

Program Item Descriptions

Anthropological SF. Science fiction sometimes deals with culture conflict, either Earth-past or us meeting THEM. How do you research this kind of science? Do plots and character develop differently? What are our panelists' favorite examples of this subgenre?

Are 4/c Illustrations Really Necessary in Magazines? Do full color pictures add to the stories or short-circuit the readers imagination? Does color help sell?

Are There Too Many SF & F Magazines? Where do the readers (buyers) come from? How are they differentiated? What does it take to start a magazine—and stay in business?

Beyond Bimbos. Let's talk about real women in SF and F. And when are those cover illustrations going to change anyway?

Beyond the Heroic: Are there stories to be told of Peace? If the stories we tell each other reflect and reinforce our consensus reality, wouldn't stories of cooperation lead to a better world? Why so many stories of war, fighting, conflicts?

Beyond Nanotech and Virtual Reality. What's the new cutting edge of science fiction?

Books I'm Ashamed to Love. Pro's reveal their secret trash stack.

Children's Books for Adult Readers. Our panelists discuss their favorites. How do you define a "young adult" novel, anyway?

Death in SF & F. How does our genre deal with dying? Many characters seem to live forever (can you say Lazarus Long?). What significance does this have?

Editors: Why We Love Our Jobs. Tell the truth, now—is it the free lunches, the conventions, the authors, the love of language? What has been your most satisfying moment as a publishing professional?

Flying Saucers: Are they true this year? Come give your opinion on UFOs.

Friends of the Dinosaur. How do you draw a dinosaur? How do you figure out what they look like, how they move? How much does accuracy matter?

Future and Fantasy Food. What will we be eating in the future? What should elves eat? What sort of food do you serve on starships? How often should fictional characters eat?

Hello Neo-Fan! An orientation session for first timers (or anyone who wants to know what's going on). These people aren't weird, really. Really. I wouldn't lie.

How to Sell Stories. Come on, tell us, what does it REALLY take?

How to Write SF & F. Learn it in an hour! Yeah! No kidding!

Is Horror Going Out? Is this true? Why does horror seem to be getting more mainstream lately?

Let's Build Aliens. What are the universal biological principles and what are the variables?

Let's Tell a Story. Put the propanel to the test: what wacky lead sentence can you come up with? What wacky sudden turn of events can you force them to accommodate?

95 in '95: Answers. The real people behind this Worldcon bid, with excruciatingly detailed answers to all your questions about their revolutionary convention concept.

Paranoia in SF. Often in our futuristic worlds they are out to get you (or at least the protagonist). Where does this paradigm of the future come from? Why does it have such power?

Parents in Space. Originally Moms in Space until it was pointed out to me that Dads ought to be there too. Are Moms and Dads treated differently in SF and F? Are the portrayals realistic? Should they be?

Practical Applications of New Technology. How will nanotech and virtual reality affect you? What other changes will the immediate future bring?

Privatization/Commercialization of Space. Can we make space profitable?

Rock & Roll & SF. We've all noticed that the (fictional) future has good music. Is there an intrinsic connection between SF and good times?

Sex in Fandom. Really? Find out what's, um, up.

Signs of Change—Minority Characters in SF & F. Are stories/novels reflecting a shift to political correctness or are we still in a white male past?

The Alien as Metaphor. How the Other we create is really a reflection of our all-too-human selves.

The Importance of Theme in Fiction. The pro's explain how to use theme in fiction: what is it, how do you know when you have one, and how far you can go.

The Squishy Area between SF and Fantasy. Is Darkover fantasy or science fiction? What about Pern? What about faster-than-light space travel?

World Building—Solar Systems. Create your own unique planets, orbits, and suns.
