

RULES & REGULATIONS

BEHAVIOR

ConQuesT is committed to offering a convention experience as free from harassment as we can make it for our members, regardless of characteristics such as gender, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, age, race, religion, nationality, or social class. We do not tolerate harassment of convention participants in any form. ConQuesT attendees violating these rules may be sanctioned or expelled from the convention without a refund, at the discretion of the convention organizers.

Harassment includes offensive verbal comments to such characteristics, deliberate intimidation, stalking, following, unwelcome photography or recording, sustained disruption of talks or other events, inappropriate physical contact, and unwelcome attention. Attendees asked to stop any harassing behavior are expected to comply immediately. If you are being harassed, notice that someone else is being harassed. or have similar concerns, please contact a convention staff member immediately. Convention staff will help attendees contact hotel security or local law enforcement, provide escorts, or otherwise assist those experiencing harassment to feel less unsafe for the duration of the convention. When reporting such an incident, providing a name. badge number and/or physical

description of the person(s) involved would be extremely helpful. Please remember that we need to know about any incidents during the event in order to take action.

In addition, anyone who violates the guidelines and policies listed below, or who violates state or federal law, or who acts in a just plain stupid manner, may be sanctioned or expelled from the convention without a refund at the discretion of the convention organizers.

For lesser offenses, committee members are authorized to punch a hole through the badge and badge holder if they observe inappropriate behavior on the part of children. If a child receives three badge punches, the child and his/her guardian(s) will have their memberships revoked without refund.

NEW HOTEL

2014 is our first year at this hotel, so please help us make our first impression a good one by treating the hotel's staff and general patrons with courtesy and respect.

BADGES

To be granted access to convention areas, your badge must be worn in a visible location at all times. Please comply immediately if asked to show/produce/wear your badge. Parties associated with the convention are required to check for badges as well as ID.

FOLLOW THE LAW

The legal drinking age in Missouri is 21. Minors caught with alcohol or adults caught serving alcohol to minors will forfeit their membership and will be evicted from the facilities. Liquor Control agents have been known to mingle among us. Please drink responsibly and act accordingly. NOTE: Alcohol is not permitted in public areas of the hotel.

ConQuesT does not condone the consumption or use of illegal substances. Law Enforcement professionals are members of ConQuesT and will take action as necessary. Please do not make them work this weekend!

All convention areas and sleeping rooms are non-smoking by city ordinance.

All members of ConQuesT are expected to abide by state and federal laws. Failure to comply will result in expulsion from the convention without refund.

CURFEW

Party Floor Curfew. Children 15 and under must leave the party floor by 11 p.m. unless accompanied by parent or guardian. Additionally, strollers and other devices that can block the doors/hallways are not permitted on the party floor, save for the transportation of children to their room on that floor.

CELL PHONES

Please turn off or set to silent all miscellaneous gadgetry, during programming items.

WEAPONS POLICY

Weapons may be worn as part of a costume Friday night after opening ceremonies until midnight and Saturday 30 minutes prior to the start of Masquerade until midnight. All weapons, outside of Masquerade entrants during the Masquerade, must be peace bonded by a ConQuesT security member or staff. Weapons purchased during the convention must be taken directly to your personal space (room, vehicle, etc.)

CHECKS

If any person writes a check to ConQuesT with insufficient funds, that person will thenceforth be on a cash (or credit card) basis only. There will also be a \$20 charge in addition to the amount of the check.

GLEN COOK


AUTHOR GUEST OF HONOR


Glen's love of writing began in grade school, and in high school he wrote the occasional article for his school's newspaper. After graduation Glen spent time in the United States Navy and later worked his way through college, leaving little time for his writing endeavors. It wasn't until he started working at General Motors that his writing took off, at times penning as many as three books per year. It was during this period that Glen wrote his first novel of The Black Company, a gritty fantasy series that follows an elite mercenary unit through several decades of their history. The series, currently 10 novels



long, has become something of a cult classic, especially among current and former members of the military, and has appeared in more than 20 languages. Glen is also well known for his Garrett P.I. series, which tells the haphazard adventures of hard-boiled detective Garrett, and his Dread Empire series, which highlights Glen's earlier published work. To date Glen has written a handful of short works, a few articles, and 51 books, the most recent of which, WORKING GOD'S MISCHIEF, the fourth entry in The Instrumentalities of the Night series, is to be released March 2014. Glen is currently retired from his job at GM, living with his wife, Carol, in St. Louis, Missouri. Glen met Carol while attending the 1970 Clarion Writers Workshop. Both are regular faces in the ConQuesT dealers room and at other Midwest conventions.







DAVID LEE PANCAKE


CAROLINE SPECTOR

SCIENCE GUEST OF HONOR

Bridget Landry was educated as a chemist and planetary scientist, trained as an engineer, and has worked in spacecraft operations at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena for more than 20 years.

Most of her career has been in what is known as sequencing: building sets of commands that are sent to and stored on the spacecraft to execute the bulk of the spacecraft activities over a specific period of time. She has worked on the Hubble Space Telescope, the joint US-French oceanographic

Earth-orbiter Topex, the Mars Pathfinder project (which included the first Mars rover), the Cassini mission to Saturn and the Dawn mission to the main asteroid belt. Ms. Landry is currently a team member of the Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter, where she supports the orbiter's mission and relay for both currently functioning Mars rovers, Opportunity and Curiosity.

Ms. Landry takes great interest in the advancement of women in technical fields, and the helps and bars to their progress, as well as in the problem of sparking and maintaining girls' early interest in science and math. In her technical hat, she has been on science-related panels at WorldCons, local, and regional conventions and has been a Science GoH at several regional cons, as well as participating in outreach activities outside the fannish community.

With the other side of her brain, Ms. Landry is a Master Level costumer with a twisted sense of humor, (google "Strauss Waltz Assault Team"), and a fondness for ST:TOS. She has been on panels and won Masquerade awards from the local to the WorldCon level.

FAN GUESTS OF HONOR





AARON HOLLINGSWORTH






DENNIS YOUNG's writing experience began somewhere around the third


