A Guy You Should Know and His Rosy Muse

It is impossible to be around Southern Fandom for long without coming across Guy and Rosy somehow. It won't take you long to catch Guy in the act of cornering some neofan in a consuite somewhere with his large lawyer-y voice asking "Hey little girl, want to come to my room and do a one-shot?" What he is referring to, of course, is upholding an ancient fannish ritual of producing a one-shot fanzine any time a gang of fans congregate. There isn't much of Guy's life that hasn't been documented at one time or another in a fanzine, APA, or one-shot of some sort. Indeed, if you meet Guy this weekend, you are in danger of becoming yet another contributor to the ever-expanding forest of trees that have died for the cause of Guy's fannish writing.

Guy may take the lion's share of publicity for the couple, but you should never underestimate Rosy's contributions! Like many great couples, the Lillians are a study in opposites. Guy is large, bald, boisterous, extroverted, bald and terrified of flying. Rosie is slender, soft-spoken, fully coifed, and has no trouble with air travel. You should be able to tell them apart. It was Rosy, however, who won the Rubble Award a few years ago for her transformation of Guy from a pompous, overbearing git into a giddy pompous, overbearing git. In other words, Rosy is the brains of the operation and Guy is the mouthpiece. Rosy may not be the loudest one in a conversation, but she never misses anything.

Guy got his start in Fandom writing in comic book letter columns and parlayed this into a meeting with the legendary DC editor/writer Julius Schwartz. Guy says that Julie was the first adult who ever took him seriously, and the two remained close friends until Julie's death in 2004. His early friendship with Julie also taught Guy how to approach a celebrity, and ever since Guy has been fearless in tracking down and talking to anyone who draws his interest. Guy has "collected" contacts like others might collect stamps. This has equipped Guy with a truly astonishing web of friends from all walks of life: artists, writers, politicians, and shady characters. He is not a name-dropper, but once you get him headed down memory lane, you are in for a really interesting ride!

After studying English and Writing as an undergraduate, Guy moved on to law school and moved to the hometown of his heart, New Orleans. It nearly broke his spirit when the Louisiana public defender system forced him to leave NOLA for Shreveport.

The move spared Guy and Rosy the ordeal of Katrina, although little of the pain brought by loss of loved ones and the continuing struggles of friends still there.

In 2003 Guy and Rosy were elected as the North American delegates for the Down Under Fan Fund (DUFF). This sent Guy and Rosy on a tour of Australia as



ambassadors from North American fandom to the Australian national convention in Sydney. Their tales of that adventure are spread over four issues of Guy's fanzine, *Challenger*.

Speaking of Challenger, did I mention that Guy and Rosy's work has been nominated for the Best Fanzine Hugo award eight times? (Sure Guy takes all the blame for publishing Chall, but I'm very certain it wouldn't happen without his muse, Rose-Marie whispering encouragement in his earl) Guy publishes an honest-to-Ghu paper fanzine, and manages to get an amazing diversity of contributions. In this day of blogs and instant messages, Guy takes the time and expense of actually printing the thing. There is a website for archived issues, but you have to respect someone who actually lays out a publication in hard copy in this electronic era.

Guy was also a key member of the committee that ran the 1988 New Orleans Worldcon, Nolacon. While the convention had more than its share of operational difficulties, to put it mildly, the average fan attending Nolacon had a ball exploring the French Quarter during the day and the room parties at night. Guy was responsible for the convention publications, which included a beautiful program book and a Pocket Program. In retrospect the latter would have probably been better left unprinted for all the grief the committee took for the massive on-the-fly program reschedulings. It was really hard in the end not to have fun at Nolacon and Guy deserves at least some credit in recognizing how much fandom would love a Worldcon in New Orleans.

There are two awards given by Southern Fandom that Guy's name often is associated with: The Rebel and Rubble Awards. The Rebel, of course, is given each year at DSC for lifetime service to Southern Fandom. Guy was the target for the very first Rubble Award for disservice to Southern Fandom. That was especially memorable because voting for the Rubble originally was by bribery and Guy borrowed a penny from Gary Tesser

- 5. Don't trash the hotel! There are several trash barrels on each floor and in the lobby area. Please do not allow trash to accumulate in the hall-ways. The better the job we do in housekeeping, the more welcome we will be next year.
- 6. Please report spillage and breakage as soon as possible! We understand that accidents will happen, but the sooner we are able to clean up a problem the better!
- 7. Rooms 224-241 are designated as the quiet zone. Please try to avoid loud talking and hall parties in this area. Many of the convention workers are staying in this area, so unless you like grumpy bartenders, keep the noise down in the upper end of the second floor.

We hope you all will join us in thanking the staff of The Hampton Inn for agreeing to host this madness. The management is very appreciative of our business, so let's try to deserve their trust! A great way to show your appreciation is to leave a gratuity for the housekeeping staff.

A FAN'S GUIDE TO HORSE CAVE AND SURROUNDINGS

FOOD: Aunt Bee's Country Kitchen is open 24/7 and has a surprisingly diverse menu and some excellent deserts. We'll see if they managed to buy enough food to make it through the weekend this year! The Marathon Mart also includes a Noble Roman's Pizza and a deli. We are pleased to announce that Horse Cave has entered the 21st century and there is now a 24/7 McDonalds at the Love's Truck Stop on the south side of the I-65 interchange! Alas, The Bookstore Cafe is no more although the books are still there. Go 5 miles to the south on I-65 at Cave City there are restaurants that range from Mickey D's to The Sahara Steak House. If you want more, try Glasgow or Exit 22 in Bowling Green.


ATTRACTIONS: Just across I-65 is the Kentucky Down Under Park. Caves and Australian critters-down under, get it? Too bad it is closed for the season. Follow the road for another 2 miles and you are in Downtown Horse Cave. In the center of town you will find the National Cave Museum and Hidden River Cave. Check out perhaps the only place in the world where Main Street is perilously close to a gigantic cave entrance. This is a must-see place for the eco-tourist. About 16 miles away at Exit 48 is Mammoth Cave National Park. If you want to tour the cave, the Hampton Inn receptionist can help you. Tours often sell out early even in winter, so plan your visit well in advance! For those who can't resist a peek at the old place, the Park Mammoth Resort still there 10 miles to the south on I-65. It is, however, closed until March 1.

PARTY SUPPLIES: The Houchens market (8 to 8 Daily) in Horse Cave can probably satisfy your non-alcoholic party needs. Take Highway 218 into Horse Cave, turn left onto Highway 31-W and the store is three blocks away on the right. There is a 24/7 Wal-Mart on Highway 90 in Glasgow that has all one might expect. If you need something more potent, you'll discover that the nearest oasis is Exit 28 or 22 in Bowling Green. Since this is the only wet spot within a 50-mile radius, the liquor stores are within sight of the exit ramps. All the liquor stores in Bowling Green close <u>promptly</u> at 11 p.m., so plan accordingly

SHOPPING: We're not quite sure why they built an outlet mall in a cornfield in Hart County, but there it is. The only question is if there's anything left over there but the adult bookstore. Inquiring minds want to know. It is theoretically within walking distance and may be just what you need to burn off what you did to yourself on Friday night! In Horse Cave you can find The Bookstore, Dollar General Store and other shopping opportunities. For the city mall experience, there is Greenwood Mall in Bowling Green at Exit 22.

FUEL FOR MAN AND MACHINE: They may not be elegant, but the three convenience stores of Exit 58 should provide what it takes to provision both you and your car for the trip home. There are also ATMs located at the Marathon Mart and Love's

GETTING AROUND HORSE CAVE




PLACES OF INTEREST IN CAVE CITY, KY
