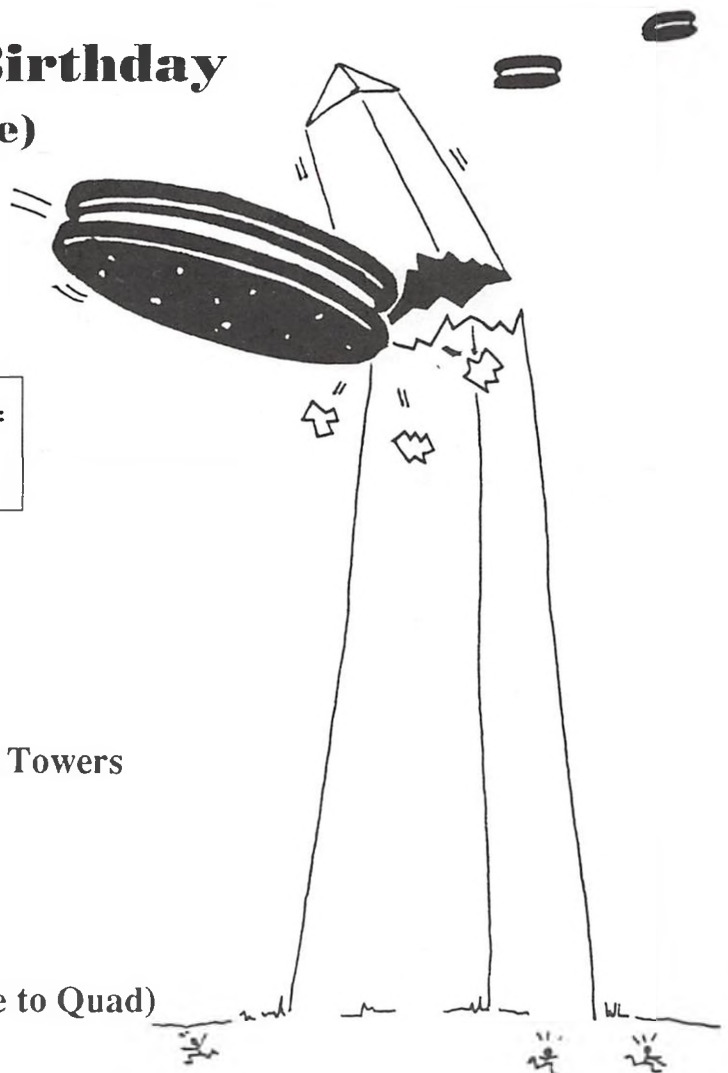

WSFA Press is pleased to announce *HOME BY THE SEA* as the 1992 Disclave Guest of Honor book. This, Pat Cadigan's first collection since her highly acclaimed *PATTERNS* (Ursus, 1989), to be published Memorial Day Weekend, 1992, is a 300-page limited edition of 500 signed, numbered, and slipcased copies.

The book contains four stories totalling over 40,000 words, an author's introduction for each story, a complete bibliography prepared by the author; a foreword by Mike Resnick; and biographical data.

HOME BY THE SEA will be in the same format as previous WSFA Press books: Lucius Shepard's *THE FATHER OF STONES* and Lewis Shiner's *THE EDGES OF THINGS*. It will feature 60# Glatfelter acid-free paper; colophons; three-piece two-color cases, Smythe-sewn bindings; spine headers and footers; and thumb-notched slipcases. Artwork includes full-color illustrated endpapers, and full-color tipped-in interiors. Full Library of Congress cataloging information is included.

HOME BY THE SEA will retail at \$49.95 but if your order is postmarked by 30 April 1992 a price of \$36.00 plus shipping will be guaranteed. After 30 April 1992 this pre-publication price will expire.

How to get there ... Car

From the North:

Take I-95 South to I-495. Take Exit-33 South (Connecticut Avenue) Go seven miles. The Hotel is on the left.

From the South:

Take I-95 North/I-395 North across the 14th Street Bridge. Take 14th Street North. Turn left onto R St. Proceed about 10 blocks and turn right onto Connecticut Avenue. Proceed three blocks and the Hotel will be on the right.

Parking:

The Hotel has a parking garage. We are also making arrangements for reduced rate parking with a garage directly across the street on Columbia Avenue. (Atlantic Parking)

National Airport

Shuttle:

While you could take the Metro and save a few dollars, I don't recommend it. For \$7.00 you can take a shuttle called the *Washington Flyer* strait to the Hotel.

Metro: (If you insist)

Take an airport shuttle bus to the Metro Station (it will be obvious). Get on a yellow line train to the Gallery Place station. Transfer to the Red Line (to Shady Grove) and go to the Dupont Circle Station.

Get onto the George Washington Parkway heading North. Take the first exit (I-395N) and follow the car directions from the South. (You will be exiting from the parkway on to the 14th Street Bridge.)

If you insist:

The best way to get from Dulles to the Hotel is to take the Washington Flyer Shuttle to National and then to the Hotel. It will be a long ride.

If you insist - Rental Car:

Take the Dulles Access Road to I-495 North. Proceed over the American Legion Bridge into Maryland. Take Exit-33 (Conn. Ave.) and go south seven miles. The Hotel is on the left.
