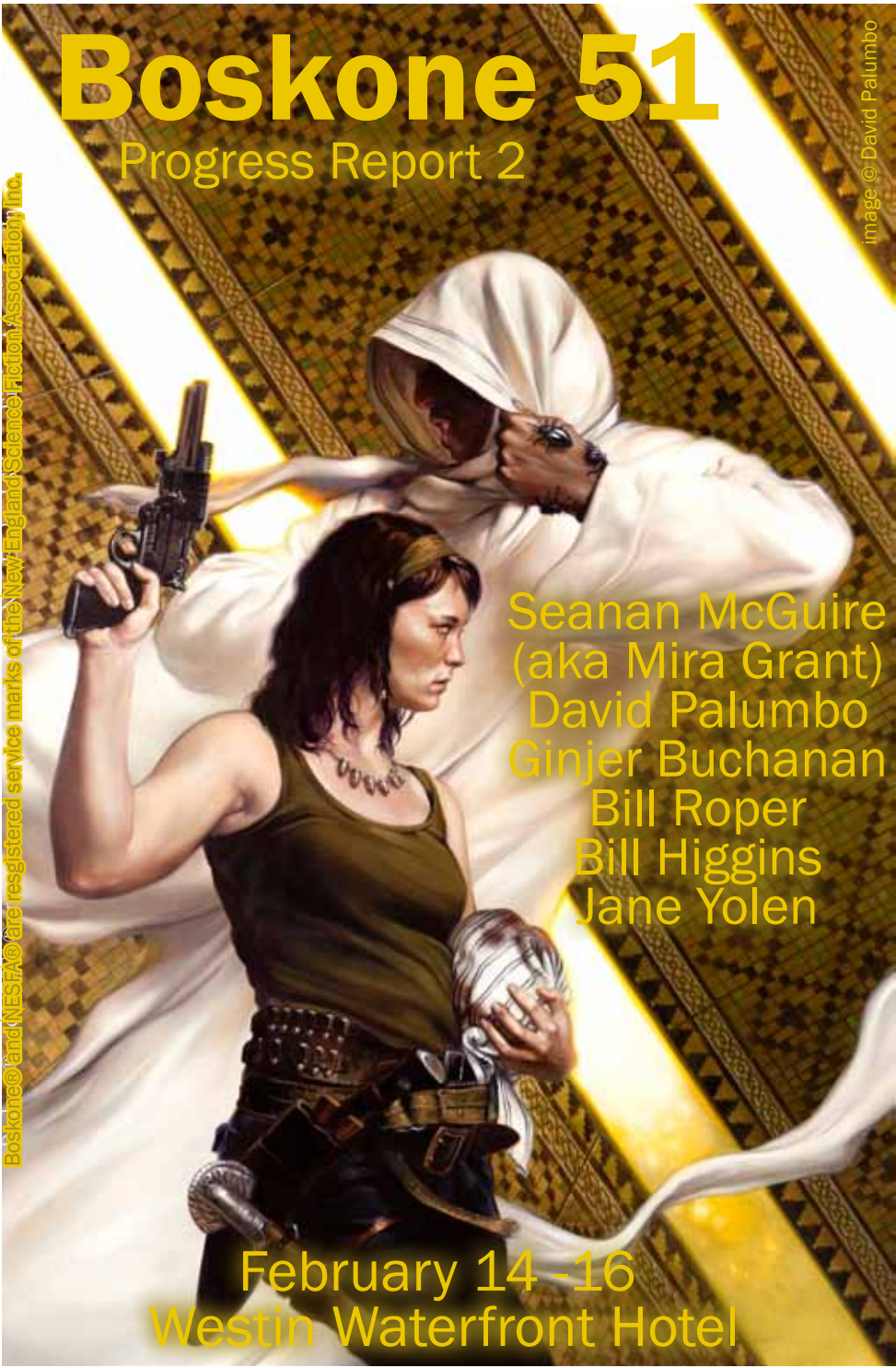

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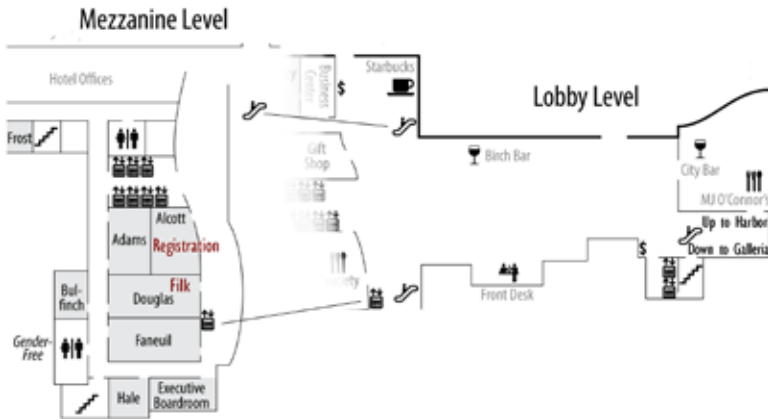

**The most obvious change** you will notice to Boskone this year is that we have con activities on both sides of the hotel. (See map below.) ## BOSKONE GUESTS

**GUEST OF HONOR** -- *Seanan McGuire* has won two Hugo Awards and the Campbell Award. She writes about urban elves, superheroes, monsters, and (as Mira Grant) zombies. She is also a cartoonist and a filksinger.

**OFFICIAL ARTIST** -- *David Palumbo* has won a Chesley Award and three Spectrum medals. His works span urban reality through dynamic fantasy to far-reaching sd, and he has painted zombies.

**SPECIAL GUEST** -- *Ginjer Buchanan* is known as one of the founding mothers of the science fiction community. She is an acquisitions editor for Penguin USA, which includes Putnam, Berkley, and Ace Books.

**FEATURED MUSICIAN** -- *Bill Roper* has won the Pegasus Award three times, founded Dodeka Records, chaired Windycon twice, and is in the Filk Hall of Fame. His humorous filksongs are a delight to all who hear them.

- Finishing up at about 11 pm with **Filk Fest Part II** featuring Sassafrass.

There will be a cash bar in the Harbor pre-function area during the Saturday evening events.

- **Art Show Sales** occurs during 1 - 3 pm on Sunday. Bidding closes at noon. Please check any art you have bid on during the sales hours, and make your purchases by 3 pm!
- The **Dead Dog** party is Sunday after teardown, celebrating taking down the art show (and surviving it!), packing up the office, loading the truck, and bringing the convention to a successful end. We celebrate in the Galleria. Please pitch in! The more help we get, the sooner the party starts!

## BOSKONE ACTIVITIES

Boskone has continuing activities of programming and services including: **Autographing:** bring (or purchase in the Hucksters Room!) books for signing by their authors. Autographing is in the Galleria to the left of Information as you come in. The Program Booklet and program information on the website will have the autographing schedule.

- The **Con Suite** is our hospitality area, with tables, chairs, snacks, and beverages, located in the Galleria. Stop by for a place to sit, to meet new and old friends, and to have fun!

- **Costuming:** Boskone’s roving judges will again hand out ribbons. Take care not to poke others with your shoulder points, and we hope that no one will be so careless as to step on your cape or train!
- **Discussion Groups:** Discussion groups range from conversations on focused topics to participatory knit-a-thons. We invite your participation to generate ideas for topics and as volunteers to form and lead groups (“Birds of a Feather”). Please e-mail us at: [program@boskone.org](mailto:program@boskone.org)
- **Dragonslair** has activities and programming oriented to members between the ages of 7 and 12. This includes games, readings, crafts, and demos.
- **Filking** will take place in Douglas on the Mezzanine Friday and Saturday. This includes theme circles, NESFA Hymnal singing, and evening “open filking.” These are participatory: singing, playing instruments, and listening. Open filking includes anything and everything from original song debuts to singalongs.
- The **Galleria**, on the Westin’s lower level, is the major nexus of the convention. It will again have a hotel-run cash bar Friday evening.
- **Gaming:** this year Gaming will be located in the Harbor foyer and will include board, card, and video games. Try some new games like Bioshock Infinite, Seasons, and as a real treat this year we will have game designers coming in to playtest their games on Saturday. Who says you can’t get what you ask for? You asked for larger TVs for video games and we got them!
- **Information** is straight ahead entering the Galleria. The Information Desk includes Lost and Found, a news drop-off for the convention newsletter, maps, local restaurant menus, and assistance in navigating Boskone and the local area. If we don’t know the answer, we can find out whom to ask!
- **Kaffeeklatsches:** Participate in an informal discussion with our program participants over coffee or tea. Sign up for these at the Program Desk, in the Galleria near Information.
- The **Program Desk** is in the Galleria to the right of Information and the Office. Stop by to sign up for a Discussion Group or Kaffeeklatsch. Program participants check-in here after registering in Alcott on the Mezzanine.
- **Readings:** Boskone holds readings, usually a half-hour long, where authors read from new or upcoming stories, followed by Q&A.

## MAIN PROGRAM

Boskone 51’s main program offers dozens of program items including panel discussions, talks by and interviews with our featured guests, and artists’ demos and slide shows. Topics range across space, time, and plausibility, from the best SF/F of 2013 to concert sets. Boskone program participants include writers, editors, literary agents, artists, critics, scientists, musicians, bloggers, and readers.

**Program Highlights** include:

- Our **Guest of Honor Seanan McGuire** will be interviewed by Elizabeth Bear. Se will also take part in panels on Parasites, Killer Plagues, and TV. Be sure not to miss Seanan in the exciting BBC inspired game show Just A Minute.
- **Official Artist David Palumbo** will give a tour of his artwork in the Art Show, host a solo talk on finding your voice as an artist, and give a demonstration of his artistic techniques.
- **Special Guest Ginjer Buchanan** will be interviewed by Leigh Perry (aka Toni L. P. Kelner). She’ll also be on many Program panels including True Blood

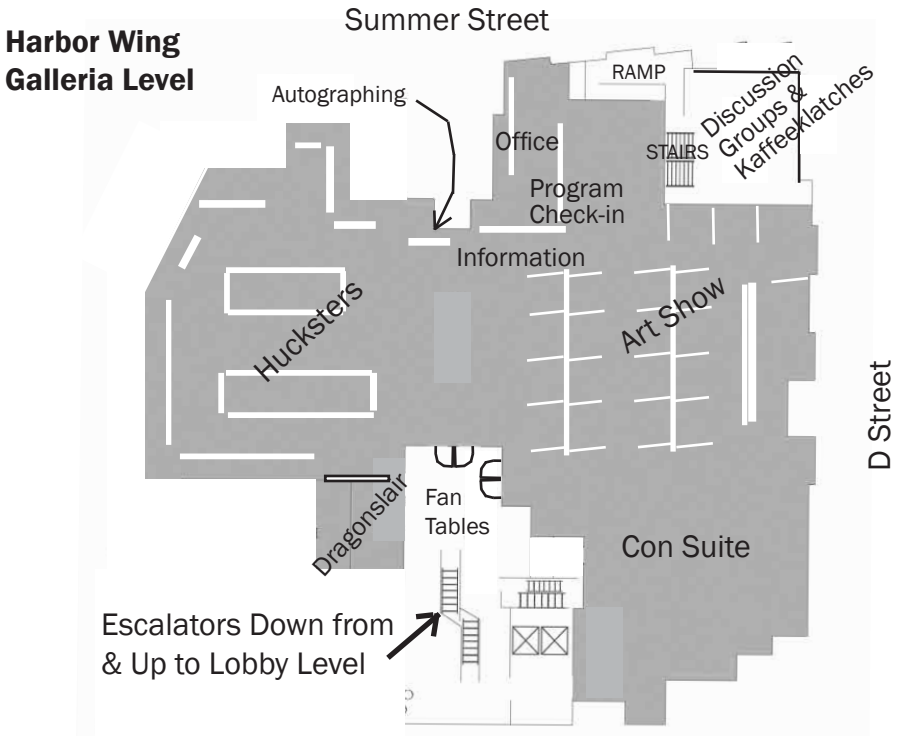
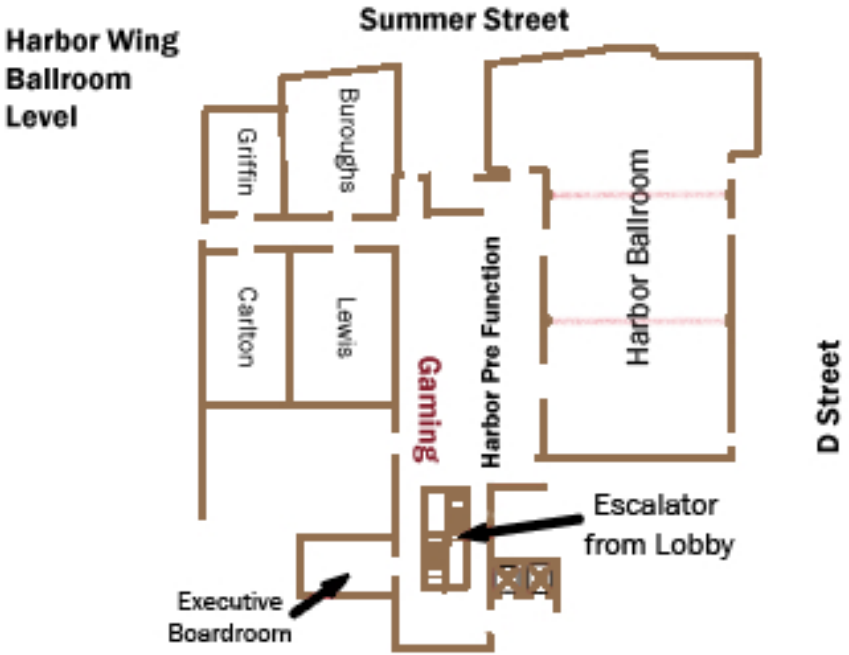


Distilled, Editing Your Fiction: Tips From the Pros, Tie-In Novels: Writing Within the Rules, and Sherlock Holmes on TV.

- Our **Featured Filker Bill Roper** will perform at the Boskone Filk Fest concert on Saturday evening and lead performance workshops during the day.
- **Hal Clement Science Speaker Bill Higgins** will be interviewed by Guy Consolmagno, S.J. He'll also give solo talks on Fermilab as well as on the science of Hal Clement's *Iceworld*. Also with Brother Guy, he'll lead a discussion of the Chelyabinsk asteroid event of last year.
- **NESFA Press Guest** and long-time Boskone friend, **Jane Yolen**, will be interviewed by Bruce Coville, and will also be on a variety of panels including Lewis Carroll's *Alice in Wonderland* and The Art of Writing Young Adult Fiction.
- We're bringing back the **Boskone Book Club** this year! The purpose of the Book Club is to bring people together to discuss a specific book. The book under discussion will be *Parasite* by Mira Grant (the nom de plume our Guest, Seanan McGuire, uses for horror). Bob Kuhn will lead the discussion on Sunday at Boskone. ## EXHIBITS

Boskone 51 has two **special art exhibits**. The first, assembled by Joe Siclari and Edie Stern, is a **Retrospective of work by Boskone Official Artists** past and present. [www.boskone.org/boskone-history.html](http://www.boskone.org/boskone-history.html) has the list of past Boskones with Guests, including Official Artists. In 2013, Boskone presented a Special Art Exhibit of illustrations for the works of the first ten SFWA Grand Masters. Come join us as we continue the party and showcase art created for works by the next ten Grand Masters.

We grew up reading works by the Grand Masters and our vision was shaped by the art illustrating their works. We continue our series of retrospective art exhibits with imagery inspired by the works of Lester Del Rey, Frederik Pohl, Damon Knight, A.E. Van Vogt, Jack Vance, Poul Anderson, Hal Clement, Brian Aldiss, Philip Jose Farmer, and Ursula K. LeGuin.

These works will include examples from the entire spectrum of book covers, magazine illustrations, comic book adaptations, and other forms. The artists represent a who's who of the field, including Kelly Freas, Jeff Jones, Bob Eggleton, Robert Foster, Dean Ellis, Harold McCauley, John Harris, Alex Ebel and others.

We'd like to show even more. If you have pieces that would fit into the exhibit that you'd consider bringing, please contact Joe Siclari and Edie Stern at [artshow@boskone.org](mailto:artshow@boskone.org).

Even if you can't contribute, make time at the convention to visit the exhibit. You'll see some great art that was inspired by our greatest SF writers. You might even see that cover from a favorite book that started you reading science fiction.

Our second exhibit is our tribute to winners of the **Jack Gaughan Award** assembled by Claire Anderson. The Jack Gaughan Award is chosen by a jury of well-respected artists in the field to recognize and encourage a new and upcoming artist.

## HUCKSTERS' ROOM

The **Hucksters' Room**, in the Galleria, features science fiction, fantasy, and genre books, jewelry, crafts, and related materials for sale. Check the Boskone website for the list of dealers. Email [hucksters@boskone.org](mailto:hucksters@boskone.org) for more information.

## ART SHOW

**Purchasing Artwork:** Boskone 51 has four methods for purchasing artwork: Print Shop, the traditional bid system, Quicksale (a purchase immediately option), and post-closeout sale.

- Print Shop pieces can be bought immediately while they last by taking the print to the Print Shop desk and paying for it.
- Traditional Bid System: buyers register for a bidder number and write their

bid and bidder number on the bid sheet of a piece of art. Pieces with three or fewer bids as of **Closeout (noon on Sunday)** go to the highest bidders. Pieces with four or more bids go to voice auction at the front of the Art Show at 12:15 on Sunday.

- Quicksale works similarly to the Traditional bid system but allows one to purchase a piece immediately. The piece must not have any bids on it and must have a designated Quicksale price on it. This needs to be witnessed by a member of the Art Show Staff who will close all other bidding on the piece and allow you to bid the Quicksale price. Quicksale starts at noon on Saturday, but payment and pickup are Sunday 1 - 3 pm at Art Show Sales. The artwork remains on display until Art Show Closeout.
- Post-Closeout Sales: pieces with no bids on them may be bought after closeout at their Post Closeout price. If they have no Post Closeout price, they can be bought at their Quicksale price, if they have neither they cannot be bought after Closeout.

**Art Show Sales** is from **1 - 3 pm** Sunday.

Boskone 51's **Art Show** features art by **Official Artist David Palumbo**, and 2D and 3D art from other exhibitors. Pieces for sale include original paintings, Giclee prints, reproductions, jewelry, handmade/hand-decorated tableware, sculpture, and other artwork. - Boskone also provides space for **art resale**, for people de-acquisitioning artwork. We charge a \$3.00 per square foot hanging fee. Complete the Art Show Entry Form, indicating Resale.
- The **Print Shop** displays prints for immediate sale at fixed prices. To enter prints in the art show see the Art Show rules.

## DISABILITY ACCESS AT BOSKONE

Boskone has the following services for attendees, available by request: priority seating for persons with disabilities and free memberships for PCAs, Personal Care Assistants, also called "Adult-in-tow memberships."

## Quiet Places

If you need a space to take a break from the noise and chaos of the con, we suggest the second-floor space near Alcott. Elevator lobbies, especially the parking elevator lobbies are also usually quiet.

If you need a particular type of hotel room or something specific, like a wheelchair, a scooter, or a refrigerator, please speak with the hotel when you make your hotel reservation. If you will not be staying at the hotel, we suggest you contact the hotel business office about scooters and any other services that the hotel can provide.

## DIRECTIONS TO THE WESTIN WATERFRONT HOTEL:

### FROM LOGAN INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

**(Note: specify Westin Waterfront to taxi or van services and drivers to avoid confusion with other Westin properties.)**

- **Mass Transit (the T):** Take the Silver Line Bus, SL1, towards South Station, get off at the World Trade Center Station, and follow the directions below.
- **Cabs:** Taxi fare is approximately about \$20.
- **Shared Van:** Shared van to the hotel was approximately \$10 last year. [www.massport.com/logan-airport/To and From Logan/GTU.pdf](http://www.massport.com/logan-airport/To and From Logan/GTU.pdf) has the most recent Massport ground transportation brochure. ## RAIL

- **Amtrak:** Take the train to South Station and transfer there to the Silver Line Bus SL1 or SL2 to World Trade Center Station, and follow the Mass Transit directions.
- **Commuter Rail** from T. F. Green Airport (Providence, RI): a limited schedule runs to South Station. See [mbta.com/schedules\\_and\\_maps/rail/lines/?route=PROVStoU](http://mbta.com/schedules_and_maps/rail/lines/?route=PROVStoU) for details.

## MASS TRANSIT (“The T”)

Get to South Station. From South Station transfer to the Silver Line SL1 or SL2 to the World Trade Center Station, and follow the directions below. For schedule details, see [www.mbta.com/schedules\\_and\\_maps/subway/lines/?route=SILVER#Waterfront](http://www.mbta.com/schedules_and_maps/subway/lines/?route=SILVER#Waterfront) or call (617) 222-3200 or (800) 392-6100.

### FROM WORLD TRADE CENTER T STATION (SILVER LINE)

Go up 3 escalators, following signs to World Trade Center Avenue. Keep following the signs for “World Trade Center” and “World Trade Center Avenue.” At the top of the final escalator, veer slightly to the left, then go through the doorway in front of you to World Trade Center Avenue. If you see a large statue of four horses on your left, you are going the right way. You’ll also see the large Boston Convention & Exhibition Center (BCEC) directly in front of you, and the Westin to its immediate left. Walk along World Trade Center Ave. until it ends at Summer Street. Cross the street and veer left beside the driveway and walk up it to the Westin doors. The total walk is less than 1/4 mile.

## **DRIVING TO BOSKONE**

**Closure of the Callahan Tunnel** may add travel time for locals so be aware of it: <http://www.massdot.state.ma.us/highway/HighlightedProjects/CallahanTunnelRehabilitationProject/DetoursandTripPlanning.aspx>

It is the outbound tunnel on 1A from Downtown Boston to Logan Airport. The main effect on Boskone is likely to be extra traffic around the Westin as more people use the Ted Williams Tunnel.

Also, the “Haul Road” from I-93 to the Westin will be open for all traffic which will provide another option for those coming to the Westin from the south. <http://goo.gl/maps/4S3hl> Whether this means that it will be a good option or full of local traffic means it is a toss up whether people might want to avoid the “Haul Road” or use it.

### **From the NORTH**

Take I-93 South to Boston and go into the tunnel.

Take exit 20A, South Station.

At the top of the ramp, cross a pedestrian walkway and turn left onto Summer St.

Go 0.8 miles on Summer St.

Turn right at the traffic light by the convention center, then left into the hotel driveway.

### **From the NORTH SHORE** via route 1A

Take 1A south towards Logan Airport.

Take the Mass Pike westbound (Ted Williams Tunnel) to exit 25, South Boston.

Make a slight right onto Congress St.

Turn right onto D St., then right onto Summer St.

Turn left at the next traffic light (very close), then left into the hotel driveway.

### **From the SOUTH**

Take I-93 north to Exit 20 toward: I-90 / Logan Airport / South Station / BCEC.

Take the left fork towards Logan Airport and South Boston.

In the tunnel, take the right fork for South Boston.

At the top of the ramp, bear right toward D St.

Cross B St. (traffic light), turn right on D St. (next traffic light).

The first light on D St. is Summer St.; turn right. Turn left at the

next traffic light (very close), then left into the hotel driveway.

### **From the WEST**

Take I-90 (Mass Pike) eastbound to the South Boston exit (Exit 25)

Get in the left-hand exit lane, marked “Seaport Blvd.”

As you get out of the tunnel, follow the left-hand ramp.

Go through the first traffic light.

Go one long block and turn right on Northern Avenue.

Go through two lights (B St. and an overpass/pedestrian crossing.)

At the 3rd light, turn right on D St.

Go through two lights (Congress St. and a trolley-bus road.)

At the 3rd light, turn right on Summer St.

Turn left at the next traffic light (very close), then left into the hotel driveway.

## MAP

The picture below shows the Westin Boston Waterfront Hotel (425 Summer St. in South Boston) and key nearby features. The building marked Westin (lower left corner) is the hotel. High speed depressed roads block ground level access between the Westin and the World Trade Center MBTA Station (indicated by the arrow). World Trade Center Ave. and D Street carry pedestrian and vehicular traffic on bridges above the depressed roads. A corner of BCEC's big curved roof shows next to the Westin.

## PARKING

Parking at the Westin Waterfront is \$35 - \$45 per day. On-street parking is \$1.25/hour metered 8 am - 8 pm, limited to 2 consecutive hours, on Monday through Saturday. Metering does not apply on Sundays and holidays. Check the signs carefully for legal parking spaces, as opposed to taxi/commercial vehicle areas. Nearby commercial parking lots exist but beware the fine print about evening and weekend prices. For possible parking alternatives, check the Boskone website closer to Boskone.

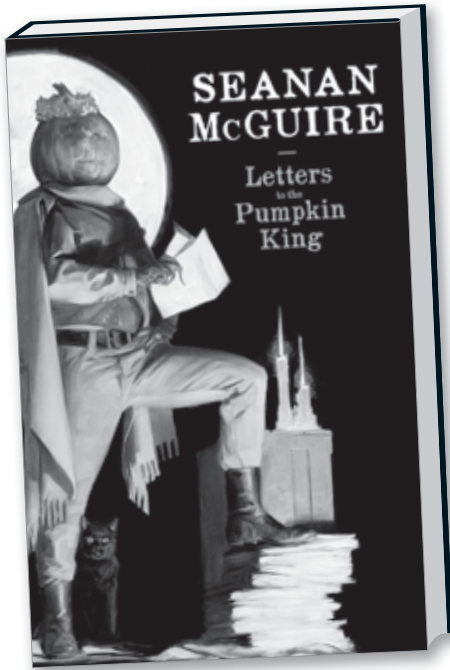
