Guide to Restaurants and Other Local Attractions

Milwaukee Avenue is one of the Chicago area's best and best-known restaurant rows. While this guide to selected nearby restaurants is not exhaustive, it includes a good cross-section of what's available within a few miles. If you're feeling adventurous and want to go further afield, or want to satisfy some more exotic taste, ask us, we're sure to have recommendations.

We regret that there's not much within walking distance and the hotel restaurant, though excellent, is a bit formal; however, several very good nearby restaurants deliver (see key, below).

Restaurants with our highest recommendations are marked with a *. Only those restaurants marked ? have not been visited personally by your reviewers. The data on times open and credit cards should be accurate, but it never hurts to call.

RESERVATIONS: Restaurants around here are very busy on the weekends. We recommend that you make a reservation anywhere that will take one, especially if you want to eat during prime dinner hours (6-8:30 p.m.).

CREDIT CARDS: A=American Express; C=Carte Blanche; Dn=Diner's Club; Ds=Discover Card; M=MasterCard; V=Visa.

DRESS CODES: While few of the places on this list actually enforce dress code, we've categorized them according to what their patrons usually wear. You may be able to carry off wearing jeans and a t-shirt to a formal restaurant with aplomb, but chances are you'll get better service if you adhere to the following guidelines: **CASUAL** = Shoes and shirt are required. **NICE** = Make an effort. No t-shirts; no jeans, or at least not ratty ones. **DRESSY** = Coat and tie for

men; women wear whatever you think is the feminine equivalent.

PRICE RANGE: Prices are indicated based on an average dinner per person, without drinks, tax or tip. \$=under \$10; \$\$=\$10-20; \$\$\$=\$20-30; \$\$\$\$=\$30-40; \$\$\$\$\$=\$40-50; \$\$\$\$\$\$=more.

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Restaurants

00. ALLGAUER'S HOTEL & FIRESIDE RESTAURANT, 2855 N. Milwaukee Ave., Northbrook, 460-7500. Allgauer's was a restaurant before it was a hotel. The food is always very good, and the Sunday brunch is extra special. The service tends to be leisurely, however. Reservations for dinner or brunch. (The brunch is \$21 including tax and tip. We'll keep a sign-up sheet in the con suite and make a group reservation.) 7 a.m.-2:30 p.m., 4-11 p.m. every day. ADnDsmv Nice. \$\$ *
01. SILK ROAD, 9353 Milwaukee Ave. (in Millbrook shopping center), Niles, 965-8233. An "Oriental" restaurant, meaning Korean-owned, and serving Korean, Japanese and Chinese food. Their few sushi items are OK, but as you'd guess, they do best on Korean specialties such as bulgogi (grilled beef), chap chae (Korean national dish of cellophane noodles with vegetables and beef) and bibimbop (rice, beef, vegetables, a fried egg and hot sauce). Their fried mandoo (meat-filled dumplings) are wonderful. Entrees are accompanied by an assortment of side dishes, usually vegetables, and including kim chee, the spicy Korean pickled cabbage. Take their word for it if they tell you a dish is "not for Americans" -- ask us about the "Spicy Crab." Fri. & Sat 10:30 a.m.-10:30 p.m.; closed Sun. AMV. Casual. \$
02. KANPAI, 233 S. Elmhurst Rd. (in Colony Square shopping center), Mt. Prospect, 640-6700. (Directions: Take Golf Rd. about 2 1/2 miles west from Des Plaines River Rd. to Elmhurst Rd., then turn left and go south about 2 miles.) This is actually two restaurants: One is a teppanyaki steak house, where chefs cook steak, chicken or seafood and vegetables on a grill built into your table. The other is an unusual sushi bar. The semi-circular bar, which takes up the entire restaurant, has a moat down the center of it, and the chef floats the sushi around it on little boats. You take whatever drifts past that appeals to you, and at the end they total up your order by counting the plates. Be prepared to spend more than you normally would -- the prices aren't higher, but you're buying by the piece rather than a combination, and it's hard to resist as each new delectable morsel of fish and rice sails past. Some cooked appetizers, too. Reservations taken in the steak house only. 5:30-10 p.m. every day. AMV. Nice. \$\$ (steakhouse); \$\$\$ (sushi bar). *
03. EDOYA, 1285 S. Elmhurst Rd., Des Plaines, 593-2470. (Follow the directions for Kampai; Edoya is a little further north.) Good Japanese restaurant serving sushi and authentic cooked dishes. You can tell it's authentic because it's full of Japanese businessmen (and therefore the air is blue with cigarette smoke, but this place is better than most of the northwest suburban Japanese restaurants in that respect). Reservations. Fri. & Sat. 5-10:30 p.m.; closed Sun. ACDnDSMV. Nice. \$\$
04. KITAKATA, 20 E. Golf Rd., Arlington Hts., 364-7544. Japanese noodle restaurant. A wide selection of udon, ramen and soba dishes plus Japanese appetizers. The thing to do is order a bunch of different appetizers, and then a main course noodle dish. Among the appetizers, be sure to order the gyoza (pan fried, meat-filled dumplings); everybody else does. The noodle dishes tend to be either hot or cold noodles in broth with meat or fish and vegetables, or with broth on the side. If it's on the side, dip your noodles before you eat them. (It's perfectly acceptable to

- slurp.) You can also order side dishes/condiments such as nori (dried toasted seaweed). One of the few noodle entrees not in or accompanied by broth is yakisoba, delicious stir-fried soba with pork and vegetables. They also serve a few of the non-noodle Japanese standards, such as tempura. But order noodles -- you'll like them. They have "karaoke time" from 11 p.m.-2 a.m. on Fri. & Sat., but we've never been there to see it. Kitchen hours are Fri. & Sat. 5-10:30 p.m.; Sun. 12-2:30, 5-9:30 p.m. MV. Casual. \$ to \$\$ depending on how many appetizers you order. *
05. FLUKY'S, 9645 N. Milwaukee Ave., Niles, 965-8708. One of Chicago's ubiquitous hot dog stands, slightly fancier than most. A true Chicago-style hot dog is all beef and comes with mustard, tomatoes, onions, dill pickles, bright green relish, hot peppers, celery salt and sometimes sauerkraut, but no ketchup. Fluky's also serves burgers, sandwiches, salads and breakfast. They have a limited menu for a Chicago hot dog stand, which ought also to have Italian beef and gyros. Fri. & Sat. 7 a.m.-11 p.m.; Sun. 7 a.m.-10 p.m. Casual. \$
06. SAM THE CHICKEN MAN, 9717 Milwaukee Ave. (in Rayyan Plaza), Niles, 966-4848. Chicken and ribs. They deliver. Fri. 11 a.m.-10 p.m.; Sat. & Sun. 10 a.m.-10 p.m. Casual. \$?
07. PINOCCHIO'S PIZZA PUB, 9707 Milwaukee Ave. (in Rayyan Plaza), Niles, 965-1022. Pizza, etc. Fri. & Sat. 11 a.m.-1 a.m.; Sun. 2-10 p.m. Casual. \$?
08. SPAVONE'S SEVEN HILLS RISTORANTE, 222 Greenwood, Glenview, 967-1222. Italian, with steaks and seafood. Reservations. Fri. 11 a.m.-11 p.m.; Sat. 4-11:30 p.m.; Sun. 4-10 p.m. ADsMV. Nice. \$\$?

10. PONDEROSA STEAK HOUSE, 9870 N. Milwaukee Ave., Des Plaines, 296-5550. Mediocre, cheap steakoid, as in every other example of the chain. Fri. & Sat. 11 a.m.-10 p.m.; Sun. 11 a.m.-9 p.m. MV. Casual. \$
11. LA PASTA RIA, 3711 Central Ave., Glenview, 729-0084. Italian. Reservations for 5 or more. Fri. 11 a.m.-11 p.m.; Sat. 3-11 p.m.; Sun. 3-10 p.m. Casual. \$?
12. CAFE LUCCI, 609 N. Milwaukee Ave., Glenview, 729-2268. An old-fashioned, white-tablecloth Italian restaurant featuring a pleasant, art deco setting and excellent, elegant food. Very good pasta and veal dishes. Their lasagne was rated no. 1 by the Chicago Sun-Times' Pat Bruno. They take reservations only for 3 or more on Friday, 5 or more on Saturday. Fri. 11 a.m.-11 p.m.; Sat. 4-11 p.m.; Sun. 4-9 p.m. A only. Dressy. \$\$
13. JOE & GIUSEPPE ITALIAN CHOP HOUSE, 1615 N. Milwaukee Ave., Glenview, 635-7707. Steaks and chops, fresh seafood and a good range of Italian specialties. Giuseppe is the chef; Joe works out front. When we were there, it was full of people talking in Italian. Their special antipasto of vegetables is terrific. Good list of \$10 wines. Soups are pleasant, but not exceptional. Good steaks, nice veal dishes. Bread is served Italian style -- with accompanying olive oil and grated cheese. Everything comes with a side of spaghetti. Cookies and fruit are included too, but don't let that stop you from trying their tiramisu and cannoli. Reservations. Fri. 11 a.m.-

Glenview, 699-0020. One of Chicago's
ubiquitous Greek-owned coffee shops,
serving sandwiches, Athenian chicken and
cakes from one of those revolving
display cases. This is one of our
favorites. Leah always orders the lamb
chops, but they do good sandwiches,
breakfast foods and so on. Fri. & Sat.

selection is limited and perhaps it's

- or Furama, but it's reasonable and
convenient. The pot stickers and
barbecued beef steamed buns are quite
good and shrimp shui mai are exemplary.
At \$5.95, the combination plate is an
excellent value. For dinner, they tend
to be variable; try Empire Szechwan
instead. Reservations (on Sun. for 6 or

32. BOB CHINN'S CRAB HOUSE, 393 S. Milwaukee
Ave., Wheeling, 520-3633. This place is
huge, noisy and overpriced, but it's the
very best seafood in this area. They
post the airbills so you know it's
fresh. The ambience is early fish-
scaling shack crossed with aircraft
carrier; the food is first rate. Garlic
New Zealand green mussels are a great
first course. Be sure to have the
gumbo; it's better than in New Orleans.
The fish cakes are divine and the
grouper is to die for, but absolutely
everything is wonderful. (The exception
to the rule: anything "Bob's Version.")
Specials change daily. The selection
for non-fish eaters has broadened lately
-- they do pretty good steaks and chops.
They also have burgers and pizza, but we
can't vouch for them. Good dessert
choices are the Key lime pie or gelato.
They don't take reservations for 6 to
9:30 p.m. on Fri. or Sat., so plan to go
early or late or to wait in line.
(Groups of 5 or more can call ahead for
"preferred seating," which means you
only wait half as long.) Fri. 11:30
a.m.-2:30 p.m., 4:30-11:30 p.m.; Sat.
4:30-11:30 p.m.; Sun. 3-10 p.m.

33. LE FRANCAIS, 269 S. Milwaukee Ave.,

ownership, but still hyper-expensive.
Has quality suffered? We have no idea!

you really want to spend this much on
food, why not treat the con committee to

dinner at Chinn's? (If you must have French, try for a reservation at Le Titi de Paris.) \$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$?

34. HACKNEY'S, 241 S. Milwaukee Ave., Wheeling, 537-2100. Family tavern serving terrific burgers (get 'em on dark rye), the prototypical french-fried onion loaf, fish on Friday, ribs on Saturday and the World's Second Best Martini. Try the Burnt Cream for dessert. Reservations for 6 or more only. Fri. & Sat. 11:30 a.m.-midnight; Sun. noon-10:30 p.m. ADnMV. Casual. \$ *

35. BILLY & COMPANY, 124 S. Milwaukee Ave., Wheeling, 541-6160. Steaks and seafood in an old-fashioned, clubby atmosphere. The building was once a speakeasy owned by Al Capone. Complimentary appetizers include chopped liver and pickled roasted red pepper. This is one of the best places for steaks around. Their Steak Billy's Style and Steak de Jonghe are the best there is.
