GUESTS OF HONOR: STEVE AND SUE FRANCIS Kentucky Fandom's First Family

It's only natural. Here you have a couple, both of whose initials are SF. What could they be but big name Science Fiction fans? It is hard to imagine what SF Fandom in Kentucky would be like without Steve and Sue Francis. They are just that important. Sure there would be some sort of fannish activity, but without Steve and Sue it wouldn't have been as big, diverse or world-renowned.

For instance, Steve and Sue were not the founders of Rivercon, but there were there at the beginning, and took over the operation when the original leadership faded away after Rivercon 4. With Steve and Chairman and Sue as Vice-Chairman Rivercon continued for over 20 years under their leadership. During their tenure Rivercon grew to a well-respected regional convention with a yearly membership that pushed 1000 in its heyday. I remember once when Dan Caldwell and a group of Atlanta fans arrived at Rivercon in the middle of the night. They had been at Dragon-Con but were having a miserable time. They decided to jump ship and head for Louisville. As well as Rivercon, Steve and Sue also helped to bring two Deep South Cons, the North American SF Convention in 1979, as well as coming *this close* to bringing in the Worldcon to Louisville in 1994.

First of all a SF fan should have a big collection, and Steve is a Capital "C" Collector. His passion is the pulp magazines and old-fashioned adventure fiction from writers like Edgar Rice Burroughs and Doc Smith. Anyone visiting the Francis residence in Louisville must take the tour of the basement to see the collection of meticulously preserved and displayed books, magazines and SF memorabilia. Steve is a dedicated packrat and now owns the only complete collection of the cover art posters that Concave has traditionally given as mementos to our Guests of Honor. This year's edition will be especially rare since we won't have to make a duplicate for Steve's collection!

One of the Francis' secrets in running a convention was to grow their own committee. The Francis sisters were the familiar faces behind the registration desk at Rivercon for most of its run and David Francis grew into a Strapping Young Lad who provided a lot of the muscle for setting up and tearing down the convention. Nowadays Steve and Sue have so many grand and great-grandchildren that they could *be* their own convention! Asking Sue if she has any new grandchildren is always a good conversation starter.

Although Steve's mundane career was as a mechanical engineer for many years with American Air Filter, he moonlighted as a huxter at many regional conventions and became so well-versed in the mechanics of running dealer's rooms that he either ran or assisted in running the dealer's rooms at most of the domestic Worldcons through the 80's and 90's. Steve is one of the few huxters I've ever known who was actually satisfied with his sales during at least one convention. He struck a deal to sell his complete stock and left the con with nothing but a check in his pocket! In the spring of 1987 the internal struts for the roof to Rickey Sheppard's mobile home split down the middle and he faced having to abandon his house. Steve and I decided that we could brace the ceiling from the inside and then build a roof over the which would outside salvage the home. Steve and I built the roof together in the hot July sun without resorting to



anything as mundane as blueprints. As we were nailing shingles to the nearly-completed structure we joked that if we could build a roof on-thefly, we could also run a Worldcon. The Ghods seldom let a jest like that pass, so within 18 months of that offhand joke, we were organizing the effort that became the Louisville in '94 bid. The roof, by the way, remained in place until the trailer was finally abandoned 10-years later.

Sue is one of those people who don't feel comfortable unless she's doing something, and feels uncomfortable seeing a jog going undone at a convention. For many years Sue was the unofficial back-up consuite host at Concave. She usually took over in the nighttime hours when Anette Carrico needed to go home. Sue's "mom voice" always comes in handy when volunteers need to be recruited in a hurry. She is a master at coming up to a group as asking "would any of you mind coming to help us in the consuite for a while?" Something in her voice says "I'm a mom and I'm not afraid to use it!" Fans hear this and they scoot into the kitchen looking for veggies to slice.

You can't be big names in fandom for as long as Steve and Sue without picking up some awards and honors. Believe it or not, but being the Guests of Honor at Concave 32 is not their biggest accolade. They have been GoHs at several regional conventions and both have won the Rebel Award given by the DeepSouthCon for lifetime service to fandom. Their greatest honor was being chosen as the North American delegates for the Down Under Fan Fund which sent them to Australia to represent American fandom at the Australian National Convention in 2008. They toured the major cities of Australia for two weeks as the guests of the local fans and then reported back to American fandom and acted as the as DUFF administrators until handing off responsibility this year.

While Steve and Sue are now retired in mundane life, they still are active in fandom, especially at Worldcons where they still find places on bid and convention committees. They may publicly say "Stop me before I volunteer again!" but don't let that fool you. They were in the thick of the bidding for last year's Worldcon in Australia and are on the committee for this year's Worldcon in Reno. -Gary Robe

Care and Feeding of the Best Western Motor Inn

So if you see someone without a badge help them to get one or notify Concave staff. This is a zero-tolerance issue. If we find you are harboring non-members in your room or sharing your badge then you are out.

5. Don't trash the hotel! There are several trash barrels on each floor and in the atrium area. Please do not allow trash to accumulate in the hallways. The better the job we do in housekeeping, the more welcome we will be next year.

6. Please report spillage and breakage as soon as possible! We understand that accidents will happen, but the sooner we are able to clean up a problem the better!

7. There will be posted notices of Quiet Areas. Please avoid loud talking and hall parties in this area. Many of the convention workers are staying in this area, so unless you like grumpy bartenders, keep the noise down in the designated Quiet Zones.

We hope you all will join us in thanking the staff of The Best Western Motor Inn for agreeing to host this madness. The management is very appreciative of our business, so let's try to deserve their trust! A great way to show your appreciation is to leave a gratuity for the housekeeping staff.

Stuff and Nonsense in Bowling Green

PROMOTIONS: Although there are literally hundreds of places to eat in Bowling Green a few have gone out of there way to make us feel especially welcome. The Denny's attached to the hotel offers 20% off from 6-9am and 10% off any other time. Show them your Concave badge when you order. The Great Escape comics, games and music is giving a 30% discount to anyone showing a Concave badge. (Turn right on Scottsville Rd (AKA US 231), go 1 mile, then left into the Kroger/K-Mart shopping center.) The hotel has other promotions with nearby restaurants and stores, so check at Reception for details and suggestions.

ATTRACTIONS: This is Concave! Where could you go that is more entertaining than this?!?! Well, if you must, there are several attractions. BGKY is the Home of the Corvette and hosts the Corvette Museum (I-65 Exit 28). If you are more adventurous Lost River Cave (Cave Mill Rd - 6th light right on US 231, then left) is one of many parks and outdoor areas around the city. Mammoth Cave is up the road 30 miles to the north on I-65. There are two Great Escape (not the comic store!) Theaters on Campbell Ln (8th light to right on US 231, then left).

PARTY SUPPLIES: Well, it s a wet city, so there are liquor stores within walking distance of the hotel. All liquor stores in Bowling Green close <u>promptly</u> at 11 p.m., so plan accordingly. They DO NOT serve people in the checkout line at closing time. Beer, however is sold in groceries until 2 AM Sunday morning.

RESTAURANTS AND SHOPPING: Can be found in abundance on the oh-so-well-planned for growth Scottsville Road. If you need something you can get it, if you can stomach the traffic! We're not kidding. Sam's Club, The Greenwood Mall, Best Buy, K-Mart, Kroger and dozens of restaurants are all located between 1-2 miles to the right from the hotel on Scottsville Rd. Turn left 2 miles north on Scottsville Rd to Campbell Lane (Best Buy/CVS on the corners) to find Wal-Mart, Target, Lowes, CVS Pharmacy, Sam's Club, Barnes & Noble, Office Depot and more restaurants and shopping.

FEEDING THE MACHINES: There are plenty of convenience stores right here at the Exit 22 interchange offering all types of fuel. For those with the reguired affiliations, Sam's Club and Kroger offer their usual discounts on fuel.

JAIL: Bowling Green, KY has more police per capita than Louisville and Lexington combined, so be aware they are waiting for you. They are dying to show you the accommodations they take such pride in. Seriously, these cops do not play. The city wants our revenue and the Police are there to facilitate this just as much as the hotel. Be safe and DO NOT DRINK AND DRIVE!!
