PRYBAR: The Music Scene

There are a lot of class joints and swank boozeries in Las Vegas where good music can be heard for little or no cover charge. I could fill an entire issue of **Pry** cataloging them, so, for now, we'll concentrate on the live music clubs within a short drive (or walk) of Jackie Gaughn's Plaza.

Fremont Street Reggae and Blues is the happening club downtown. Only minutes walking distance from the Plaza, Fremont Street Reggae and Blues sports the best reggae in one side of the building and a screamin' blues bar on the other. Recent artists include The Blasters, Dread Zeppelin, Burning Spear, The Ruffnecks and the International Reggae All Stars. The owners have plans to make the headliners even more diverse in the coming months. Worth a look and ideally located. Cover is usually \$10.

The Huntridge Theatre. This converted movie theatre at 1208 E. Charleston is a local hotspot. On any given weekend, culture dogs can be sure to find something interesting here. Featured artists tend toward rock and alternative, but they are as likely to have an underground cartoon film festival or the Jim Rose Circus Sideshow. The cover is rarely over \$10, even for the bigger name artists.

Beers And Cheers is a little blues club about two miles away from the convention center, at 713 E Ogden. They've got pool tables and the blues on Friday and Saturday.

The HobNob on Highland avenue features punk, industrial and alternative bands. Most are local, but the local best play here. Cover is \$5.

Spago's in the Forum Shops at Ceasar's Palace (on the strip) is the upscale place to see and be seen, blow all your winnings on lunch and to hear some jazzy stylings on Sunday afternoons.

The Four Queens (downtown) features live jazz on the weekends, for no cover, and it's very conveniently located to the con hotel.

If you prefer your music more, shall we say, countrified, there's always **Hot Rock 'N Country**, smack in the middle of Jackie Gaughn's Plaza. This country music variety show plays twice daily in the main theatre at 7:30 and 10:30. Tickets are \$19.95 plus tax and include one drink. One of the lounges in Jackie Gaughn's also plays country and western on a nightly basis.

The Sand Dollar Lounge at 3355 Spring Mountain Road is a little farther from the convention center but it's the main hangout for serious R&B lovers. There's no cover and the music goes to 5 am on weekends.

Mad Dogs and Englishmen on the strip is about five minutes from downtown. Besides a huge and exotic beer list and authentic pub atmosphere, they have live bands every weekend for a \$3 cover charge, ranging from reggae to blues (notice a trend here?).

As Corflu approaches, we'll give fen a more comprehensive list of clubs, with scheduled artists for the convention weekend. Until then, save your cash for gambling and shrimp cocktails.
