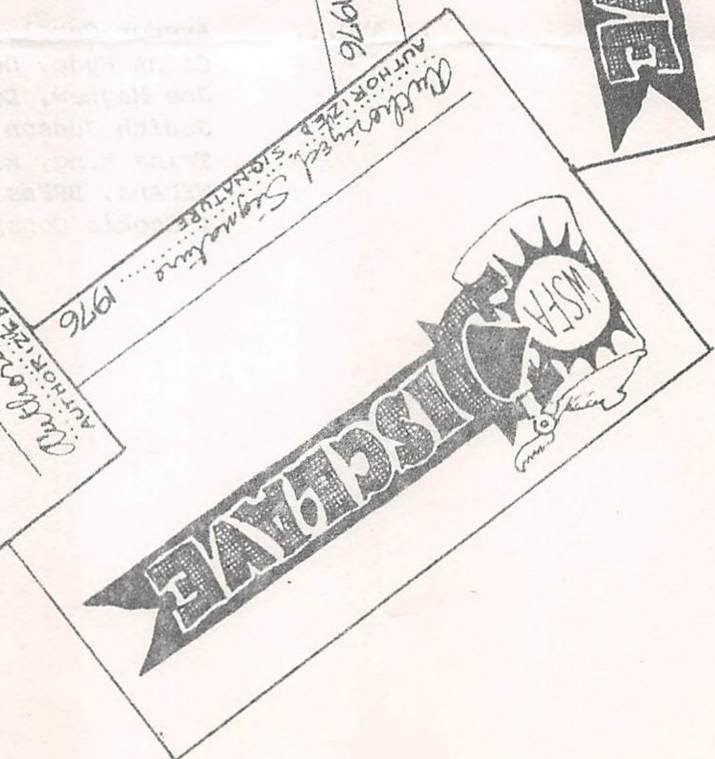
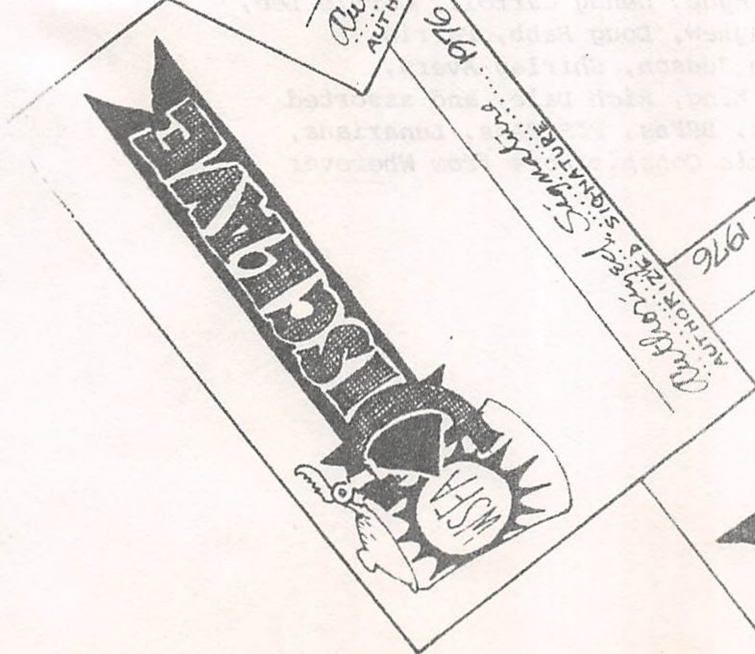

JOHN'S RESTAURANT & DELICATESSAN, 2643 Connecticut Ave., NW Open 10AM-7PM. Up to \$3.50. Interesting assortment of food, including chili, knishes, sandwiches, platters, pastries, etc.

THE FAIR, 2655 Connecticut Ave., N.W. \$4.25-\$10.75. You could do lots better.

HAPPY'S TACO HOUSE, 2605 Connecticut Ave., NW. Up to \$3 or so.

TOKYO SUKIYAKI RESTAURANT, 1736 Connecticut Ave., NW Japanese cuisine.

DRAGON PALACE, 3524 Connecticut Ave., NW L \$2.50-\$3.75. D \$4.50-\$7.50
Popular with the delegation from the People's Republic of China.

When you are driving, there are excellent Chinese restaurants on H Street, NW, between 7th & 9th Sts., e.g. The NEW VILLAGE INN (service is poor but the food is fine), JADE PALACE (usually have dim sum available--Chinese meat pastries), CHINA BOWL, etc.

For a fine and expensive fare, M St., NW, between Connecticut Ave. and 21st St. Try the French, Italian, and everything else. Lots of places in the area. Or M Street, between 27th to Wisconsin Avenue (Georgetown--very "in"). Lots of good French restaurants, EL TIO PEPE for excellent Spanish food and entertainment, etc.

Ice cream around can be gotten in Georgetown on Wisconsin Ave. at Swenson's Cream Factory. Interesting sandwiches at the Boeysmonger in Georgetown, between M & Prospect, NW, e.g., the Guruben (\$2.65, near the top of the range) consisting of turkey, avocado, and bean sprouts on a Clementine. Yes!

On Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, between 19th & 20th Sts., is a good Italian restaurant, Pecco's, moderately priced, with good food, and for dessert, home-made tortoni. Recommended.

Finally, Sherry's at Connecticut & Calvert, NW contains not only wines, beers, and spirits, but French bread, bagels, fancy cheeses, fancy snacks, etc. And there is a full grocery at 24th & Calvert Sts., NW
