Less Than Half a History of HalfaCons

HalfaCon was founded by the Atlanta Anarchists to be a gathering of Georgia fen in winter or late fall with none of the usual hassles of convention operations. The idea was basically the same as the original MidWestCon founded by the late Lou Tabakow. I could probably add/correct this by looking through ancient files of SFC Bulletins — if I could find them. The extremely hazy memories I got of them over the phones in Atlanta is more in the spirit of the thing though. No one remembers details. They just remember they had a good time.

Now that I've started this project though, anyone with hard information should send it to me c/o 835 Chattanooga Bank Building, Chattanooga, TN 37402.

- #1. Nov., probably near Thanksgiving, or maybe Dec. 1973. Blame Allen Greenfield & John Ulrich at the Roadway Inn across from Lenox Square Atlanta, GA. Approximately 50 showed up including Kieth Laumer and myself.
- #2. Weekend before Thanksgiving 1974. Gary Steele, chief conspirator indited Cliff & Susan Biggers at what was the Rome, GA Ramada (now Roman) Inn. Kieth Laumer and Michael Bishop both showed up as did between 75 & 100 others. There were films and a trivia contest heavy programming for this con.
- #3. Sometime in late 1975, somewhere in New Orleans, Guy Lillian and what/whoever the usual New Orleans fen, roasted Hank Rienhardt. Although there was much of this in SFPA, both before and after the con, "The Hank" has apparently obliterated the records with his usual sharp edged weapons/tactics. Somewhere short of 100 witnesses are missing.
- #4. My flakey sources, not the ones thanked below, think this was held at either a Holiday or Quality Inn in downtown Nashville. The hotel, as is usual with Nashville conventions, was switched at the last minute. About 50-75 people showed up to play hearts and start rumors (sic). This, reportedly, was the year Tuscaloosa spent talking about doing a HalfaCon but didn't. It was probably the 1st weekend, Dec. 1976, or maybe it was in October.
- #5. Stven Carlberg thinks the 2nd Stven & Don's Con in Memphis was a Halfacon in mid-Oct of 1977. It had to be at the Overton Square Holiday Inn. PL Caruthers did half the work or more.
- #6. Rumor has it Don Markstein scheduled Allen Greenfield to be GoH at a Halfacon in Bizby (not Benson), Arizona. Allen lived out there then.

There were about 100 people there including Hank Rienhardt. Numerous SFPAns and Myraiad members produced a "disgusting oneshot," the details of which are not printable. It may have had something to do with the concom having a "program."
- #8. About Dec. 5-7, the weekend before John Lennon was killed, Ken Moore did another KookaKhan HalfaCon in Nashville. About the usual 50-100 people showed up to play hearts and watch dirty movies -- Larry Wolfe's sleazycon operation.
- #9. Will be attempted by Pat Holloy, Rickey Sheppard, & Co. as ConCave 2.5, Dec. 4-6, 1981, in Park Mammoth Resort, KY.
- #10. But 12-14 Feb. '82, Iris Brown & Randy Satterfield will do one in the Roman Inn, Rome, GA.

THE FAN'S GUIDE TO THE CAVE AREA

Unless you plan to spend every second of the Con in the hotel, you are going to need some basic information about the Cave area such as where to find food, gas, video games, etc. For this purpose, this brief guide has been compiled.

- 1: FAST FOOD The I-65 interchange at Cave City has a great number of fast food franchises. Included are Wendy's, Long John Silver's, Kentucky Fried Chicken, Pizza Hut, and Jerry's. Directions: take 31-W to highway 90 at Cave City. Turn left on highway 90 and drive about a mile. You will see them. Everywhere.
- 2: SLOW FOOD There are two good full service restaurants in Cave City. They are The Sahara and Ruggerio's. Ruggerio's features Italian food and The Sahara is a steak house. Directions: To get the Ruggerio's follow the same directions as for Fast Food. To get to the Sahara take 31-W to highway 90 and turn right. The restaurant is about 1 block down on the left.
- 3: CAVES There are many caves within a short distance of the Con hotel. Pamphlets can be found in the hotel telling how to get to these. There are also two caves on the Park Mammoith Resort. Mammoth Cave is the primary tourist draw in the area. To get to Mammoth Cave National Park take 31-W to Park City and then follow the signs.
- 4: VIDEO GAMES There are two video arcades in Cave City. Games Unlimited can be found by following the Fast Food directions. The Fun Factory is by far the better of the two and can be found by following 31-W North to the highway 70 intersection in Cave City. The arcade is on the right.
- 5: GAS The closest gas stations are about one mile from the hotel at the Park City intersection.
